FIRE REPORT FOR YEAR ENDING FEB. 15, 1916

Northwood, N. H., Feb. 15, 1916.

In all there has been reported seven calls, five of which were chimney fires, three were of a nature that might have proven serious had it not been for the services of the Fire Company.

Two of the seven were of more serious nature; the first resulting in the loss of the barn on the Nat Tasker place at the Ridge at which the house was saved by the good work of the fire company and outside help.

The second was the Evans' fire at East Northwood with a loss of the entire set of buildings. This was an exceptionally hard fire to fight being so close to other buildings and but for the fire company and the generous aid of others present, the loss would have been much more serious.

We would recommend that the town buy two dozen rubber suits and hats, four extension ladders and such other equipments as the fire chief and selectmen think advisable.

We would also recommend that the town furnish chemicals for the recharging of the fire extinguishers belonging to Northwood Mutual Fire Ins. Co. in consideration that said Insurance Co. loan to the Fire Co. the extinguishers when needed.

We further recommend that the town raise \$200.00 to meet the expenses of fighting fires and buying supplies for the ensuing year.

Report of School Board

The schools the past year have been in session thirty-one weeks at the Narrows and thirty-two at the Ridge. On account of sickness the week at the Narrows was left off but it will be made up the coming year as we intend all schools shall have equal privileges.

Not as many names appear on the roll of honor this year as usual especially in the Narrows school. This is not the fault of either pupil or teacher as in the two first terms of the year there were many who were not absent or tardy but owing to whooping cough in the winter term, there were none in the grammar and intermediate rooms and in the primary only one. In the first term of the year in the intermediate room there were twenty whose names appear on the list of perfect attendance.

In November of this school year the "Woman's Club" of this town presented to each of the schools a very useful present which are appreciated much by pupils, teachers and members of the school board.

The grammar rooms each received pictures, the intermediate books, and the primary rooms, busy work tables.

We are glad that the women are taking such an interest in the work of the schools and thank them very much for what they are doing for the welfare of the schools.

More money has been received from the State this year for the school work than ever before, and this is due to the good attendance in all the schools, to a great

extent. This shows us how important it is that, perfect attendance, as far as possible, is demanded.

Some repairs have been made this year but much more is needed. The Ridge building needs a coat of paint and if a school is continued at the Mountain, much repairing will have to be done there.

We earnestly thank all the teachers for the good work they have done the past year. They are certainly a faithful band of workers and should receive much help from all parents and others interested in good education for their children.

We hope another year the schools may be kept longer in the winter as they are in other towns around us. Let all interested in good schools work together for the betterment of our schools and the work of education.

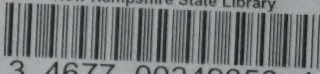
