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

REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.

District No. 1.

Last summer the scholars in this district attended school in district No. 2. Paid \$12.00 for having them carried.

The winter term was taught by Miss Edith Walker of Fryeburg. This was Miss Walkers first term. She was much interested in her work, but on account of illness was obliged to leave at the end of ten and one half weeks. Number of scholars 5, two of them came from Conway, average 4. Wages of teacher \$3.00 per week. Board \$1.50. Paid \$4.00 for wood.

District No. 2.

Miss Minnie Anderson of Chatham, taught the summer school in this district. Miss Anderson's work was entirely satisfactory. Length of term 8 weeks. Number of scholars 14, average 12. Wages of teacher including board \$5.50 per week.

The winter term was taught by Miss Bessie Walker of Chatham. Length of term 12 weeks. Number of scholars 9, average 7. Wages of teacher including board \$5.50 per week. Paid \$6.00 for wood.

Miss Walker has taught several schools in town, and her work is to well known to need comment.

District. No. 3.

Summer term of eight weeks was taught by Miss Louise E. Spener, of Chatham, N. H. Also the winter term of twelve weeks.

Whole number of scholars summer school 17, average 14. Whole number attending in winter 16, average 13. Wages of teacher including board \$6.00. Paid for wood \$6.00. For repairs and supplies, \$2.25.

District. No. 4.

Summer term taught by Nathan B. Dresser, length of term eight weeks. No. of scholars 22, average days attendance 21. Wages of teacher \$1.00 per day, price paid for board \$1.50, price paid for wood \$4.15. Mr. Dresser labored faithfully and taught a good school.

Winter term taught by Fred W. Brown, number of weeks 12, number of scholars 25, average attendance 21. Wages of teacher \$1.00 per day, paid for board \$1.50 per week, the pupils made good progress in their studies. The order and discipline were good and the school appeared to be satisfactory to all.

District. No. 5.

The summer term was taught by Bessie P. Walker, number of scholars 12, average daily attendance 11. Wages of teacher \$4.00 per week, price paid for board \$1.50, paid for wood \$5.25, length of term 9 weeks.

Miss Walker has every qualification necessary to teach successfully and the pupils could not fail to improve under her instruction.

Winter term was taught by Miss Olive E. Barrows, length of term 14 weeks. Wages of teacher \$4.00 per week, paid for board \$1.50 per week, whole number of scholars 10, average attendance 10. This was Miss Barrows first attempt at teaching. The attendance was good and the school money profitably expended, she bids fair to make a fine teacher.

Recieved \$14.50 from the town of Stow, for scholars attending school in the town of Chatham.
