

## STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

# To the inhabitants of the Town of Milan qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at Androscoggin Hall in said town on the second Tuesday of March next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose by ballot and major vote a Town Clerk.

2. To choose by ballot and major vote three Selectmen.

3. To choose by ballot and major vote a Town Treasurer.

4. To choose Road Agents and all other necessary town officers, including Fish and Game Wardens.

5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of the poor, to apply on town debt and other necessary charges arising within the town.

6. To see what sums of money the town will raise for laying out, building, and repairing highways and bridges.

7. To see what sums of money the town will raise for breaking roads during the winter of 1905 and 1906.

8. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of schools.

9. To see if the town will vote not to distribute inventory blanks until such time as the Selectmen shall examine and appraise property to be taxed.

10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Library.

II. To choose a Library Trustee to serve three years.

12. To see if the town will vote not to have a liquor agent.

13. To see if the town will vote to exempt from taxation for ten years the mill property about to be constructed by Isaac Hagar at West Milan.

14. To see if the town will vote to extend the time licensed places for the sale of liquor may be kept open, from ten o'clock, P. M., to eleven o'clock, P. M.

15. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers heretofore chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

#### CHAIRMAN'S REPORT.

Milan, N. H., Feb. 15, 1905. To the Voters, Parents, Pupils, and all others interested in the affairs of the School District of Milan:

In accordance with precedent established, I wish to submit to you a brief statement of the condition of our schools and their work. The work and advancement of all our schools throughout the District is indeed gratifying. It is true that some of our rural schools have been obliged to close prematurely on account of nonattendance and some other circumstances over which we have no control, yet in the main I feel safe in saying that the work and advancement made in the schools is equal to, if not above, the average. The work in our village schools has been excellent, and the advancement marked. It is indeed a source of considerable gratification to me to be able to make this satisfactory report of our schools in general.

A word on finance will not be out of place here, for without sufficient funds the above results could not be obtained. The citizens of the District have been liberal in their appropriations, and we have endeavored to expend their money for the greatest good of the whole District, remembering that the boys and girls of today will be the men and women of tomorrow, and that our free public schools are the bulwarks of our republic, good morals and advancement in civilization and good citizenship. I would suggest that you appropriate as liberally in the future as you have in the past, so that my successors may be provided with the means to carry on the good work already begun.

There is a subject of which I feel it my duty to speak, though I would much rather let it pass; that is, the wanton destruction and defacement of school property, especially the out-buildings connected with the school-houses, the caricatures and obscene repre-

sentations one sees here are detestable, demoralizing and degrading. I would call upon every pupil and all other persons to use every means in their power to suppress this nefarious practice once for all. I cannot use language strong enough to express my sentiments upon this subject, and hope my successors may never have to refer to the matter again.

In retiring from the Board, I wish to express my sincere thanks to the other members of the School Board for their valuable assistance, which has been so cheerfully rendered, to the parents, pupils and all others who have assisted and given me their support in the performance of my duties as I have seen them.
