#### REPORT OF THE SELECTMEN

We hereby submit our annual report to the citizens of the Town of Lisbon:

The year of 1980 brought many problems. Rising inflation added significantly to these problems. Considerable progress has been made in getting flood damaged roads back to normal, at no extra expense, by doing the repairs on normal operating budget.

Use of the Town Hall has been extensive this past year. We are happy to see the Hall put to such good use. Hoping to save money, we have had the balance of the Hall insulated. But as you know, the excessive rise in the cost of heating oil and electricity has added a tremendous cost to its operation.

The new bridge at Barrett's Crossing, North Lisbon, has been completed ahead of schedule and is a very satisfactory improvement for the general public. It has eliminated a major problem for the Fire Department and Highway Department.

The Chevron Oil Company donated to the Town of Lisbon the land and filling station on Main Street for the purpose of establishing a park. This park to be known as Chevron Park. In late winter, the filling station was torn down and work progressed, as time allowed, until late fall when the project was completed. This included 273 lineal feet of new sidewalk. Your Selectmen wish to express a vote of thanks to the people who donated time, labor, materials and equipment to make this a success.

During the past year progress has been made updating deteriorated sidewalks. In the following areas, the sidewalk was rebuilt and resurfaced: Lower Main Street from the Holmes property to the Furniture Corp. 481 lineal feet, and on Armstrong Avenue 316 lineal feet. The following sidewalks were resurfaced: Highland Avenue 448 lineal feet and Atwood Street 350 lineal feet.

A considerable amount of oiling was done on Town streets and approximately three (3) miles of outside district roads. It is hoped more can be done in the coming summer months.

A portion of Pearl Lake Road, in the Savagehill area, was rebuilt and will be oiled and resurfaced this summer. A new guard rail was also installed.

The Elderly Housing project at the former Warren Inn on Main Street will be ready for occupancy this March 1981. The Selectmen congratulate Northern Community Investment Corporation for the upgrading of this property which, we feel, will be an asset to the Town.

We want to thank you all for the cooperation received during the year.

# TOWN OF LISBON TOWN MEETING WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lisbon, in the County of Grafton, and the State of New Hampshire qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Lisbon Town Hall in said Lisbon on Tuesday the tenth day of March next at ten o'clock in the forenoon; at which time polls shall open and not close earlier than nine o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects except 1 & 2 to be considered at seven-thirty o'clock in the afternoon.

- ARTICLE 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.
- **ARTICLE 2.** To hear reports of agents, auditors, and special committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes for the current year.
- **ARTICLE 4.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate thirty-one thousand three hundred ninety dollars and thirty-eight cents (\$31, 390.38) for Town Road Maintenance and authorize the withdrawal of the amount required for this purpose from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund. (\$30,290.00 Revenue Sharing and \$1,100.38 Interest.)

**ARTICLE 5.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges and make appropriations for the same as set forth in the following budget:

**ARTICLE 6.** To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) from surplus funds to reduce the amount to be raised under Article 5.

ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell and convey property acquired by Tax Collectors' Deeds in accordance with New Hampshire law.

ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for and receive Federal Disaster Assistance Funds through the State Disaster Coordinating Office and to expend the funds so received to repair the damage to Town Roads and/or bridges caused by any declared emergency and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums as may be necessary to defray the cost of repairing damage in anticipation of Federal Disaster Funds to be received through the State Disaster Coordinating Office.

**ARTICLE 9.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed Two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) to repair the front facade of the Lisbon Town Library. Said money to be taken from surplus funds.

**ARTICLE 10.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed Six thousand dollars (\$6,000.00) to purchase a new Police Cruiser. Said money to be taken from surplus funds.

**ARTICLE 11.** To see if the Town will vote to plow the road known as Old County Road in the Streeter Pond area of said Town. (This article is by petition.)

**ARTICLE 12.** To see if the Town will vote to petition the Representatives and Senators who represent the Town in the General Court to support in the current session of the General Court, the concurrent resolution to amend the State Constitution to limit the annual increase in property taxes to five percent and to limit the annual increase in spending by the state or any city, town, or other governmental unit of the state to five percent. (This article is by petition.)

**ARTICLE 13.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of One thousand two hundred dollars (\$1,200.00) for the maintenance of the Community Field Swimming Pool. Said money to be taken from surplus funds.

**ARTICLE 14.** To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell that portion of the dam owned by the Town, along with a parcel of land along the riverbank for purposes of constructing a hydroelectric generating station. Prices and terms to be determined by the Selectmen in the best interest of the Town.

ARTICLE 15. Be it resolved, by the Town of Lisbon that the New Hampshire Housing Commission be and is authorized to operate in the Town of Lisbon, in the State of New Hampshire, that said New Hampshire Housing Commission is authorized to sponsor a project for low income persons under Section 8 of the U. S. Housing Act of 1937 as amended, for newly constructed dwelling units, the total amount of the foregoing not to exceed twenty-four (24) dwelling units.

**ARTICLE 16.** To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply for, accept and expend money from the State, Federal or other governmental unit or a private source which becomes available during the year in accordance with the procedures set forth in R.S.A. 31:95-b.

**ARTICLE 17.** To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

#### LISBON FIRE DEPARTMENT 1980

Your Fire Department's activities focused mainly upon the acquisition of the new pumper. Our new Engine 1 arrived on June 25 allowing retirement of the old Engine 1 after 28 years of service. The new piece has turned out to be an exceptionally good addition to the department's equipment, and we are very proud of it.

Another new addition to fire department activities during the summer was the forming of men's and women's muster teams. Groups of firefighters, wives, daughters, sisters and girl friends go to "muster" and compete with other departments in mock drills. Both of our teams did very well, and their trophies are on display in the meeting room if you missed seeing them at our open house. Also new this year were the new dress uniforms worn for the first time at the annual Twin State Fire School and our Open House.

Two men completed the 18-hour training course to become new members in 1980. Mark Elliott and Tim Corey are now regular members of the department. Firefighters completed over 300 hours of training, including training on the new pumper, Hurst Tool and rescue equipment, and general firefighting. Bill Bromage and Stan Snell are to be congratulated for the fine training program they have developed.

The Hurst Tool crew made four calls this year, two of them involving live extrications. The Hurst Tool, commonly called the "Jaws of Life" belongs to the Emergency Medical Service and is housed in Lisbon to be accessible to the surrounding area. The Jaws is a small but important part of the inventory of rescue tools and equipment of the Fire Department and Life Squad.

Twin State Fire Mutual Aid System has once again proved to be essential to fire protection for Lisbon. In 1980, we received assistance from Bath, Franconia, Landaff, Sugar Hill, and Woodsville a total of 26 times; we assisted other departments 11 times. Twin State's dispatch center, operated by the Grafton County Sheriff's office has proven its value several times also.

The meeting room and fire station area renovations were finished this year, a donation of 752 volunteer hours by firefighters and \$3,202.56 in materials. This substantial amount is a result of our public dances, grass burning, and the generosity of some private donors. Lisbon Fire Department is sincerely grateful to all who support our activities and who give us their financial support.

All members of the Fire Department and the Life Squad now have tone-alerting receivers in their homes, and twelve of us also have portable "pagers" which enable us to maintain constant contact with our dispatch centers. With this equipment, upon receipt of a call, our dispatchers "alert" the receivers through the municipal radio system. All of our vehicles have two-way radios which enables communication with the local and Twin State dispatchers. Calls to other departments can be made over the radios, eliminating costly time-consuming phone calls.

The Lisbon Fire Department suffered a severe loss in November with Firefighter Lyle McBurney's death. "Fib" is greatly missed by all of us. He had served 14 years on the Lisbon Fire Department.

#### LISBON FIRE DEPARTMENT

During 1980, the Lisbon Fire Department responded to 81 emergency calls. Unfortunately, due to the rising cost of heating, more people in our area have been burning wood. In 1979, the department responded to 10 chimney fire calls while in 1980 we answered 19! We emphasize the extreme care that wood-burners must exercise to insure safe operation. We place strong emphasis on the importance of smoke detectors and fire extinguishers for every home.

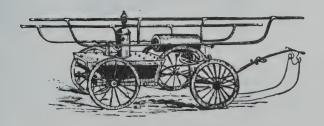

# REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST FIRE SERVICE

Forest Fire Prevention: Your Business, Our Business, Good Business. Forest fire prevention slogans have been seen in association with Smokey Bear since the late nineteen forties when a national effort to check the spread of forest fires was implemented.

New Hampshire residents recognized that forest fire prevention and suppression was the responsibility of every citizen, a half century before this national campaign, when our legislature established our first forest fire laws in 1903. Since that date, the State has appointed a town/city forest fire warden who is responsible for forest fire law enforcement in his municipality.

All fires kindled out of doors when there is no snow on the ground must be approved in writing by the forest fire warden before being kindled. All forest fires must be suppressed by the warden and his deputies as soon as they are reported. The cost of fire suppression is shared jointly by the town/city and the State of New Hampshire, as are forest fire prevention and forest fire training costs.

This state and local municipality cooperative forest fire program has given New Hampshire one of the best forest fire records in the United States.

#### LISBON PLANNING BOARD AND BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

In 1980, nine subdivisions were approved by the Lisbon Planning Board. The Lisbon Board of Adjustment heard six requests for special exceptions and granted five; keeping a pig in the residential zone was denied. Two requests for variance from size requirements were denied.

North Country Council, in addition to their usual assistance, has been helping update our Town Plan. Lars Jensen, a student intern, has inventoried our human and community resources. Copies of his report may be seen at the Town Hall and the Library. The Soils Survey should be completed this spring. We are working with the Water Resources Department and Soils Conservation Service to develop a flood plain management plan in hopes of minimizing flood hazards in Lisbon and effectively using the River and flood plain lands. Public involvement is needed.

The Board appreciates the help of Lisbon Regional School students and Friends-in-Council for distributing over 400 questionnaires seeking public opinion of our town problems and needs. We thank North Country Council for printing the survey and Nancy and Gerard Landry for their help tabulating. We need more questionnaires returned if the final results are to reflect the needs and wishes of a majority of the community. For those who still wish to participate, copies are available at the Town Hall or by calling Barbara Jesseman, 838-2890.

Planning Board meetings are the fourth Tuesday of each month, except when held in conjunction with public hearings, which are posted in the newspaper. The Board of Adjustment meets at the call of the chairman at least twice a year and whenever necessary for public hearings. All meetings are open to the public and all records are open to public inspection.

#### POLICE DEPARTMENT

With the closing of the year we see a new trend of serious crime not only moving into the north country, but in the Town of Lisbon itself. It is a trend which has been forecasted not only by state law enforcement agencies but by federal law enforcement as well.

We have seen over the past year two cases of arson with the complete loss of one home and a garage, and severe damage to another home, with a monetary loss in the thousands of dollars. Also we saw an armed holdup, which put the lives of two of Lisbon's citizens in great danger. We have also seen an increase in the conviction of burglaries in court, and an increase of burglaries which are still under investigation. Another very big problem which this department faced over the past year was fraud, which is the passing of bad checks. This particular problem is very time consuming in that it takes many days, and sometimes weeks, to locate the subject who is passing the checks. If that subject cannot make restitution, then court action will follow.

This past year we saw a decrease in our juvenile case load. This says a lot not only for the kids in Town, but also for the parents as well. I hope that this is one trend that will continue.

Last year we saw accidents on our highways increase. Up 22 from the previous year. We saw our first fatal accident since 1977, which means that the members of the Lisbon Police Department will have no other recourse, except to try harder to see that this does not happen in the year 1981.

We have implemented a new filing system into the Police Department. Instead of each category having its own card, we are now using a master file. We hope that this will eliminate a lot of duplication in our work. Also started is an intelligence file to gather information on certain individuals. In using this new system, we hope to prevent a crime before it happens.

The members of the Lisbon Police Department join me in thanking the citizens of Lisbon for their continued help and understanding during the past year.

#### REPORT OF THE WATER WORKS IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

The Town voted at the last annual meeting approval of final design and construction of improvements to the Municipal Water System that will enable us to meet the requirements for water that is not as subject to contamination from surface sources and at the same time upgrade our water flow for fire requirements.

Construction was started in the fall of 1980 on the 400 gallon per minute gravel packed well, pump station and access drive, a 400,000 gallon storage reservoir and about 5, 100 feet of 12 inch water mains. The gravel packed well was pumped at a rate of 700 gallons per minute for 72 hours. The well could have been pumped in excess of 1,000 gallons per minute. At the end of the 72 hours of pumping, water samples were taken and tested and have the approval of both our engineering firm and the State of New Hampshire. The 400,000 gallon cement storage tank is now 97% complete and was placed in operation in December. Final completion of this project will be in the Spring with the installation of the pump, completion of the pump station and additional 12 inch water mains to be installed.

The Water Board found it necessary to raise water rates in July and again in December to meet the Town's Financial commitments as to interest payments and payments on the FamHA loan which will be finalized in the Spring of 1981. Your present water bill reflects approximately what the Water Department needs to run the improved system as presented at the information meetings and the Town Meeting of 1980.

To finance construction the Town borrowed \$500,000 which will be refinanced through the FamHA loan but we still must pay for the interest as it accumulates.

As expressed at the 1980 Town Meeting the prime concern was that water meters should be installed to assure a fair distribution of expenses of the Water Department. The Water Board and the Selectmen are working with FamHA and our engineers to hopefully install water meters at no expense to the Water Department.

#### GRAFTON COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

In an effort to communicate more directly with the taxpaying citizens of Grafton County, we, the Grafton County Commissioners, are writing to you through your individual town or municipal reports.

Due to inflated Nursing Home expenses with somewhat reduced revenues and rapidly increasing costs of welfare reimbursements to the State, our budget year ended very close to the line, with a \$3,620 surplus. Because of the Delegation's decision to use a two-year surplus in one budget year to allow citizens a reduced county tax in FY 1980, the 1981 fiscal year budget resulted in a heavier tax factor making up that decrease as well as offsetting reduced revenues and allowing for standard budget increases.

As with towns, the county welfare assistance programs are increasing and becoming more involved, especially with the current energy crunch and rapidly inflating economy. We also foresee a possible decrease in Federal and State contributions to social service programs which could have considerable impact on local budgets.

The sewage disposal system has progressed slightly, with planning completed and ready to go out for bid. If all goes well, we may be able to submit a final report next year.

The Commissioners worked closely with the Nursing Home Employee Council to set up a wage/benefit package more compatible to the State program for Glencliff employees. The Commissioners hope to work out a job description/wage scale plan for courthouse employees in the near future.

Grafton County is gradually converting from a bookkeeping machine system to a computerized system for all county accounts. Payroll was converted effective January 1, 1980, and vendor payment and receipt programs were recently added. Patient accounts and purchase order programs will be added later. The system is too new for comprehensive comments, but we anticipate constructive changes in the overall accounting and reporting system.

The Commissioners hold their regular meeting every Monday (except holidays) at 9:30 a.m. in the Commissioners' Office of the Grafton County Courthouse, followed by a second meeting at the Grafton County Nursing Home Complex at 1:00 p.m., which regularly includes visits to farm and jail facilities. Public and press are welcome, and, in fact, are encouraged to attend the meetings.

# North Country Council, Inc. Town Report

In Lisbon, the Council has assisted the Planning Board in initiating a Community Plan. The Council also provided information on water supply and water improvements needed in the Town. Assistance was provided to the Town in preparing a \$750,000 grant/loan application to the Farmers Home Administration for improvements to the Lisbon Water System.

North Country Council is the regional planning commission and economic development district serving the North Country. In 1980, North Country Council targeted its resources and expertise to fit the needs and problems of the towns and region we serve. In the community planning field, the Council has programmed a systematic way of handling requests from communities for assistance with a local community plan. By the end of 1981, the Council will have assisted six communities complete master plans. For its membership fee in the Council, a town can receive any of twenty-two types of assistance identified by NCC.Communities can contract with NCC to undertake special project programs which require a significant amount of time over and above the normal types of services. Sponsorhip of the Municipal Law Lecture series and membership on the Environmental Law Clinic affords the Council with the opportunity to secure necessary legal information on behalf of the town. The Council has been active in a number of regional issues such as transportation, economic development, land use, and housing. In transportation, the Council has supported the restoration of rail service to the Mt. Washington Valley area and initiation of communter air service in Berlin, assistance to the Whitefield Regional Airport, and improved highway and public transportation systems. In land use, the Council has published reports on the Role of Agriculture in the North Country, Managing Wetland, and several brief fact sheets.

The Council has accelerated its economic development program with the addition of a Business Development Director who is making direct contact with businesses to encourage them to locate in North Country communities who have identified new industry as a need. NCC has prepared a regional industrial brochure coupled with local area fact sheets as a tool to encourage planned economic growth. As a result of these efforts, several companies have expressed an interest in locating in the region. Efforts are underway to establish a Revolving Loan Fund as an incentive for prospective industry.

In rural development, assistance has been provided to a number of communities in areas such as wastewater treatment, solid waste, water supply improvement, and other necessary community projects. A special report on Rural Development is available.

Because of the Council's activity in energy, the Governor's Council on Energy granted NCC some funds which will enable the Council to assist three targeted communities to prepare a local energy plan. State and federal agencies and statewide groups continue to contact North Country Council for a North Country perspective on such varied issues as growth, forestry, environmental concerns, land use, and manpower training. For example, in June, the Council presented testimony to a special legislative committee on proposed changes needed in the state's planning and zoning legislation. Association with these groups provides NCC with the opportunity to share some of the regional and local concerns expressed by the towns with those state and federal agencies whose decisions will impact on the region. The Council continues to work with other regional councils in New England through the efforts of its President who serves as a Board member of the National Association of Regional Councils.

The efforts and accomplishments of the Council are a collection of the many contributions of local towns, other agencies, our fine staff, the Board of Directors, and the Executive Committee. We express our appreciation to the Town for its support and assistance during the year. North Country Council is an arm of local government in the North Country.
