WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

- To the inhabitants of the town of Farmington qualified to vote in town affairs:
- You are hereby notified to meet at Music Hall in said Farmington on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:
- Article 1. To see if the town will vote to appropriate the money received from the state to the town current expense fund.
- Article 2. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to defray the expenses for the ensuing year and make appropriation for the same.
- Article 3. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of money necessary to secure state aid for the permanent improvement of highways, Chapter 35, Laws of 1905, and that the same be expended on the main road leading from Farmington to Wolfeboro.
- Article 4. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of money necessary to secure the state portion of the maintenance fund.
- Article 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise on a hundred of valuation for the repairs and improvement of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
- Article 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire for the purpose of paying the debt of the town for the ensuing year.

- Article 7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of building and repairing concrete sidewalks.
- Article 8. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be used in exterminating moths.
- Article 9. To see if the town will vote to buy a surety bond for its clerk and treasurer.
- Article 10. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate to Carlton Post, G. A. R., to be used for Memorial Day purposes, May 30, 1928.
- Article 11. (By request) To see if the town will vote to abate the local taxes on the two shoe factories of Paul J. Richard Co., Inc., located on Central street, and the capital used in operating the same, for a term of five years.
- Article 12. (By petition) To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the .care and improvement of Edgerly park, Fernald park, and the plot of land at the junction of Central and Spring streets, known as the bandstand plot, said sum to be intrusted to the Farmington Woman's club to be expended under the supervision of the selectmen.
- Article 13. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of money necessary to secure state aid in exterminating the white pine blister.
- Article 14. To see what action the town wishes to take in regard to rebuilding the town hall; raise and appropriate money for the same.
- Article 15. (By request) To see if the town will vote to abate the local taxes on the shoe factory of the Dole-Waldron Shoe Co. located on North Main street and the capital used in operating the same for a term of five years.
- Article 16. To see what special action the town wishes to take in regard to bridges.

- Article 17. (By petition) To see if the town will vote to accept and grade the street connecting Lone Star avenue with Gray avenue on its easterly end.
- Article 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be expended in observing Old Home Week.
- Article 19. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of money necessary to secure the state portion of the maintenance fund for state aid highways.
- Article 20. (By petition) To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for band concerts to be held at such times and places as the selectmen may deem suitable and appropriate.
- Article 21. To see what sum of money the town will vote for the annual support of the Public Library and raise and appropriate the same.
- Article 22. (By petition) To see if the town will vote to exempt from taxation the Public Library lot and any Public Library erected thereon.
- Article 23. To choose one selectman for three years, one selectman for one year, a town clerk, a town treasurer, and all other necessary officers and agents for the year ensuing and bring in your ballots for the election of delegates and alternates to the national convention.

SELECTMEN'S REPORT

TO THE CITIZENS AND TAXBAYERS OF FARMINGTON, NEW HAMPSHIRE

In submitting our report for the year just closed, we wish to call attention to a few points which in our opinion will interest all citizens of the town.

At the March meeting the votors authorized us to purchase two Ford ton trucks, which we did, at a cost of \$1,400. We were then confronted with the necessity of building a garage in which to house them. This was accomplished, at a cost of \$354, by building an addition to the tractor shed in the rear of the town hall.

As we already had a tractor purchased with the intention of lessening the expense of road work, it was necessary to have a road machine strong enough to use with it. Accordingly, we bought a Stockland grader and scarifier combined at a cost of \$1,006.75. A study of the following report will show the cost of the summer road work to be \$8,230.43, as compared with \$9,944.95 for the year 1926, a saving of \$1,714.52. This, in spite of the severe rains, which, as you know, raised havoc with all country roads, necessitating a good deal more work than usual.

At the town meeting you voted to continue the state road on Charles street. This road was started but we were obliged to leave it incomplete in order to work on some of our country roads which were in a dangerous condition owing to the heavy rains. We would also call to your attention the fact that we were able to keep the cost of the state road down by using the remainder of the Mad river appropriation. This was done by taking the rocks from Charles street to reinforce the banks of the river, thus taking care of two items under one expense account. It is our belief that this was a fortunate

maneuver as the river would otherwise have done a lot of damage at the time of the flood.

Your appropriation of \$1,000 for the repairs of sidewalks was insufficient to attract an outside contractor. Owing to the amount of road work to be done, that department was unable to attend to this, therefore, you have on hand the original appropriation.

In closing, we would call your attention to the fact that although handicapped at the beginning of the year by the Trask lawsuit, which we were fortunate enough to settle out of court for the amount of \$2,420, we were able to reduce the debt \$1,774.37.

The following report will give you an exact record of the transactions made by us for the year 1927.
