On the cover:

The bronze figure on the Soldiers' Monument in Warner is a likeness of General Walter Harriman, born in Warner April 8, 1817. At the age of 23 he entered into the ministry and commenced preaching in Warner, but subsequently entered into trade, being associated with John S. Pillsbury. In 1849 he was chosen a representative from Warner. He saw distinguished service during the Civil War, was taken prisoner but exchanged and came home for a season. In 1864 he was active in the re-election of Abraham Lincoln. He returned to his regiment. At the close of the war he was chosen Secretary of State by the legislature, and elected Governor in 1867 and re-elected in 1868. He was active in the election of General Grant. Received the Honorary Degree of Master of Arts from Dartmouth College in 1867. Moved to Concord in 1872 and upon his retirement from political life he wrote the History of Warner which was published in 1879. Died July 25, 1884.

The monument was dedicated on July 2, 1903.

WARRANT FOR THE TOWN MEETING

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Warner in the County of Merrimack in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at The Town Hall in said Warner on Tuesday, the Sixth day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

Polls to open at 9:00 A.M. and to close not earlier than 7:00 P.M. Articles in the warrant will be taken up at 7:00 P.M.

- 1. To choose all necessary town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To see if the town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$1,500.00 (Fifteen hundred Dollars) to be paid to a Capital Reserve Fund which shall be so named "New Cemetery Fund" for the purpose of improvements to the new cemetery.
- 3. To see if the town will vote to appropriate \$24,000.00 (Twenty-Four Thousand Dollars) for a new Highway Truck and equipment and authorize the withdrawal of \$22,000.00 (Twenty-Two Thousand Dollars) for this purpose from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972 with the balance to be raised by taxation.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Moderator to appoint a special unpaid Advisory Committee of three persons to be known as the Regional Refuse Disposal Planning Committee which will join with other towns on the Regional Refuse Disposal Planning Board. Such Committee shall make recommendations to Town Meeting for upgrading the town dump including, but not limited to, the advisability of joint action with other towns; and that the town appropriate \$430.00 (Four Hundred Thirty Dollars) as the Town's share of costs to undertake this work, conditional upon the terms set forth in the Regional Refuse Disposal Planning Board's proposed by-laws.
- 5. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to appoint a full-time Chief of Police and appropriate the sum of \$20,000.00 (Twenty Thousand Dollars) for the purpose of funding the salaries of the Chief of Police and part-time employees of the Police Department and the operating expenses of the department. (Submitted by Peitition).
- 6. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 7. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen and Town Treasurer to borrow money in the anticipation of taxes on the note or notes of the Town.
- 8. To see if the town will authorize the Selectmen to sell property taken for taxes.
- 9. To hear reports of the Officers of the Town heretofore chosen and Committees appointed and pass any vote relating thereto.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to designate as scenic roads, pursuant to New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 253, Section 17, the Burnt Hill Road, so-called, leading from the Lower Village in said Warner over Burnt

Hill to its junction with the Pumpkin Hill Road, so-called, thence by the said Pumpkin Hill Road to the Town Line at the Town of Salisbury. (Submitted by Petition).

- 11. To see if the town will vote to change the name of a street located in the Town of Warner now known as "Poverty Plains Road" to "Plains Road". (Submitted by Petition).
- 12. To see if the Town will vote to abandon all right and interest in that portion of the Public Highway serving as the easterly approach to the Ela Bridge, so-called, being that portion between the easterly shore of the Warner River and the westerly terminus of Mill Street at the junction of Mill Street and North Village Road, all right, title and interest of the town therein to revert to the abutting owners.
- 13. To see if the town will vote to accept by gift or token payment the land known as "Copps Field" or "The Baseball Field" formerly owned by the Warner School District, now owned by Kearsarge Regional School District in event that an article be passed at the Kearsarge Regional School District Annual Meeting offering the above property to the Town of Warner and that the Board of Selectmen be authorized to work out the details of the transaction with the Kearsarge Regional School Board.
- 14. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

REPORT OF THE SELECTMEN

More shade trees were again planted this year to replace the elm and maples that were diseased and had to be removed. Money is in the budget to continue this project.

Due to complications (no fault of the Firemen's Committee or the Board of Selectmen) the fire truck was not delivered this past year but we do have a guarantee of an early arrival this spring.

The Highway Department was kept busy replacing old bridges with either culverts or new bridges. Joppa Road was straightened and widened with culverts cleaned out, brush removed and old culverts replaced. Due to the fact that many formerly seasonal dwellings are now being occupied on a year-round basis considerable reconstruction and maintenance has been required on roads in the outlying districts. This being one reason by our TRA project on Schoodac Road was not continued this year. We intend to continue that project in 1973 and subsequent years until we have reached the Webster Town Line. During the past year the Highway Department has insulated the highway garage, installed a furnace and added new lighting in the building. We have also had gas and diesel fuel tanks installed.

The Chandler Reservation Committee has met a number of times and has issued a permit to do selective cutting of previously marked trees.

The painting of the interior of the town hall has been completed. It might be noted that the clock has been put back into operation after many years of rest. Improvements in the electrical system have been started and more improvements anticipated this year. Also some of the pipes in the heating system have been replaced and hope that this alleviates the banging noises.

Some members of the Board have attended various reguional meetings consisting of the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region Association and the Central N.H. Regional Planning Commission. Selectmen Philip Gervais has represented the Town on the Central N.H. Regional Solid Waste Committee this past year. We would like to thank Charles Thoits and Ronald Laware (resigned) for the representation they have given the Town on the Central N.H. Regional Planning Commission. They have spent many hours studying and planning with other communities in the region and brought back a lot of useful information to us.

The Board of Selectmen have found it very difficult to fill vacancies on different boards and committees of the town. We hope to see and hear from more civic-minded citizens who would be interested in serving their community. Every year there are positions to be filled on the Zoning Board of Adjustment, Planning Board, Highway Safety Committee, Police Department, Regional Planning Commission and Solid Waste Study Committee. We are also looking for someone as janitor for the town hall.

Special mention should be made that Elmer J. Bartlett, who resigned from the Supervisors of the Check List during the year will be missed after serving in this position since November 1918.

We would like to thank everyone who has been of help to us during the past year. Your understanding and cooperation have made our tasks much easier.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES OF TRUST FUNDS FOR THE YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31, 1972

Trustees have custody of 296 permanent trust funds with aggregate cost value of \$121,674.20, market value of \$124,886.68 and unexpended income, including accumulations of prior years, amounting to \$9,527.35. In accordance with instructions pertaining to each trust, the sum of \$6,827.33 was expended during the year 1972 with the Town of Warner, Kearsarge Regional School District, Pillsbury Free Library, United Church of Warner, Almoners of Foster Fund, Pine Grove Cemetery Association, Inc., and care of various cemetery lots participating in the distribution.

Also the Trustees of Trust Funds have custody of a temporary fund with balance of \$62.01 in connection with new cemetery at Waterloo.

Further detailed information concerning said trusts may be obtained from the reports on file with the New Hampshire State Tax Commission, Board of Selectmen, Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, Town Moderator and each member of the Board of Trustees of Trust Funds.

REPORT OF CEMETERY CUSTODIANS

In the fall of 1972 the Cemetery custodians sold the first lot in the new Warner Town Cemetery, receiving payment for both the lot and its perpetual care.

Eventually receipts will provide sufficient income to pay costs of maintenance, but that date is a number of years in the future. In the meantime, such costs must be borne by the Town in anticipation of future income. The Cemetery Custodians have consulted with a professional landscaper, Edmunds Nurseries, concerning future planning for the site. It was his considered judgment, concurred in by the Cemetery Custodians, that a first essential to any future plans will be a supply of water. This will involve drilling a well and installing a pump, including the provision of electric power. The Cemetery Custodians are requesting an appropriation of \$1,500.00 in 1973, to be placed in a Capital Reserve Fund; with a similar request in 1974. By the 1974 Town Meeting the Cemetery Custodians will have available exact estimates of the total cost of the project. In the meantime, the Cemetery Custodians are requesting the Selectmen to provide town crew assistance in some grading and smoothing of the site and its entrance.

The Cemetery Custodians stand ready at all times to answer any queries concerning the new Town Cemetery. The rules for its use were printed in the 1971 Town Report.

- 5. To see what sum of money the District will vote to raise and appropriate for the care and improvement of the water system, for the care and improvement of the sewer system and for fire protection.
- 6. To see if the Warner Village Fire District will authorize the Commissioners and District Treasurer to borrow money in anticipation of Water and Sewer Rents on the note, or notes of the Warner Village Fire District.
- 7. To see if the District will vote to amend the last sentence of paragraph 20, page 11, of the terms and conditions of the regulations of the Warner Village Fire District to read as following:

Upon complaint of a customer, the customer's water meter shall be removed and tested by an independent testing company. If the meter proves to be accurate, the customer will be charged \$15.00 (fifteen dollars) for such test. If the meter proves to be inaccurate, the cost of said test will be borne by the District.

8. To see if the District will vote to amend the schedule of salaries and fees — page 14 of the Warner Village Fire District Regulations to read as follows:

The Water Commissioners held regular monthly meetings during 1972 and several special meetings. Business at the regular meetings involved current and normal operations of the water and sewage systems. The special meetings concerned discussions with representatives of Anderson-Nichols Company relative to the reservoir dam study and a representative of Badger Meter Company relative to some technical advice. The Commissioners also discussed gravel packed well investigations and possible financing with Anderson-Nichols Company. The Commissioners feel that such a well study should be undertaken as soon as possible in order to be prepared to make a wise decision in the future relative to an adequate and safe surface or well water supply to meet the expected increase in consumption and required Water Supply and Pollution Commission standards.

The latest information relative to Warner's sewage treatment facility indicates that our status has not changed since 1971. The Federal Government is supplying meager amounts of money for seqage treatment facilities to the state's communities.

Commissioner Emil W. Allen, Jr. reluctantly resigned as of June 1, 1972 due to the family move to the Waterloo Section. The Commissioners accepted his resignation with regret and soon after appointed Mr. Alfred White to fill the vacancy.

It was reported in 1971 that the Commissioners were concerned about the number of delinquent accounts. We are pleased to report that the problem has practically disappeared. The excellent results have been due to the fine work accomplished by the By-laws and Regulations Committee and the wisdom of the voters in accepting the Committee's final draft at the 1972 Annual Fire Precinct meeting.

REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND DISTRICT CHIEF

In New Hampshire, forest fire control is a cooperative State-town program. The Town Forest Fire Warden, appointed by the Director, Division of Resources Development upon recommendation of the Selectmen and the State's District Forest Fire Chief is responsible for fire suppression and other related duties. The State shares equally with the town in the cost of most forest fires, except illegal and careless fires, which are charged to the responsible party. The State further provides fire detection services, prevention programs, fire training for town wardens and crews, and back-up equipment for fire suppression.

By authority of the State, the Town Forest Fire Warden controls all outside burning in his town except backyard cooking fires. Any person wishing to kindle a fire when the ground is not covered with snow must obtain a fire permit, free of cost, from the Town Forest Fire Warden. No permits will be issued for fires between 9:00 P.M. and 5:00 P.M. unless it is raining, except for commercial purposes.

Please be careful when using fire, remember it can be an extremely useful tool when under control but once allowed to run wild it can become a disastrous and devastating force. Only you can prevent a forest fire.

REPORT OF THE WARNER PLANNING BOARD

The Planning Board met monthly during 1972 with the exception of two summer months.

Early in the year, the Board resolved to restudy the zoning needs of the Town on a current basis and with the expectation of submitting recommended town-wide changes in the zoning ordinance at the 1973 Town Meeting. This simply didn't get done.

One step was taken to improve the zoning arrangement of the Town, however, and this was with regard to commercial property. As originally adopted, the only land zoned as commercial within the Town limits lays in three small areas: (1) the small area of business establishments on Main Street; (2) from Mill Street to Main Street along Depot Street; and (3) any area surrounding Exit 9 on I-89. Immediacy was given to the need for some change in the commercial zoning by an individual who expressed interest in setting up a commercial establishment on property not now zoned commercial if the zoning were changed to permit it. As a result, the Planning Board recommended a zoning boundary change to include an area which would fill in between the Depot Street commercial area and that at Exit 9 of I-89. Accordingly, two articles defining the new zone were drafted by the Planning Board and submitted to the Selectmen with the recommendation that a special Town Meeting be called. The Board conducted the required hearings on the amendments and they were approved at the special Town Meeting of July 6, 1972.

Commencing with the fall meetings of the Board, there has been an increasing number of Warner residents seeking approval for selling off a single lot from property which they own. Nine subdivisions of this type (known as "minor" since they involve less than four lots) were considered and approved by the Board in 1972. None were refused.

Interestingly, all applications and discussions re major subdivisions have originated with non-residents of Warner. Two major subdivisions, one involving six lots, the other thirteen or fourteen, came to the Board's attention in 1972. In the six-lot case, the potential subdivider has informed us verbally he is not planning to do anything at the present and will not complete his application at the present. The larger subdivision as initially proposed by the property owner was rejected by the Board before preliminary approval documents were completed because the applicant was unwilling to provide a street of adequate width into the property to be subdivided. It is expected he will submit new plans for subdividing the property in another manner.

A third and fourth major subdivision, each involving eight lots, are in the "pre-application" phase at this time.

The Board regrets that its former chairman, Mr. Paul Collins, felt personal demands on his time made necessary his resignation in the fall of 1972 after many years of active service on the Board. The Board also regretted the resignation submitted by Mr. John Jewell, which was occasioned by his move

from Warner. Mr. Jewell's vacancy was filled at mid-year by the appointment of Mr. Charles Eastley. Frequent evening work has made his attendance at Board meetings so difficult that he has resigned within the past several days. Late in December, the Selectmen appointed Mr. Robert G. Walker to fill out the balance of Mr. Collins' term with the expectation that Mr. Walker will accept reappointment to a full term commencing with 1973.

With the help of the Selectmen, one of the small rooms at the rear of the Town Hall basement is being fixed up as an office for the Planning Board and a file cabinet being acquired to make possible the proper organization of the rather voluminous documentation required in many of the subdivision procedures.

Your Planning Board members will welcome receiving from all interested citizens their suggestions as to how the Board may best serve the Town in the coming months. Our meetings are held on the first Monday of each month at 8:00 P.M. in the Town Hall and anyone may visit who desires to do so.
