#### TOWN WARRANT

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Gilmanton in the County of Belknap in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:
(L.S.)

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Gilmanton on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing. Polls to be opened at ten in the forenoon, and to close no sooner tran 7 o'clock in the evening.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. (\$29, 750.00)
- 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts for Temporary Loans in anticipation of Taxes.
- 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for Civil Defense Organization for the ensuing year, with full realization that should a major emergency be created, more money will have to be used for said purpose. (\$200.00)\*
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$1,700.00) for the maintenance of the Peaked Hill Fire Department. (\$1,700.00)\*
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) for the maintenance of the Iron Works Fire Department. (\$2,000.00)\*
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) for the prevention and fighting of forest fires. (\$300.00)\*
- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Seventy-Five Dollars (\$75.00) for the observance of Memorial Day. (\$75.00)\*

- 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Nine Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety-Five Dollars and Fifty-Eight Cents (\$9,995.58) for Summer Maintenance. (\$9,995.58)\*
- 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Eleven Thousand Dollars (\$11,000.00) for Winter Maintenance. (\$11,000.00)\*
- 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand One Hundred Thirty Dollars and Sixety-Seven Cents (\$1,130.67) for Town Road Aid. (\$1,130.67)\*
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) toward the support of Wolfeboro Hospital. (\$100.00)\*
- 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) toward the support of the Laconia Hospital. (\$500.00)\*
- 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) for the care of Cemeteries. (\$300.00)\*
- 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) to cooperate with the State in control of White Pine Blister Rust. (\$100.00)\*
- 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for the support of Town Libraries. (\$500.00)\*
- 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Thousand Dollars (\$3,000.00) for tarring and sealing highways. (\$3,000.00)\*
- 18. To see if the Town will vote to accept conveyance from the Gilmanton Iron Works Fire Department, of Crystal Lake Park, so-called, 4.59 acres lying between Crystal Lake Road and Crystal Lake, said conveyance conditioned on the perpetual use of said park by the town as a public park; and on the right of the Gilmanton Iron Works Fire Department to use the same for its annual Labor Day Program; and to see if the Town will vote to establish and maintain a public park thereon.
- 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) for the maintenance and improvement of Crystal Lake Park. (\$250.00)\*

- 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of Twenty-Six Thousand Twenty-Five Dollars (\$26,025.00) for an Austin Western Grader, Pacer, 300 Model, equipped with Torque Converter, snow plow and wing, to be purchased by the Selectmen; Six Thousand and Twenty-Five Dollars (\$6,025.00) to be raised and paid in 1964, and the balance to be paid by long term notes, payable Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) per year in 1965, 1966, 1967 and 1968. (\$26,025.00)\*
- 21. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue that portion of the Old Stage Road, opposite the land of Eugene Denault that was cut off in 1956 by the construction of the Old Stage Road.
- 22. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue a portion of the Grant Hill Road, beginning 100 feet north of the drive leading to Joseph Gagnon's house and ending at the intersection of the Grant Hill Road with the Middle Route Road.
- 23. To choose delegates to the Constitutional Convention.
- 24. To vote on the question, "shall sweepstake tickets be sold in this Town?"

## MINUTES OF TOWN MEETING March 12, 1963

Meeting was called to order by the Moderator at 10:00 a.m. Warrant read by the Moderator. Ballots unsealed by the Clerk and given to the Ballot Inspectors for counting. Ballot box shown to voters. Voted to close the polls at 8:00 p. m.

Number of ballots, 549.

Polls opened at 10:00 a.m. Polls closed at 8:00 p.m.

Articles in the Warrant then voted upon.

- Art. 2. Voted to raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same. (\$27,930.00)\*
- Art. 3. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to incur debts for Temporary Loans in anticipation of Taxes.
- Art. 4. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) for Civil Defense Organization for the ensuing year, with the full realization that should a major emergency be created, more money will have to be used for said purpose. (\$300.00)\*
- Art, 5. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand Seven Hundred Dollars (\$1,700.00) for the maintenance of the Peaked Hill Fire Department. (\$1,700.00) and the sum of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for the installation of an oil fired heating system for the Peaked Hill Fire Department Station. (\$1,500.00)\*
- Art. 6. Voted to raise the sum of One Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for the maintenance of the Iron Works Fire Department (\$1,500.00), and the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) to the Iron Works Fire Department as partial payment toward the construction of a water-hole in the rear of the Fire Station, and a dry hydrant to draw water from said water-hole and to be located near the abutting Highway (Route 140) and near the front of the Fire Station. (\$500.00)\*
- Art. 7. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for the prevention and fighting of forest fires. (\$200.00)\*

- Art. 8. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of Seventy-Five Dollars (\$75.00) for the observance of Memorial Day. (\$75.00)\*
- Art. 9. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of Ten Thousand One Hundred and Ninety-Six Dollars and Twenty-Seven Cents (\$10,196.27) for Summer Maintenance. (\$10,196.27)\*
- Art. 10. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of Ten Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$10,500.00) for Winter Maintenance. (\$10,500.00)\*
- Art. 11. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of One Thousand One Hundred Thirty-Nine Dollars and Eighty-Six Cents (\$1,139.86) for Town Road Aid. (\$1,139.86)\*
- Art. 12. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) toward the support of Wolfeboro Hospital. (\$100.00)\*
- Art. 13. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) toward the support of Laconia Hospital. (\$500.00)\*
- Art. 14. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) for the care of Cemeteries. (\$300.00)\*
- Art. 15. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150.00) to cooperate with the State in control of White Pine Blister Rust. (\$150.00)\*
- Art. 16. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) for support of Town Libraries. (\$500.00)\*
- Art. 17. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) for tarring and sealing highways. (\$2,000.00)\*
- Art. 18. Voted to adopt the following Town Ordinance as proposed by the Town Planning Board. Purpose to promote the Health, Safety and General Welfare of the Town of Gilmanton, the following ordinance is hereby enacted under the authority granted by R.S.A. 31:60.
- SECTION 1. The following regulations apply to all dwellings and commercial buildings, constructed after this ordinance is passed.
  - A. Anyone intending to build a dwelling, install a mobile home, or erect a commercial building,

- must notify the Town Clerk at least 15 days prior to building, by filling out a certificate of intention.
- B. Chimneys and flues must be tile lined and supported by a foundation which extends at least two feet into the ground. Stovepipes which pass through partitions must be surrounded by adequate fireproof material.
- C. Foundations must be of concrete, cement block, brick or stone. Wood posts may be used, provided said posts are set on a rock, concrete, cement blocks or brick base, or properly treated.
- D. All electrical wiring circuits must be fused and connections must be made in metal junction boxes with at least No. 14 wire (National Board of Underwriters Specifications).
- E. Dwellings must have adequate sanitary disposal facilities.
- F. Building must be framed according to conventional building practices, neither roofs or sides of buildings shall be permanently covered with felt paper.
- SECT. 2. No building shall be located nearer than 20 feet from the edge of a public highway or a road laid out for acceptance by the Town, or 10 feet from the edge of its lot.
- SECT. 3. Building lots must be at least 10,000 (Ten Thousand) square feet in area at least 85 feet frontage.
- SECT. 4. The Selectmen shall appoint a Board of Adjustment of five members who will serve without pay for the terms specified in R.S.A. 31:57. This board shall have authority to allow variances from the terms of this ordinance where it can be shown that unnecessary hardship would otherwise result.
- SECT. 5. Enforcement of these ordinances shall be the duty of the Board of Selectmen and the Board is hereby given the power and authority to enforce the provisions of this ordinance by seeking an injunction in the Superior Court and by any other appropriate legal action.
- Art. 19. Voted not to rescind the vote taken on Article 21 at the Town Meeting of March 12, 1956, and not to abolish the Planning Board of the Town of Gilmanton. Yes, 26. No, 77.

- Art. 20. Voted not to raise the sum of Seventy-Five Hundred Dollars (\$7,500.00) by note of the Town to be paid in five years (1/5 each year), to blacktop Loon Pond Road, commencing at Route No. 107, Yes, 20. No. 73.
- Art. 21. Voted not to use the sum of Two Thousand Two Hundred Ninety-Nine Dollars (\$2,299.00) that was raised to buy land at Loon Pond and later put into the capital reserve, for graveling and widening the Stone Road, to be done under the direction of the Selectmen.
  - Art. 22. Voted to lay on the Table.
  - Art. 23. Voted to lay on the Table. Yes, 65. No. 11.
- Art. 24. (a) The following resolution was read by the Moderator, Mr. Harry Besse, and was adopted by the voters:
  - WHEREAS, Mrs. Minnie Edgerly has served the Town of Gilmanton as its Clerk for a period of 24 years, and
  - WHEREAS, in the performance of her duties she has displayed unfailing courtesy to her fellow townspeople and discharged her responsibilities with extraordinary efficiency, and
  - WHEREAS, Almighty God, in His wisdom, has taken Mrs. Edgerly from us, be it
  - RESOLVED, that the sympathy of the town and an awareness of great loss be, and hereby is, conveyed to Mrs. Edgerly's family, and be it fur ther
  - RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be permanently preserved in the records of the town so that future generations may know of the esteem and affection in which Mrs. Edgerly was held by the people of this community.
- (b) Voted to include, in future town reports, the results of previous town election of officers.

The meeting closed at 9:45 and counting of ballots began.

#### A REPORT FROM YOUR REPRESENTATIVE 1963 Session

This being my first term as a member of the New Hampshire General Court, I had to make myself familiar with all procedures, rules and regulations required. I requested to be placed on the Education Committee, which I was.

As Bills were given us to read over before being introduced in the House of Representatives to be acted on, I would read them all and put extra study on the ones that I knew concerned the people of Gilmanton. I attended some of the Selectmen's meetings and informed them of Bills coming up in the legislature which would have effect on the town and the town's people. We would discuss these Bills. I also talked with the town's folks at the stores, the garage and the Grange where there were several folks present. I tried to keep folks informed on matters of concern to Gilmanton and Gilmanton citizens.

When the "Sweepstake Bill" was brought up, I contacted several of the Gilmanton citizens and explained the Bill to them to the best of my ability. I asked them to discuss it with other citizens of Gilmanton and have them write or telephone me stating their wishes as to how they wished me to vote. I assured them that I would keep their names confidential, but the day that the Bill came up for vote, I would vote as the majority requested. I received a total of 69 letters and phone calls: 41 to vote in favor of the Bill and 28 to vote against the Bill. When the Bill came to final vote, an amendment had been added to make it compulsory for the Town Clerk to sell "Sweepstake Tickets". This I did not agree to, as many Town Clerks have their office right in their homes. I could not see making it compulsory for anyone making their home an open place to sell "Sweepstake Tickets", so, I voted against the Bill. It passed the House of Representatives with the amendment and was sent to the Senate. There the amendment was taken off the Bill. Without the amendment the Senate passed the Bill and sent it back to the House to be voted on without the amendment. I voted for the Bill. It passed the House of Representatives and the Governor signed it into law.

Another Bill of great interest to the Gilmanton citizens was the Tobacco Tax Bill. The impression was given that if this Bill passed it would give the State Employees a pay raise. However "WORDS" State Employees or Pay Raise were not mentioned in the Bill. The money from the proposed Tax was NOT designated for any special use.

It would have gone into the General Funds. I voted against the Bill. After considerable study of the Bill, I felt the loss of "Out-of-State" sales by raising the tax would have given us no gain in revenue. I favor a raise for State employees.

I contacted the Commissioner of Public Works and Highways about getting two dangerous curves in our highway re-located so as to make them less hazardous. The curves are known as "Price's Corner" and "Munsey Hill". Due to the great cut in the budget by the Governor, I was unsuccessful in getting both curves relocated as Town folks know, but Price's Corner has been changed.

Being unable to get both curves corrected, I decided to see if I could do anything about the bridge that was a town bridge on a State road. I found that we could have the State rebuild this bridge and take it over as a State bridge if we would pay our share of the rebuilding.

Checking on the cost and the Town's share, I found that if the town's valuation was \$2,000,000.00 or over, the town would be required to pay one-third (1/3) the cost; but if the town's valuation was under \$2,000,000.00 the cost would be one-quarter (1/4). Checking I found that the town's valuation was \$1,950,000.00 (approximately) which put us just under the one-third (1/3) bracket and in the one-quarter (1/4) bracket. Taking this up with the Selectmen, things were worked out and we have a new, wider bridge and it is NOT a town responsibility any more. The approach to the bridge and the guard rails approaching the bridge, will be completed this spring when freezing weather will not interfere with the work. The new section of the road will also be completed at this time. More fill is going to be added where needed to make a better grade.

The surveyors have been working on "Munsey Hill" on Route 107. When this survey has been completed, a meeting will be held and further plans including the cost will be made. I am invited to attend this meeting. It is possible that we may get something done to improve this curve this year. No promises, but I will do all in my power to get it corrected.

I was absent three days. This absence was due to the death of my father-in-law, Frank J. Page.

Remember, I am only too glad to have you contact me about any matter that you think I can be of assistance and will consider anything you may suggest.

#### REPORT OF PEAKED HILL FIRE DEPARTMENT

The following report covers the period from August 10th, 1963 to February 8th, 1964 that I have served as Chief of the Peaked Hill Fire Department.

During this period the department has answered 9 fire calls that required a total of 71 man hours, also 5 fires at our town dump that required 65 man hours and 44 man hours at forest fires.

During Fire Prevention Week an inspection and fire drill was conducted on October 10th at the Corner School. Everyone was evacuated from the school building in 40 seconds.

Starting on August 9th and lasting through the fall the selectmen asked us to haul water to several families whose well had gone dry. A total of 19000 gals. of water was hauled. The firemen who gave their time to hauling this water felt that those who received it should make a donation to the department to reimburse for the expense of operating the truck. So far we have received one \$10.00 donation. I strongly recommend that in the future the selectmen supply their own truck and driver if they wish to furnish water to anyone. This does not come under the head of fire fighting. Our tank truck is hardly suited for this work as the tank was used for years to haul fuel oil. We think it is terrific for our fire work and would prefer to use it for that purpose. Toward the end of the summer the volunteer drivers ceased to volunteer and we had to stop hauling water. A total of 40 man hours and several tanks full of gasoline went into this work.

The weekends were busy ones at the Fire House this fall where many men gave their time to help close in the stall that houses the tank truck. A new ceiling was put up and the walls insulated so that the new furnace could be put into operation. The new furnace is working very nicely and appears to be a good investment. One of our members very kindly found us a 1000 gallon storage tank which was hauled to the station and buried in the ground on one of our many work parties. We will now be able to purchase more of our furnace oil in the summer when the price of oil is lower.

We are very thankful for our auxiliary, the Fire Sirens, who have given us most of the money used to

erect these buildings. This money they raise during the summer at their ever popular Clam Bakes and in the fall from the raffles. Thanks girls.

## REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND YOUR DISTRICT CHIEF

During the past year New Hampshire faced the greatest forest fire threat to its woodlands in more than sixty years. The continued drought brought home to our citizens, as never before, the potential threat of destructive fires to their beautiful and valuable forests, homes and livelihood. In true American tradition of meeting a common threat by volunteer effort, this fire danger was minimized by active prevention, patrol and a relinguishing of personal rights for the common good. It was the greatest demonstration of public cooperation ever experienced by those responsible for local and state fire control. The ready forces of volunteer fire services kept the losses low. For their effort and public response the general fire service expresses its heartfelt thanks for a job well done.

Prevention however, is not just an activity for the bad fire years. It must be practiced until it becomes a part of our public conscience — a habit. Just plain carelessness

with fire causes too many of our fires.

The following practices and suggestions will help:

1. Always have a permit for outdoor burning and burn within the terms of the permit and in a safe place. Burn late in the afternoon when the wind is down or on rainy or damp days. Check your fire and if winds develop extinguish it promptly.

Carry your rubbish to the public dump — it's safer.
 A neglected backyard incinerator causes many

fires.

3. Never discard lighted cigarette or match. Make this a year round habit regardless of the safety of your surroundings.

4. Children caused fires are now a major concern. Keep matches away from them and teach them to respect fire and not make it a subject of play.

Let's all join with "Smokey the Bear" and "Keep New Hampshire Green" and growing in 1964.

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the School district in the town of Gilmanton qualified to vote in district affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Corner School in said district on the Fourteenth day of March 1964, at Two o'clock in the Afternoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose a Moderator for the coming year.
- 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- 3. To choose a Member of the School Board for the ensuing three years and a member of the School Board for the ensuing two years.
  - 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.
- 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer, and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.
- 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see what sum of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.
- 9. To see if the District will vote to authorize the appointment of a School Building Committee; said Committee to consist of one (1) member of School Board and four (4) additional members to be appointed by the Moderator of the School District, and;

To see if the District will vote to appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the purpose of engaging the services of an architect for the procurement of preliminary drawings and estimates for a new elementary school, as may be recommended by the proposed School Building Committee; said \$2,000.00 to be considered as part payment of any subsequent architect's fees, and;

To see if the District will vote to appropriate the sum of \$250.00 for the procurement of a three year option on a site of land suitable for the construction of a new elementary school as may be recommended by the proposed School Building Committee, cost of said option to be considered as partial payment on ultimate purchase price if purchase of applicable site is consummated.

10. To transact any other business which may legally come before the meeting.

It was moved by Mrs. Katherine Clairmont and seconded by Frank Ulenberg that the district shall raise and appropriate the sum of Eighty Thousand Eight Hundred and sixty-six dollars and forty four cents (\$80,866.44) for the support of schools for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state foundation aid together with other income; the school

board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation, which balance is to be raised by taxes by the town.

Under Article nine the following motion was made by Murray Gilman (copy printed) properly seconded.

I hereby move that a committee be appointed to study the present Gilmanton School situation and ways and means of improving same, if any, and to report their findings by Sept. 10 to a public meeting called by the Chairman of the Committee, said committee to consist of one (1) school board member, selected by the Chairman of the Board, and six (6) additional members to be appointed by the Moderator of this meeting. This motion carried. Letter dated March 9, 1963 from Howard Osler, Moderator, states the members of the committee, Mrs. Evelyn Ulenberg, Mrs. Eleanor Nelson, Mrs. Betty Smithers, Col. Emond, Walter Senior, Jr., and Murray Gilman.

Upon the motion of Mrs. Gates and seconded by Charles Kelley it was voted to hold the annual school meeting after the Annual Town Meeting Day.

Voted to adjourn.

All officers took oath of office by law prescribed.

#### REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Members of the School Board, Parents and Citizens:

This report will be my thirteenth and last for the Gilmanton School District, since Gilmanton becomes part of the Laconia Supervisory Union on July 1, 1964.

Since starting work in Gilmanton on November 1, 1951 I have seen a great deal of educational progress, including:

- (1) The construction of an addition at the Iron Works with a classroom and a cafeteria,
- (2) The start of the school lunch program at the Iron Works,
- (3) The installation of a fire escape at the Corner,
- (4) An oil burner at the Corner,
- (5) The transportation of High School pupils by bus to Belmont and Laconia, and by private car to Pittsfield,
- (6) Excellent provisions for modern textbooks and supplies,
- (7) The departmentalization of the two schools in 1963, with grades 1-4 at the Iron Works and Grades 5-8 at the Corner.

It has been my good fortune to have had a group of devoted citizens serve on the School Board and all worked for the improvement of the schools and for better education for the children. These people of great integrity and the best of character included Olive Brett Besse, Dorothy H. Rusk, Fred H. Carlson, William E. Dunn, William B. Wilkins, Sybil Bryant, Katherine Clairmont, Rose Young and Philip McIntyre.

I shall always remember with pleasure the work of Moderator Howard Osler, Clerk Florence Bordeau, Treasurer Florence M. Durgin and bus operator George Nelson.

The Principals and Teachers, the School Nurses, the Teacher Consultant, the Music Directors have been very cooperative through the years.

The budget Committees of Gilmanton have never reduced the school budget.

I wish to pay tribute to the Report of the 1963 Special School Study Committee of the Town of Gilmanton, including Philip E. McIntyre, Colonel Wilfred A. Emond, Mr. Murray L. Gilman, Mrs. Eleanor Nelson, Mr. Walter M. Senior, Jr., Mrs. Elizabeth Smithers, and Mrs. Evelyn Uhlenberg. It is one of the most comprehensive school reports I have ever seen and deserves your careful consideration.

This report includes the general statistics for the past year and the annual record to combine with past town reports for the educational progress of the town.

May I express my sincere appreciation to the Selectmen, the Budget Committee, the combined Parent-Teacher Association, the School Board, the Custodians, the Cafeteria Workers, the Bus Operators, the Principals and Teachers and to all parents and citizens for their excellent cooperation.
