# STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE TOWN WARRANT HANCOCK NH

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hancock, in the County of Hillsborough in said state qualified to vote in Town Affairs; You are hereby notified to meet at the **TOWN OFFICE BUILDING** in said Hancock on Tuesday, the eleventh (11<sup>th</sup>) day of March 2002 at eight of the clock in the forenoon until seven of the clock in the evening, for ballot voting of Town Officers and all other matters requiring ballot vote; and, to meet at said **FIRE STATION** in said Hancock, on Saturday, the fifteenth (15<sup>th</sup>) day of March 2002 at nine of the clock in the morning, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate (\$1,288,103.00) which represents the operating budget, inclusive of the Water Department operations. Said sum exclusive of all special or individual articles addressed; or take any other action relating thereto. Selectmen recommend this appropriation.
- 3. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to forty-five thousand dollars (\$45,000) to conduct an assessment update of the Town of Hancock as part of the state's criteria for receiving certification in 2004; or take any other action relating thereto. Selectmen recommend this appropriation
- 4. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to twenty five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for the purchase of a new police cruiser; and, authorize the withdrawal of seven thousand dollars (\$7,000) from the Police Special Revenue Fund; the balance to come from taxation; or take any other action relating thereto. Selectmen recommend this appropriation.
- 5. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to forty-five thousand dollars (\$45,000) for an addition to the existing recycling shed, and to authorize the issuance of bonds or notes in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (RSA 33) and to authorize the municipal officials to issue and negotiate such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon; or take any other action relating thereto. The Selectmen recommend this appropriation. (2/3 ballot vote required).
- 6. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to eight thousand dollars (\$8,000) to scrape and paint the exterior of the post office; or take any other action relating thereto. Selectmen recommend this appropriation.
- 7. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to authorize the Selectmen to enter into a four-year lease/purchase agreement in the amount of sixty thousand nine hundred thirty-five dollars (\$60,935 to purchase a new backhoe for the Highway Department and to

raise and appropriate \$15,000 for the first year's payment and, further, to authorize the trade-in of the Case 580K for \$15,000 to be used to offset the first year's payment of \$15,000; or take any other action relating thereto. Selectmen recommend this appropriation. (Majority vote required)

- 8. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to five thousand five hundred dollars (\$5,500) for the purchase and installation of floating dock sections at the Norway Pond beach; or take any other action relating thereto. Selectmen recommend this appropriation.
- 9. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate one thousand dollars (\$1,000) to support the Senior Nutrition Program at Sargent Center; or take any other action relating thereto. Selectmen recommend this appropriation.
- 10. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to four thousand dollars (\$4,000) for the purpose of funding a fireworks display on or about July 4, 2003; or take any other action relating thereto. Selectmen recommend this appropriation.
- 11. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate eight thousand dollars (\$8,000) and authorize the Selectmen to expend up to \$8,000 of donations received for the War Memorial that was approved at the 2002 Town Meeting, to complete the project by the purchase and installation of the plaques and landscaping; or take any other action relating thereto. This is a non-lapsing article and will not lapse until the project is completed, or December 31, 2004. No funds to be raised by taxation. Selectmen recommend this appropriation.
- 12. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) to landscape the Town Common and to authorize the withdrawal from the Whitcomb Legacy Trust Fund established, established in 1889, for the care of the Common; or take any other action relating thereto. No funds to be raised by taxation. Selectmen recommend this appropriation.
- 13. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to reclassify as a Class A trail pursuant to the provisions of RSA 231-A the portion of the existing Class VI highway known as Jaquith Road from the driveway of 205 Jaquith Road (Tax Map R-4, Lot 11A) northwesterly to the Harrisville town line (approximately 9/10 of a mile); or take any other action relating thereto. Selectmen recommend this article.
- 14. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$5,054 for the purpose of repairs and replacement of beach and ballfield equipment; and to authorize the withdrawal of this sum from the Hancock Recreation Fund (Revenue Fund) established for this purpose at the 1993 town meeting to fund this appropriation; or take any other action relating thereto. {No funds to be raised by taxation} Selectmen recommend this appropriation.

- 15. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$3,284 for the purpose of repairs and replacement of town highway equipment; and, authorize the withdrawal from the Hancock Highway Special Revenue Fund established for this purpose at the 1999 town meeting; or take any other action relating thereto. {No funds to be raised by taxation} Selectmen recommend this appropriation.
- 16. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$12,234 for the purpose of repairs and replacement of police equipment; and, authorize the withdrawal from the Hancock Police Equipment Repair/Replacement Fund (Revenue Fund) established for this purpose at the 1993 town meeting; or take any other action relating thereto. {No funds to be raised by taxation} Selectmen recommend this appropriation.
- 17. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$1,227 for the purpose of purchasing baseball equipment and doing maintenance and repairs to the ballfields; and, authorize the withdrawal from the Hancock Baseball Fund (Revenue Fund) established for this purpose at the 1997 town meeting; or take any other action relating thereto. {No funds to be raised by taxation} Selectmen recommend this appropriation.
- 18. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$7,918 for the purpose of preservation and storage of the town's archival records; and, authorize the withdrawal from the Hancock History Fund (Revenue Fund) established for this purpose at the 1993 town meeting; or take any other action relating thereto. {No funds to be raised by taxation} Selectmen recommend this appropriation.
- 19. To see if the Town wishes to amend the existing agreement under Section 218 of the Social Security Act by excluding the services performed by election workers for a calendar year in which the remuneration paid for such service is less than \$1,200. The \$1,200 limit on the excludable amount of remuneration paid in a calendar year for the services specified in this modification will be subject to adjustment for calendar years after 2002 to reflect changes in wages in the economy without any further modification of the agreement, with respect to such services performed during such calendar years, in accordance with Section 218(c)(8)(B) of the Social Security Act.
- 20. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept the reports of auditors and committees as printed in the Town Report; or take any other action relating thereto.
- 21. To see if the town will vote to send the following resolution to the New Hampshire General Court: Resolved, in its first two years of operation, the Land and Community Heritage Investment Program (LCHIP) has helped communities throughout New Hampshire preserve their natural, cultural and historic resources and, therefore, the State of New Hampshire should maintain funding for LCHIP in its next biennial budget.

22. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to support the following resolution:

Whereas, New Hampshire residents pay the 12th highest cost of insurance in the country; and,

Whereas, the cost of health insurance premiums for families has increased by 45% over the past three years; and

Whereas, 100,000 New Hampshire residents have no health coverage and 77% of them have a full-time worker at home; and

Whereas, due to these rising costs almost half of New Hampshire's small business cannot afford health coverage for their employees, therefore be it resolved

That we, the citizens of HANCOCK, New Hampshire, call on our elected officials from all levels of government, and those seeking office, to work with consumers, businesses, and health care providers to ensure that:

- Everyone, including the self-employed, un-and underinsured, and small business owners has access to an affordable basic health plan similar to what federal employees receive;
- Everyone, including employers, consumers, and the state, local and federal government makes a responsible and fair contribution to finance the health care system;
- Everyone receives high quality care that is cost efficient and medically effective; and
- That these efforts help control the skyrocketing cost of health care.

23. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## Report of the Selectmen

Another year has gone by and once again we can report we have been busy. The town continues to grow and it seems that the demands of the town by residents, the state, and the federal government continue to increase. But, Hancock has had a good year. Much has been accomplished.

The high point of the year was the Community Forum which allowed and encouraged all residents to share their views giving an opportunity to critique as well as hope and dream about Hancock. Out of the two day forum three major committees formed and are working hard. The Open Space committee has gathered information from residents and many other sources to create an amazing report which the Conservation Commission will make part of the town Natural Resource Inventory which is now being created. The Affordable Housing Committee is gathering information and working hard to create a plan for their future work. The Village Planning Committee is also gathering information to create a master plan for the down town area. These three committees have committed members who are striving to move Hancock into the future with a plan for where the town wants to go.

Selectmen once again spent a major amount of time on zoning issues. Court cases have been won and we are happy to report that we feel that to the best of our knowledge all properties in town are compliant or working to quickly become compliant. A four year process of assuring total compliance is nearly complete.

Over the last few years the town has worked to improve its facilities and maintain its buildings and grounds. The Town Office sign went into place and furniture for the new meeting room arrived essentially completing this project creating a new up-to-date home for the work of the town. The Town has moved from the old town office which didn't even have hot water to our new home in the center of town with a space that is workable and accessible. The new phone system is also now in place allowing residents to leave voice mail messages during off hours.

The Transfer Station has seen a substantial increase in use over the last several years. To meet these increases, the town began baling recyclables. Full baling was complete this year. Also, space has become a problem and Selectmen are proposing an addition to the current dump building which will also add heat and a restroom for the employees who work so hard there in all types of weather.

The town took on the major project of reconstructing the Tannery Hill Road bridge. This project happened without a hitch. The state bridge program paid for 80% of this project but with the excellent work of our own highway department we were able to do this project at a far cheaper cost than the state estimates. A special word of appreciation goes to the highway crew and to the neighbors who were key to this project working so well.

The work on the recreation area continued through the summer. Despite the fact that over 20 test pits never hit a rock, major boulders were found under the area which slowed

the process down. The tennis court is complete. The area has been seeded, but because of the early onset of winter may have to be seeded again. The seed is guaranteed so reseeding will happen at no cost to the town. It is expected that baseball and soccer can begin on the field in the spring of 2004 once the grass has completely taken hold. As part of this process a new playground has been installed at the elementary school at no cost to the town.

Buildings still have been an issue this year with a tree damaging our horsesheds. Fortunately, the repair job is fantastic and the charm and character of the building has been maintained. Even the new slate matches the older slate. The "Garland House" was put out to bid by the selectmen, but there were no bids. Finally the buildings have been turned over to a contractor who is taking them down and moving the pieces elsewhere. This process should be completed this spring with the town finishing the clean-up of the area as soon as possible.

This coming year selectmen are asking the town to authorize an update to our property assessments. In 2004 the state will come in to "certify" the town and our current assessment will cause us to not receive certification due to the fact that our equalized assessment rate is only 76%. This coupled with the changes that are taking place with current use will be a challenge and require many hours of the selectmen.

This and coming years will have many challenges for the town. Growth, affordable housing, increased state requirements, how to meet our needs and not over tax, residents finding time to continue a volunteer government, and many other areas will push the town. But, what makes Hancock such a special place is that residents will work together, listening to each other, challenging each other to keep this town a special place where neighbors are truly neighbors.

The work of the town takes place because of the committed, talented people who work here. This year we welcomed Nevan Cassidy as the Fire Chief, Linda Coughlan as Welfare Officer, Joan Joseph as Deputy Tax Collector, and Lauren Cassidy and Dick Perner as dump employees.

We also celebrated Mike Sielicki receiving his Associates Degree and Kurt Grassett becoming a Master Road Scholar. Everyone who works for the town is dedicated. The Board of Selectmen thanks each one for his/her hard work to make this the town that it is. We especially thank our Administrative Assistant Barbara Caverly for her dedication, caring and sense of history which she brings to us. We promise no more moves. A heartfelt THANK YOU to each of you.

#### 2002 REPORT FROM THE HANCOCK TOWN ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Advisory Committee was called to meet by Tom Ward, Town Arbitrator, on September 18th, 2002. At that time we received the scheduled goals of the Selectboard with respect to budget submission, review, and approval.

Starting in late October the Committee began reviewing the proposed expenses of the town departments as submitted by the department heads. Subsequently we met with those departments which had significant expenses or changes from previous years. All budgets were reviewed with the underlying consideration of the necessity of the expense; the possibility of incurring it this year, or delaying it to some future date. It should be mentioned that this town is served by dedicated, conscientious individuals, whose primary interest is the welfare of the Town. The department heads' willingness to meet with the Committee and review their operations was gratifying and constructive.

On December 2nd, the Committee met with the Selectboard and presented their recommendations. It was not surprising that the Board had reached many of the same conclusions, and was, perhaps, even more stringent in their evaluations. The Advisory Committee concurs with the Budget, including Warrant Articles, submitted for consideration at The Annual Meeting.

Each department was asked to provide an estimate of long range capital requirements. If these proposals are not modified in some way, the obvious impact on the Town Tax Rate would be excessive. The Advisory Committee plans to review these costs to determine some method of leveling the expenses and will incorporate recommendations in the budget prepared for Town Meeting 2004.

- **ARTICLE 4:** Voted by a show of cards to raise and appropriate up to forty-three thousand dollars (\$43,000) to purchase and outfit a F550 Dump Truck. Article passed unanimously.
- ARTICLE 5: Voted by a BALLOT vote to adopt the provisions of RSA79-A:25a to account for 50% of the revenues, with a cap of \$3,000 per years, received from the land use change tax in a conservation fund in accordance with RSA 79-A:25, II. YES 119, NO 15.
- **ARTICLE 6:** Voted by a show of cards to raise and appropriate up to fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) to continue the dust control project started in 2000. Article passed unanimously.
- ARTICLE 7: Voted by a show of cards to raise and appropriate one thousand dollars (\$1,000) to support the Senior Nutrition Program at Sargent Center. YES 127, NO 7.
- **ARTICLE 8:** Voted by a show of cards to raise and appropriate up to three thousand dollars (\$3,000) for the purpose of repairing the bell yoke. Article passed unanimously.
- ARTICLE 9: Motion made to amend the article to authorize the Selectmen to sell the house for removal from the site, structures only, and to appropriate up to \$5,000 to complete the site work once it was removed. Vote on the wording of the amendment passed YES 107, NO- 21. Vote taken on the motion as amended passed YES 114, NO 14.
- **ARTICLE 10:** Motion made to amend article to read: To see if the Town of Hancock will raise and appropriate up to \$100,000 for the recreation field project to be offset by the proceeds of the sale of the Garland House, structures only, and from donations received for this purpose. Vote taken on the wording of the amendment passed **YES 120, NO 5.** Vote taken on the amended motion passed **YES 99, NO 13.**

- ARTICLE 11: Voted by a show of cards to raise and appropriate up to one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500) to install a dug well at Hillside Cemetery. YES 87, NO 1.
- ARTICLE 12: Voted by a show of cards to raise and appropriate up to five thousand dollars (\$5,000) for the purchase of new furniture and signs for the Town Office Building.
- **ARTICLE 13:** Voted by a show of cards to raise and appropriate up to four thousand dollars (\$4,000) for the purpose of funding a fireworks display on or about July 4, 2002. Passed with a majority.
- ARTICLE 14: Motion made to amend article by inserting the words "all other veterans" in place of the words "subsequent conflicts" failed by show of cards YES 2, NO 76. Motion to amend the article by inserting words "who were residents of Hancock at the time of service" after the words "subsequent conflicts" passed YES 77, NO 0. Vote taken on article as amended passed unanimously by a show of cards.
- ARTICLE 15: Voted by a show of cards to raise and appropriate up to two thousand seven eighty six dollars (\$2,786) for the purpose of repairs and replacement of beach and ballfield equipment. Passed unanimously.
- **ARTICLE 16:** Voted by a show of cards to raise and appropriate up to five thousand one hundred ninety eight dollars (\$5,198) for the purpose of repairs and replacement of town highway equipment. Passed unanimously.
- ARTICLE 17: Voted by a show of cards to raise and appropriate up to eight thousand two hundred eighty two dollars (\$8,282) for the purpose of repairs and replacement of police equipment. Passed unanimously.
- **ARTICLE 18:** Voted by a show of cards to raise and appropriate up to one thousand fifty five dollars (\$1,055) for the purpose of purchasing baseball equipment and doing maintenance and repairs to the ballfields. Article passed unanimously.
- **ARTICLE 19:** Voted by a show of cards to raise and appropriate up to seven thousand six hundred thirty four dollars (\$7,634) for the purpose of preservation and storage of the town's archival records.
- ARTICLE 20: Voted by a show of cards to raise and appropriate up to one hundred eighty thousand dollars (\$180,000) to replace the Tannery Hill Road Bridge. This appropriation represents 80% of the total cost and will be funded by the State. Town's share of \$45,000 approved at 2000 Town Meeting. Article passed unanimously.
- ARTICLE 21: Voted to authorize the Selectmen to accept reports of auditors and committees as printed in Town Report. Recently elected town officials sworn in.

### TRUSTEE OF TRUST FUNDS

In another year of poor overall market performance, the town trust funds have been generating substantial income for the purposes of the beneficiaries of the trusts. This year's net income return is 4.62% derived primarily from the bond portion of the portfolio.

The trust funds, designated as Common Funds (ones for which only the income may be spent) and Expendable Funds (ones for which both the income and principal may be spent) distributed a total of \$67,389 to various trust beneficiaries during the year. The accounts are invested in a mix of stocks, bonds, and money market instruments. The portfolio remained stable in this difficult year due to our asset allocation of 83% invested in bonds, money markets and cash with 17% invested in equities (stocks and mutual funds).

Looking forward, the trustees and our professional financial management team from Columbia Management, a subsidiary of Fleet Bank, will be hard pressed to find bonds with yields as high as those which are coming due in the next few years. Two strategies will be used to substitute for the tried and true high yield United States Treasury notes of past years. One is to buy the highest quality corporate bonds. As an example, one such bond currently in the portfolio is a Proctor & Gamble 6.6% bond. Another strategy is to invest in real estate investment trusts (REITs) which distribute almost all of their profits as dividends. We are currently invested in a REIT mutual fund yielding 5.87%.

It has been a pleasure working with the staff from Columbia Management, Mike Wrenn and Mark Govoni. Their professional investment management for the town is especially welcome in these difficult investing times. Thanks, also, to trustees Jack Carlson and Dick Quinn for their combined experience and talent.

### INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Members of the Board of Selectmen Town of Hancock Hancock, New Hampshire

We have audited the accompanying general purpose financial statements of the Town of Hancock, New Hampshire as of and for the year ended December 31, 2002 as listed in the table of contents. These general purpose financial statements are the responsibility of the Town's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these general purpose financial statements based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the general purpose financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

The general purpose financial statements referred to above do not include the general fixed assets account group which should be included in order to conform with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. As is the case with most municipal entities in the State of New Hampshire, the Town of Hancock has not maintained historical cost records of its fixed assets. The amount that should be recorded in the general fixed assets account group is not known.

In our opinion, except for the effect on the financial statements of the omission described in the preceding paragraph, the general purpose financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the Town of Hancock as of December 31, 2002, and the results of its operations and the cash flows of its nonexpendable trust funds for the year then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Our audit was made for the purpose of forming an opinion on the general purpose financial statements of the Town of Hancock taken as a whole. The combining and individual fund financial statements listed as schedules in the table of contents are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the general purpose financial statements of the Town of Hancock. Such information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the general purpose financial statements and, in our opinion, is fairly presented in all material respects in relation to the general purpose financial statements taken as a whole.

### INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S COMMUNICATION OF REPORTABLE CONDITIONS AND OTHER MATTERS

To the Members of the Board of Selectmen Town of Hancock Hancock, New Hampshire

In planning and performing our audit of the Town of Hancock for the year ended December 31, 2002, we considered the Town's internal control structure in order to determine the scope of our auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinion on the financial statements. Our review of these systems was not intended to provide assurance on the internal control structure and should not be relied on for that purpose.

Under the standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, reportable conditions involve matters coming to our attention relating to significant deficiencies in the design or operation of the internal control structure that, in our judgment, could adversely affect the Town's ability to record, process, summarize, and report financial data consistent with the assertions of management in the financial statements. A material weakness is a reportable condition in which the design or operation of one or more of the internal control structure elements does not reduce to a relatively low level the risk that errors or irregularities, in amounts that would be material in relation to the financial statements being audited, may occur and not be detected within a timely period by employees in the normal course of performing their assigned functions. Our consideration of the internal control structure would not necessarily disclose all matters in the internal control structure that might constitute reportable conditions and, accordingly, would not necessarily disclose all reportable conditions that are also considered to be material weaknesses as defined above.

### Trustees' of Trust Funds Responsibilities

In the course of our audit of the Trust Funds, we have not resolved the matter of balancing all the revenue and expenditure activity for the year with the annual report submitted by the bank. The amounts are not material to the financial statements, and any discrepancies will be corrected in the following year.

However, we do recommend that the Trustees of Trust Funds review the monthly reports being submitted by the bank to be assured that the activity is being recorded properly. It should not be left up to the annual independent audit to uncover any discrepancies that may occur.

During the course of our review of internal controls, no material weaknesses in the Town's accounting systems and records were identified. Minor weaknesses or other considerations coming to our attention were generally procedural in nature and dealt with administrative or recordkeeping practices. In these instances, we made specific recommendations or provided instruction to applicable individuals during the course of our audit fieldwork.

This report is intended solely for the information and use of management and others within the administration. This restriction is not intended to limit distribution of this report, which is a matter of public record.

### HANCOCK TOWN LIBRARY DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Access to knowledge is the superb, the supreme act of truly great civilizations. Of all the institutions that purport to do this, free libraries stand virtually alone in accomplishing this mission. No committee decides who may enter, no crisis of body or spirit must accompany the entrant. No tuition is charged, no oath sworn, no visa demanded. Of the monuments humans build for themselves, very few say "touch me, use me, my hush is not indifference, my space is not barrier. If I inspire awe, it is because I am in awe of you and the possibilities that dwell in you."

In the center of the town of Hancock sits a jewel of democracy. Where all are welcome to enter, ask, browse, surf (the internet), share a story, post a notice, make a copy, find a tax form, sit quietly and read, enjoy an art exhibit, absorb a speech, meet with an organization, pick up a museum pass, listen to Mrs. Claff or Mrs. Zilling read a story, create a masterpiece at craft time, and perhaps even borrow a book. It is a vibrant place, full of the smiles of dedicated volunteers and the possibilities that lie in the 19,012 books, audio books, videos and periodicals on the shelves.

The Hancock Town Library has been abuzz with activity in 2002. The First Tuesday Book Group (open to all) began in the fall, led by the very talented Ken Sheldon. They have read an eclectic mix of books by authors as diverse as Jane Austen, Graham Greene, Stephen King, and Richard Russo. The movie version of each book, on video, is also available. Multiple copies of the books and videos come from the state library's Book Bag service at no charge, just one of the services our library can access.

Another valuable service the library offers is interlibrary loan. Our motto could be, "If we don't have it, we'll find it!" 342 books on a wide variety of topics were borrowed by Hancock residents through interlibrary loan in 2002.

The new cataloging software was purchased and installed, making for more accurate and functional record keeping. Many thanks to the *Friends of the Hancock Town Library* who helped make that possible. Beautiful new cabinets and a new counter were built, again with thanks to the *Friends*, which house all our book-covering supplies. Now when you walk in to browse the biographies you don't bump into a table or boxes of books waiting to be covered. It is a wonderful addition. The *Friends* also made much appreciated purchases of books, videos, museum passes, and the open flag for the front of the building.

The *Friends*, of course, do so much than help defray expenses. Because of the *Friends*, the snow is shoveled every snowstorm, baby book bags are delivered to new parents, foreign languages are taught to preschoolers, art shows are set up every six weeks, a book sale is held every Old Home Day, a craft fair follows in the fall, speakers are induced to

hold forth, books are delivered to the homebound, refreshments are provided at special events, and the Handymen help to take care of the building. In 2002, the Handymen built storage shelves in the attic, fixed chairs in the Daniels room, and repaired bookshelves in the children's section (they also lugged a lot of books and tables for the book sale). The men and women who make up the *Friends*, (and you can be one of them in 2003!) are an invaluable asset to this library and to the community.

Linda Claff, our Children's Librarian, reads to the elementary school children every Tuesday morning, presents a preschool craft hour every Wednesday, and one warm July evening hosted a Story/Pajama Hour called "Books 'n Bears." Of course, once again Mrs. Claff put together a wonderful summer reading program for the children of Hancock. Children read all summer long and then enjoyed "Science Magic" from the Boston Museum of Science at the final event of the summer.

In September, we welcomed Holly Zilling as an additional, part-time Children's Librarian. She and Linda Claff make a great team.

It truly takes a community of talented, hard-working people to make a library run smoothly and Hancock is fortunate to have cultivated such a community. It is amazing to see 20 volunteers come in week after week, through all kinds of weather and despite all the other demands on their time, to perform the many and varied tasks that need to get done. We even had a volunteer come from as far away as Connecticut to help with our computers. Many thanks. Thanks, too, to the library staff, who so freely share their knowledge and talents with all who ask.

The Hancock Town Library's community is an especially fertile place. One never knows what a patron might be seeking: is it the name of the artist who painted "Dogs Playing Poker" (that would be Cassius Marcellus Coolidge). Is it books on how to play the piano? Books about Cost Rica/Ghana/Newfoundland? A book on potty-training? On Caravaggio? The possibilities are endless and every-changing. And, as Toni Morrison says, it is awe-inspiring. So come in. Ask, browse, surf, listen, share, meet, and borrow. We're waiting for you.

### HANCOCK TOWN LIBRARY TRUSTEES REPORT

One of the greater parts of a library director's job in a small town is to make people feel welcome when they walk in the door. We think of the director as one of the mayors of Main Street -- those few people who everyone in the village may see most days. This kind of thing does not show up in the job description, unless it is listed under that wretched phrase of the personnel office: "People skills." It's a gift, the right touch, the ability to set the tone for a small institution. Our last library director had this gift, as does our new director.

In November we were saddened by the unexpected resignation of Marsha Zaccone. Marsha left for family reasons. We did our best to convince her to stay and at last accepted her resignation with great regret. In three years as library director she proved herself an excellent librarian with a sharp eye for good books, and a consideration for the reading tastes of our patrons. She ran a good office, too, and had fresh ideas for making changes in the library. Her only failing was that her tenure was far too short, but we suspect that we would have said that if she had served 15 years.

Amy Markus stepped in as Acting Director for a month and showed us that she was a natural for the job. Many in town have known Amy over the last twenty years in numerous roles: She is the president of the Hancock PTO (her youngest son Ian is in the third grade at the Hancock school); she was one of the founding members of the Friends of the Hancock Library; and she has volunteered her fundraising skills for the Monadnock United Way, and Monadnock Music. Professionally, Amy has worked as a fund-raiser and political organizer for the National Organization for Women, and as a field organizer, development coordinator, and interim executive director for NARAL-NH.

We count ourselves fortunate to welcome her as the new library director.

### COMMON COMMISSION 2002

There was good news and bad news for the Common. The good news came in the form of a water circulating pump for the fountain. Here-to-for all the water at the fountain went down the drain, estimated at 5,000 gallons per day, and was lost from the Town's water supply. This was not without problems as the recycled water tended to become fouled with algae, and needed to be drained periodically. Part of the good news was the continued good work of gardeners Fran Hillner, Pat Fairchild and Tibby Tobey. They planted, weeded, and cared for the beautiful planting around the fountain. Thank you all!

At the other end of the village the bad news for the Common was caused by lack of rain and scorching sun, equaled by a lack of funds to get the job done right in the first place. What seeding could be done was at best far short of what would establish a strong lawn. Kurt Grassett and his highway crew made every effort to get a good grass base down, but there was no money in the budget, and when there was no rain, little could be done. In the late Summer another effort was made to seed the Common, and we will be following up with a comprehensive fertilizing program in the Spring. An in-ground irrigating system would be a great addition.

There were two other good news items. Gloria Neary donated a larger flag for the Town Flag Pole in memory of her husband Ralph. (That flag was taken down to protect it from the Winter winds, and will be flown again in the Spring). Secondly, a committee was formed to inquire if the Town would like to have a memorial to Hancock Veterans of World War II, Korea, and Viet Nam. The answer at Town Meeting was "yes", and a Committee of Ray Pierce, Howard Weston, and the undersigned proceeded to consider appropriate memorials and to raise money for the project. The outpouring of contributions has been very gratifying as well as successful. Names of veterans are being collected and verified, and a memorial service planned.

# BROUGHT TO HANCOCK FOR BURIAL

### HANCOCK HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

The Hancock Highway Department had another successful year in 2002. Some of the highlights of the year include 33 winter weather events, shimming approximately 2.25 miles of paved road, sand sealing about 2.75 miles of paved road, crack sealing about 1 mile of paved road, placing approximately 2000 yard of crush gravel on our gravel roads, and constructing the new bridge on Tannery Hill Road.

The Tannery Hill Bridge replacement was our single biggest project of the year. This project took advantage of the State of NH's Bridge Aid program. This program provided the town with reimbursement of 80% of the cost of design and construction of the replacement project. Through this program the town was allowed to get reimbursement for our wages and equipment use while working on this project. By utilizing our equipment and our labor on those portions of the project we could handle, we were able to keep the town's share of this project at the absolute minimum. The total project cost for design and construction was \$323,483.33. If we had bid this whole project out our 20% share would have been \$64,696.67. Because we opted to manage this project ourselves utilizing our people and equipment as much as possible, and contracting with local businesses and vendors where needed, we were able to provide the town with a modern day structure at a cost of \$9,103.15. The Bridge Aid program picked up the rest of the cost. I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone involved with this project, the employees at the Highway Department, the local contractors and vendors, the Board of Selectmen, and especially the residents of Tannery Hill Road who had to find alternative routes and listen to our equipment all summer long.

A recap of the rest of 2002 shows a very unusual weather pattern all year long. January saw some unusually warm temperatures but we did have 12 winter weather events. These storms were mostly light amounts of snow or snow rain events. February saw the continued warmer than normal pattern and we handled 3 winter weather events during the month. When we weren't handling storms, we spent our time cutting brush along the roadsides, placing cold patch in potholes and maintaining our equipment. In March the weather didn't want to warm up. We held onto the 30 degree temperatures for the whole month. During this month we handled 4 winter weather events, with the biggest storm of the year coming on March 20th and 21st, 10 inches of wet, heavy snow.

April began cooler then normal, although we were able to begin sweeping the paved roads and grading the gravel roads in preparation for the coming warmer weather. On April 22nd, Mother Nature gave us another inch of snow, just to let us know that winter doesn't always end when we would like it to. During the month of May we began preparations for our summer maintenance program. We began a month or so early this year so that we could spend the time needed on Tannery Hill Road. The month of May was much cooler than normal with a few periods of high winds that helped to keep us busy cutting downed trees and limbs. On May 18th we saw enough snow to completely cover the ground. The latter part of May and first part of June we finally got our spring rains. In June we shimmed Norway Hill from Wilder Road to Daniels Road, Duncan Road from Norway Hill Road to Forest Road, and South Elmwood Road from Route 202 to the gravel road. We also ditched and graveled Caverly Lane. After the rains, we re-graded all the gravel roads and worked with the Hillsborough County work crew to paint the horse sheds. The last week in June we began work on the Tannery Hill Bridge replacement.

### Highway Department Report continued

The months of July, August and September were spent working on Tannery Hill Bridge. The summer months were hot and extremely dry, the dry weather helped us on the bridge project as we didn't lose any days due to rain, working next to the water did provide some relief for the hot temperatures.. By the middle of September we had completed almost all of the work on the bridge with the exception of the guardrail. We did experience a slight delay in opening the bridge due to a delay in the delivery of the wooden guardrail. On October 4th we were able to open Tannery Hill Road to traffic.

At the end of September, we oiled all the roads we had shimmed in May. In October we began getting ready for winter by starting our fall grading, putting our plow frames on, and stocking up on sand and salt. We also fixed the front hill on Evergreen Hill, finally getting a single ditch down the east side and making the hill wide enough for two vehicles to pass safely. It was a good thing we started preparing for winter in October, we got our first snow on October 23rd, just 5 months after the last snow of the spring.

The months of November and December we spent our time plowing snow, and lots of it. We had 4 storms in November and 8 storms in December. By the start of 2003, we had snow banks 4 feet or more in height all around town. With the early snow we were not able to complete all the fall grading but we were able to complete all the main gravel roads. By the end of 2002, we had handled 33 winter storms, the largest number of storms in a one year period that I have seen in a long time. It was also the shortest time between spring and fall snow that I remember.

One of the reasons I enjoy writing this report is that it gives me time to reflect on the work that we have accomplished throughout the year. The dedication of our employees allows us to accomplish a vast amount and variety of work for the citizens of Hancock. All of us at the Highway Department appreciate the thanks and praise that citizens give us throughout the year. Hancock truly is a special place to live and work. ### HANCOCK POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Hancock Police Department this year again experienced some changes in personnel. Officer Lionel Emond had left to become a Motor Vehicle Inspector with the State of New Hampshire and to our surprise and delight, Lenny returned to the department after a couple of months. After Lenny's departure, we conducted three hiring processes to find a suitable candidate to fill our vacant part-time officers position.

The hiring process for a police officer is very lengthy and time consuming. It took months to hire the right person. That person was Christopher Lucas from Dublin, New Hampshire. Chris has his Master's Degree in Business Administration from Franklin Pierce College. He is married with two young children. At this time I would like to welcome Officer Lucas and his family to the Town of Hancock.

Again this year the Police Department and community members sponsored the Officer Phil program for the Hancock Elementary School. This program reinforces what children should do when meeting a stranger, crossing the street, riding the school bus, answering the phone, and how to respect other people's property and space. I would like to thank all of the businesses that support this effort because it works for the kids. We also conducted the Bike Safety program this year at the Monadnock Paper Mill and the event was well attended by children from Hancock. The Police Department also supported the Special Olympics this year by raising funds for the Penguin Plunge, which was conducted at Hampton Beach in February of 2002. This event alone raised almost two hundred thousand dollars for the Olympians.

This coming year the Police Department plans to continue to provide the best service we can for the Town of Hancock. We will be applying for some Highway Safety grants this year. One of the grants will be to purchase a new Automatic Traffic Counter to be used with the Highway Department. This counter will allow us to target certain roads in town to determine peak travel times for motorists that are violating motor vehicle laws, such as speeding. This device will allow us to direct our resources to these trouble areas and to determine what time frame the officer needs to be present. Along with this equipment, we will also be applying for a Directed Patrol grant. This grant will allow for up to 60 hours of additional patrol time to react to the area identified by the counter. This will better assist the town in reducing traffic accidents and complaints of speeding.

As you will see from the department's activity report, it has been a very busy year for us. This year we had several major cases that involved Teller Marketing Scams which cost some Hancock residents a lot of money. These cases went far beyond the Hancock town line. One case took us to New York State with the United States Treasury Department to arrest a Canadian who scammed one person out of \$12,000 dollars. This subject was later

convicted and ordered to pay restitution to the victim. Another case led to an arrest of a female college student in the State of Pennsylvania by the Treasury Department. This subject was arrested and charged with Fraud in connection with another Canadian Teller Marketing group. She was convicted and deported out of the Country after having to pay heavy fines to the government.

Other cases that have taken large amounts of time have been Internet Fraud cases in which the victims were Hancock residents. One of these cases let to an arrest of a male subject in Texas. One other case remains open at this time. In the coming year it is hopeful that these types of cases will not occur. In order to try to prevent these crimes, we will be attempting to provide some training to Hancock citizens with the Bureau of Consumer Affairs.

I would like to thank the members of the Fire Department, Highway Department, Town Office and the Board of Selectmen for all the support they provide the Police Department throughout the year.

In closing, I am glad to thank the members of the Hancock Police Department for all the hard work and dedication they bring to the job and to the town. Steve, Brian, Lenny and Chris, thank you for all you have done and will continue to do.

### HANCOCK FIRE DEPARTMENT

We are happy to report that in 2002, we had no serious structure fires in Hancock, and despite the dry summer, there were no brush fires in town.

Roughly half of our calls each year are rescue calls. We continue to train all members to deal with these situations. Between fund raising efforts and money available from the Helen Brown trust, we will be purchasing three compact Automatic External Defibrillators (AED's) to supplement the large unit carried on our rescue truck. These smaller AED's will be placed with department EMT's to be ready at a moments notice. Last year, we purchased a Thermal Imaging Camera, which has proven to be a very useful tool. As always the residents of Hancock have been very generous in their support of our fund raising activities.

Former Chief Lindy Joseph's work with the Bound Tree company has taken him and his family from Hancock to Ohio. Lindy still owns property in town, and says he plans to return.

Two other long time members retired in 2002 - Bud Wilder and Wayne Fisher. Bud and Wayne both served the department for over 35 years. We would like to thank these men for their countless hours of service to the town.

Steve David has taken a position with the Hookset Fire Department and therefore stepped down as a captain on the Hancock department. Dwayne Denehy has been elected to fill that position, joining Aaron Blanchette and Jon Grosjean.

The year 2002 saw a total of seven new people join the Fire Department. Thank you and welcome to: Tom Bates, Bill Eva, Tom Ball, Ellen Moran, Tom Villeneuve, Marylou Moreen and Phillip Petrov.

We have two requests of homeowners in town to help us serve you. First, make sure your driveway is kept open so that our firetrucks and ambulances can fit down easily. Secondly, please clearly mark the street number on your house or mailbox so we can find you in case of an emergency. Thank your for your cooperation.

We must recognize the help of Barbara and Linda in the Town Offices, and that of Becky Lohmiller for keeping all the paperwork up to date.

Lastly, thanks to all our firefighters who are always willing to drop whatever they are doing when their pagers beep - even on those frigid winter nights.

#### REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST RANGER

Your local Forest Fire Warden, Fire Department, and the State of New Hampshire Division of Forests and Lands cooperate and coordinate to reduce the risk of wildland fires in New Hampshire. To help us assist you, contact your local Forest Fire Warden or Fire Department to find out if a permit is required before doing <u>ALL</u> outside burning. Fire permits are mandatory for all outside burning unless the ground where the burning is to be done (and surrounding areas) is completely covered with snow. Violations of RSA 227-L:17, the fire permit law and the other burning laws of the State of New Hampshire are misdemeanors punishable by fines up to \$2,000 and/or a year in jail, plus suppression cost.

A new law effective January 1, 2003 prohibits residential trash burning (RSA 125-N). Contact New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services at (800) 498-6868 or <a href="https://www.des.state.nh.us">www.des.state.nh.us</a> for more information.

### HANCOCK WATER WORKS ANNUAL REPORT - 2002

We had another rather dry year in 2002 with precipitation below normal. In anticipation of this, the Water Department met with the Selectmen in April to draw up a water use restriction ordinance. Fortunately, some spring rains brought the Reservoir up a little and the restriction ordinance never had to be enacted.

In the spring, the Water Department replaced approximately 780 feet of 4 inch water main on Duncan Road with 6 inch ductile iron pipe, so all the water main on Duncan Road is now 6 inch.

In June, Underwater Solutions inspected and cleaned the 8 inch intake structure at Juggernaut Reservoir. Also in June, the State conducted the required sanitary survey of our system.

During the year we had, what seemed like more than normal, a number of breaks in our system. All breaks were promptly taken care of by our Highway Department.

We also upgraded our emergency plan this year as requested by the State.

There were some changes in our personnel this year. Richard Quinn retired after 18 years of dedicated service to the Water Department. Dick was instrumental in seeing a number of projects completed and was always helpful with his computer skills to which we were very grateful. Our new Commissioner, Jeffrey Wilder, took over in March. A long time resident of Hancock, Jeff has already assumed some of the department responsibilities.

This fall we received our drinking water source assessment report from the State. The report is available in our files for anyone who would like to see it.

We continue with all our required testing of the water and maintenance of the system.

We once again extend thanks to Russell Nylander, our courier to Concord, for bringing our test samples to the State Lab.

#### WELFARE OFFICER'S REPORT

In 2002, \$10,525.73.00 was expended for welfare on behalf of qualified applicants. This represents an increase over last years welfare recipients. The major categories continued to be housing, food and fuel.

Helping Hands is an important resource for anyone in the community who needs assistance, but may not qualify for welfare under the Hancock Guidelines. The fund expends monies to help Hancock residents with food, rent, fuel oil, repairs, Christmas gifts, medication, and other expenses. #### HEALTH OFFICER'S REPORT

The New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services(DES) has requested that municipalities in New Hampshire urge owners of residential wells to test the water quality of their wells. According to DES, drinking water from private wells in New Hampshire may sometimes contain contaminants, such as radon and arsenic, which can occur naturally in our state's bedrock at levels that can pose health risks. The Department further suggests that municipalities act as an intermediary between the laboratory and the private well owner by at least stocking empty sample bottles at the town hall. A water quality test, by a competent laboratory, can assure that your family is protected. Water quality testing will reduce needless health risks to residents and water quality data can help guide town planning efforts. The Town of Hancock will be stocking empty sample bottles for the convenience of private well owners.

#### HANCOCK DUMP COMMITTEE

The Hancock Dump saw an increase in the amount of recyclables and trash in 2002. Trash thrown into the compactor was up 10% over 2001, for a total of 355 tons. Recyclables accounted for 187 tons, an increase of 35% over 2001. Overall the staff at the dump handled 18% more trash and recyclables then the previous year.

Our contract with Waste Management, the company that hauls the compactor, ran out in October of 2002. We successfully renegotiated with Waste Management for an additional 5 year contract. Unfortunately the new contract came with a new price per ton, and it didn't go down. The new cost per ton is \$84.50 per ton with an additional \$90.00 per week charge, to haul the compactor away. This accounts for a substantial increase in this line item of the dump budget, but this increase is indicative of the difficulties of disposing of trash. Recycling is by far the cheapest alternative, and we encourage all residents to recycle as much of your trash as possible.

2002 was the first year that we ran our baler for the full year. After a little learning curve and some trial and error, the process of baling appears to be going fine. We have been able to substantially increase our revenues by opening up more markets for our recyclables. This year's income for recyclables was \$6,324.01, compared to income of \$1,782.75 in 2001. If recyclable prices stay level or increase, the baling equipment will have paid for itself in less than 4 years.

The Dump Committee organized a Household Hazardous Waste collection in 2002. We opted to go in with Bennington, Antrim, Francestown, and Greenfield. Thanks to Clay Sherman for volunteering to represent Hancock during the set up process. The collection day was cold and rainy, and quite miserable to be out in, but we made it and we were able to serve approximately 55 Hancock households. In 2003 we will be contracting with the City of Keene to handle our Household Hazardous Waste. The City of Keene will be holding twelve collections from mid March to the end of June at their facility, in which any resident of Hancock can participate in. Please contact any Dump Committee member, the attendants at the Dump, or call the Highway Department (525-4087) for a list of the dates and times of the collections. No pre-registration is required and the cost will be lower to the town, with no cost to the residents who utilize this collection.

2002 also saw some personnel changes at the dump. Bud Wilder retired this year; we wish Bud well in his retirement. Dick Perner was hired to fill the vacant position. Lauren Cassidy was hired to assist at the recycle counter on the weekends. We have enjoyed working with them and look forward to many more years with them on our team. This report wouldn't be complete without a big Thank You to the members of the Dump Committee and the Board of Selectmen that volunteered their time to fill the open position while we conducted the hiring process.

With the increase in households and subsequent increase in items being brought to the transfer station, the Dump Committee will be requesting money to expand the size of the recycling building. This addition will give us much needed working room, heat in the recycling building and bathroom facilities for our employees. This addition will also allow us to bring all employees under one roof and set up our facility to handle the increase in trash that we are expecting. We are requesting your support on this warrant article as this will insure that we will be able to continue to provide low cost, excellent service to the residents of Hancock.

#### **CEMETERY TRUSTEES REPORT**

The three cemeteries of Hancock continue to be well cared for thanks to the conscientious efforts of our Sexton, Kurt Grassett. It is the Sexton who handles the sales of all plots and oversees the interments. In 2002 we came in \$899.70 under budget. We also had revenues of \$3,550.00 in opening fees (interments) and \$8,550.00 in plot sales.

In last years annual report we mentioned that additional ash burial sites would become available at Norway Plains. Two hundred and sixteen plots have been laid out, and forty seven of these were sold. We are very gratified by this strong response to the availability of plots in this picturesque site.

At Hillside Cemetery a shallow well has been dug in order to provide water for those tending plantings at grave sites. In the Spring it will be graded and seeded.

A walk through Pine Ridge Cemetery revealed that some headstones have been tilted, or toppled by the weather. A further review of this is planned as soon as possible and appropriate action will be taken.

#### HANCOCK PLANNING BOARD

During the 2002 year, the Planning Board spent a substantial amount of time reviewing the Zoning, Subdivision, and Site Plan ordinances to get a better understanding of what they say, how they interact, and to identify sections which could be corrected or improved. By the end of the year we accepted the fact that we don't have the technical knowledge to do a proper revision. We do intend to seek professional advise in 2003. Some of the issues raised reflect changes in the Town, some in changes in state regulations, and some in signals from legal decisions and the legislature. Our regulations should be correct, clear, and provide a fair balance for the interests of the people that come before us.

We had hoped to bring some changes in the Zoning Ordinance to the Town in 2003, but for largely technical reasons, we will be unable to do so.

We did approve: three two lot subdivisions, held five pre-application meetings on other subdivisions which have not gone forward to date, a site plan for the Harris Center, a voluntary merger and two boundary line adjustments.

We look forward to reports from the study committees that came out of the Town Forum. Their information along with the report of last year of the Business/Industry Study Committee will be important as we prepare for a new Master Plan for the Town.

The members of the Planning Board and of all town boards deserve your thanks and support for their efforts.

#### **KEPNER RECREATION AREA 2002**

The Kepner Recreation Area Committee continued work on the project throughout the year. Additional funds were approved at the 2002 Town Meeting and the project was able to begin. The following is an overview of progress to date:

### **Field Preparation**

Tree clearing began shorting after Town Meeting and was completed in about 3-4 weeks. Beginning in April the site contractors *Landsite Corporation* followed the following field preparation process:

- Removed stumps
- Topsoil stripped and stockpiled
- New entry road into the recycling center
- Cut and filled the entire site. This provided the level surface and the removal of rocks. The removal of rocks became quite a large problem for the group. When the initial engineering of the site was done, no test pits produced any rocks. By the time this process was completed, a demolition crew needed to be hired to blast the rocks and reduce them to a smaller, more manageable size; the site contractors were then able to move and bury them. Approximately 1100 yards of rocks had to be moved. The rock removal and the dry weather were the cause of many delays.

#### **Tennis Courts**

We then worked on the site preparation for the two new tennis courts. The large amount of boulders caused a few headaches in making sure we had adequate site preparation for the installation of the courts. The base layer of pavement was finally competed toward the end of July by *The Mathewson Companies*. This pavement had to cure for a specific amount of time before *Tennis Courts of N.H.* could apply the finish coats. New fencing, tennis nets and posts were also installed. The courts officially opened on Sept. 15th.

### Parking Area

The next step was the covering of the old dump and the creation of the recreation site's parking area. The entire restricted area of the old dump was covered with a geotextile fabric; the fabric was then covered with 2 feet of clean gravel.

#### Field Area

As the parking area was taking shape, the field area of the project was also in its final steps of grading and leveling. Once the grading was completed, the topsoil was screened with approximately 6 inches being spread over the entire site. With this complete we were then able to seed the area. We hired *Winding Brook Farms of Connecticut* because of their "Roto-darian" machine, which rakes and removes stones and seeds all in one process. The one thing we did not order was an early snowfall, which prevented the opportunity to complete the seeding process. The seeding will be completed as soon as the weather allows and the fields may be ready for use by the fall of 2004.

### Remaining Projects

Although the entire site was covered with snow by November 1, the committee continued to work on completing the project by the fall of 2004. Some of the remaining projects include:

- Installation of fencing and backstops for the ball field
- Purchase bleachers and soccer goals
- Installation of an ice skating and skateboarding area
- Purchase and installation of a handicap accessible dock
- Creation of a volleyball and horseshoe area
- Landscaping of the parking area and recreation site, and
- Connecting the recreation site to the school and village area with walking paths.

#### HANCOCK AFFORDABLE HOUSING COMMITTEE

The shortage of affordable housing was identified at last June's Town Forum as a major concern for our town. This committee was approved by the Selectmen and held its first meeting on August 28th, 2002. Members include, John Jordan, Chair; Lynn Frank, Shirley Kane, Dick Gilbert, Paul Corcoran, Regina Bringolf, Mary Garland, Wayne Gordon, Kris Mathewson, Bill Bevis and Janet Young.

Information has been gathered from many sources, including the U.S. Census Data, Contoocook Housing Trust; Cheshire Housing Trust, Hancock Town web site (www.hancocknh.org), New Hampshire State Data Center (www.state.nh.us/osp/sdc/Home.html), New Hampshire Housing Finance Authority (www.nhhfa.org), NH Laws ("Revised Statutes Annotated" or "RSA's", available in the Town Office), The Mollers real estate office, New Hampshire Municipal Association, Southwest Regional Planning, Southwest Community Services, and the Lopez Island (WA) Housing Trust.

We reviewed the evidence supporting a shortage of affordable housing in Hancock: The vacancy rate for rental housing in our area is less than 2%. (This is considered in the real estate industry to be the 'turnover rate' and represents units briefly vacant between tenants, or during renovations). The least expensive house on the market was \$175,000 (as of November 2002). In the entire Conval school district, only 18 houses were on the market for less than \$200,000.

'Affordability' is defined by the New Hampshire Housing Finance Authority (NHHFA) as no more than 30% of family income going to housing (either rent, or mortgage payments, taxes and insurance). It is generally believed that many people who work in Hancock, cannot afford to live in Hancock. Median 4-person family income in Hancock is \$64,423. The 'poverty threshold' for New Hampshire families is \$17,603. 2.7% of Hancock families are below the poverty level - (13 families). Median per capita income in Hancock is \$29,445. The NH 'poverty threshold' for one person is \$8,795. 3.75% of adults in Hancock are below the poverty level (65 persons).

The NHHFA Housing Market Analysis identifies municipal regulations and the current NH tax structure as major barriers to construction, and a significant factor in the failure of the marketplace to respond to the affordable housing shortage in the state. The shortage of affordable housing affects all age groups.

To learn more about the Town's views on the problems and needs, the committee is conducting a survey of town residents, employers, and persons employed in town; results and recommendations will be reported to the Town and the Board of Selectmen, probably by mid-2003.

### Report of the Village Planning Committee For the Hancock Town Annual Report

In June 2002 the Hancock Community Forum decided that the problems and opportunities of Main Street were the top priority issues for the town. The principal recommendation of the Main Street discussion group, which was accepted by the Community Forum, was that the Town should develop an integrated plan for the Village Center (Main St. to the Common) to be phased in over time that includes aesthetics, historic integrity and safety.

In August 2002 a Village Planning Committee was formed and designated as an official town committee by the Board of Selectmen. The Committee has held monthly meetings to gather information, clarify issues identified by the Community Forum, and to identify sources of technical and financial support. The Committee met with town officials, the New Hampshire Dept. of Transportation (NHDOT), Underwood Engineering and interested town residents. The Committee adopted the following mission statement.

To maintain and preserve the beauty and historic integrity of Hancock village while adjusting to the pressures created by modern society. While some change is inevitable, it is our goal to proceed with caution and to be absolutely sure that the improvements that we recommend are appropriate, essential and will enhance the character, safety and visual appearance of Hancock.

At one of its first meetings the Village Planning Committee decided to broaden the area under study from strictly Main St. to Main St. and adjacent areas of the Village. This change was due to the realization that some problems, such as excessive traffic speed, affected a larger area than Main St.

The information that was presented by the New Hampshire Dept. of Transportation and Underwood Engineering was very helpful. NHDOT explained how they could help the town, the state resources that are available, their concerns with respect to road improvement projects, and areas where Hancock would have discretion. The current philosophy of the Department is to be flexible and allow towns to create solutions that meet local needs. Underwood Engineering gave details of their role in several similar projects (primarily Greenfield). It was useful to see how a firm with expertise in project management and state and federal funding was able to help implement a project with several disparate elements. In addition to these meetings the Committee compiled a great deal of other information.

In January subcommittees were formed that mirrored the goals established by the Hancock Community Forum. The subcommittees are:

- □ Traffic and Safety on Main Street
  - o Pedestrian Safety

- o Vehicle Speed
- o Parking in the Downtown
- o Erosion of the Sides of the Road

### □ Improving the Common

- o Landscaping
- o Parking at the Common
- o Roadway Design (roads that cut through the Common)

### Visual Appearance

- o Underground Utilities (Common & Main St.)
- o Signage
- o Lighting
- o Drainage

While the Village Planning Committee has discussed a great many issues, the Committee is in agreement that the most pressing need is to prepare a concept plan for Main Street and the Common. The plan would cover the Common and Main St., be prepared with the participation of Hancock's residents, examine alternative ways to deal with problems, and be sufficiently detailed to allow people to see the changes that are envisioned for the Village. The Village Planning Committee intends to apply to Plan New Hampshire for assistance with a concept plan.

The Planning Commission, with a service area covering 36 municipalities in Cheshire, Hillsborough and Sullivan Counties, is one of New Hampshire's nine regional planning agencies established by the State Legislature and the Region's towns. We continue to provide planning-related assistance to member communities and to represent the Southwest Region in state and federal programs. Our diverse work program covers activities including local planning assistance, natural resources planning, regional information systems & mapping, transportation planning, community & economic development, and hazard mitigation planning. We are funded through multiple sources including local membership dues. For each dollar in local dues, we've succeeded in leveraging six additional dollars to assist in meeting the needs of the Region and its municipal members.
