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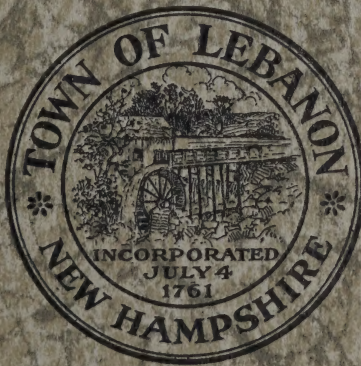

## WARRANT FOR ANNUAL TOWN MEETING

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### The State of New Hampshire

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(L. S.) To the inhabitants of the Town of Lebanon qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said town on the second Tuesday of March next at nine o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

**First**—To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

**Second**—To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the construction and repair of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

**Third**—To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the construction and repairs of sewers and sidewalks for the ensuing year.

**Fourth**—To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise for the improvement of the cemeteries of the town.

**Fifth**—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the proper observance of Memorial Day.

**Sixth**—To see what sums of money the town will vote to raise to provide a free bed at the Mary Hitchcock hospital, or act thereon.

**Seventh**—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to assist in the work of the Visiting Nurse Association.

**Eighth**—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of the West Lebanon Library.

**Ninth**—To see if the town will vote to raise (\$200.00) two hundred dollars for books for the West Lebanon Library, or act thereon.

**Tenth**—To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the benefit of the Lebanon Public Library.

**Eleventh**—To see if the town will appropriate the sum of four hundred dollars to control the White Pine Blister Rust, or act thereon.

**Twelfth**—To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to hire money in anticipation of taxes.

**Thirteenth**—To see if the town will vote to allow a discount on taxes, if paid before specified dates.

**Fourteenth**—To see if the town will continue the inspection of milk and raise money therefor.

**Fifteenth**—To see if the town will vote to give prescription permits from May first 1931, to May first 1932, according to Section 99, Laws of 1919, to druggists who are registered Pharmacists doing business in Lebanon, to sell liquors for medicinal, sacramental, scientific or mechanical purposes.

**Sixteenth**—To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of fifty dollars for the benefit of a playground at West Lebanon, or act thereon.

**Seventeenth**—To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred dollars to hire Rogers & Whitney Park for a playground, or act thereon.

**Eighteenth**—To see if the town will vote to employ a firm of certified public accountants to audit the accounts of the town, for the year 1931.

**Nineteenth**—To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$1500 for State Aid Maintenance and to receive a like amount from the state, or act thereon.

**Twentieth**—To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$4,618.50 for State Aid Construction and



to receive \$3,463.50 from the state, or act thereon.

**Twenty-first**—To see if the town will vote to raise the sum of \$10,500 for Trunk Line Maintenance and to receive a like amount from the state, or act thereon.

**Twenty-second**—To see if the town will vote to extend the concrete road from the foot of Light Street to Jones Crossing, so-called, connecting both cement roads together, and to raise money therefor.

**Twenty-third**—To see if the town will vote to raise \$3,000 to tar and gravel Church Street, or act thereon.

**Twenty-fourth**—To see if the town will vote to open that section of Young Street, lying between Eldridge and Wheatley Streets, for public travel, or act thereon.

**Twenty-fifth**—To see if the town will vote to provide a public sewer on Mill Street or act thereon.

**Twenty-sixth**—To see if the town will vote to extend the sewer from the main line, near Gove Garage, at Riverdale, running southerly along Cooper Street about 150 feet to a point opposite the residence of Robert Orr, and build a catch basin to drain said Cooper Street and appropriate \$200.00 for costs of same, or act thereon.

**Twenty-seventh**—To see if the town will vote to provide a sidewalk on Prospect Street from the southwest corner of the property of Mrs. Fred H. Brown where the sidewalk now leaves off up to the northwest corner of the property of F. J. Roderer at 40 Prospect Street and to raise the necessary money for this purpose.

**Twenty-Eighth**—To see if the town will vote to construct a concrete sidewalk on the south side of Valley Street from Church Street to Pine Street and on the west side of Pine Street to some suitable point at the foot of the hill, and raise money therefor.

**Twenty-Ninth**—To see if the town will vote to provide a polling place in West Lebanon and what sum of money the town will vote to establish and maintain same.

**Thirtieth**—To see if the town will vote to direct the Selectmen to appoint a zoning commission for the purpose provided in Section 52, Chapter 42, of the Public Laws of New Hampshire.

**Thirty-first**—To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

**Thirty-second**—To choose one Selectman for the ensuing three years, Overseer of the Poor, Collector of Taxes, Highway Agent, and all other necessary officers for the ensuing year.

**Thirty-third**—To choose a Trustee to administer the Trust Funds of the town for three years.

**Thirty-fourth**—To transact any other business that may properly come before the meeting.

## Comments

### Receipts:

In verifying the receipts listed above we first tried to determine the amount of money that should have been received and then compared this with the entries made in the books of the Town Treasurer and Selectmen.

For example, the amount turned in from tax collections was verified by a detailed analysis of the Tax Collector's record of collections, taking into account the date of all collections and the consequent discounts which should have been allowed. Similarly, funds received from the State and County were verified by direct correspondence with the State Treasurer and County Commissioner, and receipts from other departments, such as those of the Town Clerk and the Municipal Court, were verified by means of an audit of the records of each department.

### Disbursements:

We satisfied ourselves that all disbursements were supported by proper vouchers in the form of cancelled checks and purchase invoices. We also assured ourselves that all disbursements had been properly distributed in the books and records.

This amount was verified by determining the amount of bonds which had fallen due and had been paid since the date of issue.

Cash on hand was verified by physical count. Cash in banks was verified by means of a reconciliation of the book balance with the balance reported by the bank's monthly statements, in which consideration was given to all outstanding items.

## HEALTH OFFICER'S REPORT

Lebanon continues to be one of the healthiest towns in the state. During the spring and summer, there were no contagious cases reported. The records from April second, (the date of my appointment) show there have been 4 cases of Scarlet Fever, 3 Diphtheria, 5 Chicken Pox, 3 Whooping Cough and 2 of Typhoid Fever. These cases, except the Typhoid, have been very mild. Just at present there is quite an epidemic of Mumps among school children.

Every complaint has been attended to, and we hope, some conditions have been improved.

## SEWER CONSTRUCTION

### Lebanon

#### Dartmouth College Road

252.5 feet of 15 inch pipe; 147.5 feet of 12 inch pipe; two manholes, and one lamphole. Excavation, some of it good, some large sized cobble stones and some a very bad variety of quick sand. I take the following from "Sewerage" by Flowell, 1929 edition, page 198—"Hard pan may cost double the figures; quick sand, two to ten times as much."

39.5 feet of 10 inch pipe.

#### Colburn Street

About 200 feet of ditch was opened and one manhole was built. I have had charge of excavations in most of the streets of Lebanon and I found this excavation the hardest or one of the hardest. It was apparently at one time the bed of a brook. The line of the ditch was almost completely covered with granite boulders; from small ones to those that weighed a number of tons and in addition to this after a shower there was water in the ditch requiring the use of a pump.

One catch basin built.

**SIDEWALK CONSTRUCTION**

New Tar Concrete Walks: A section of Elm street, Lebanon; a section of Church street, Lebanon.

Walks raised to be in line with the cement roads: Mascoma street from West Park street to Parker's Block; from railroad crossing to Mill street (a part of the way with curbing) and from the Split Ball Bearing Shop to railroad crossing (most of the way with curbing).

West Lebanon: Sections of North Main street from Bridge street to Dr. Wilson's. Part tar concrete and part cement.

Foundations for Walks: Lebanon: Pleasant street, Worthen street and a section of Colburn street.

West Lebanon: A section of North Main street. We covered 2,879 square yards of sidewalk.

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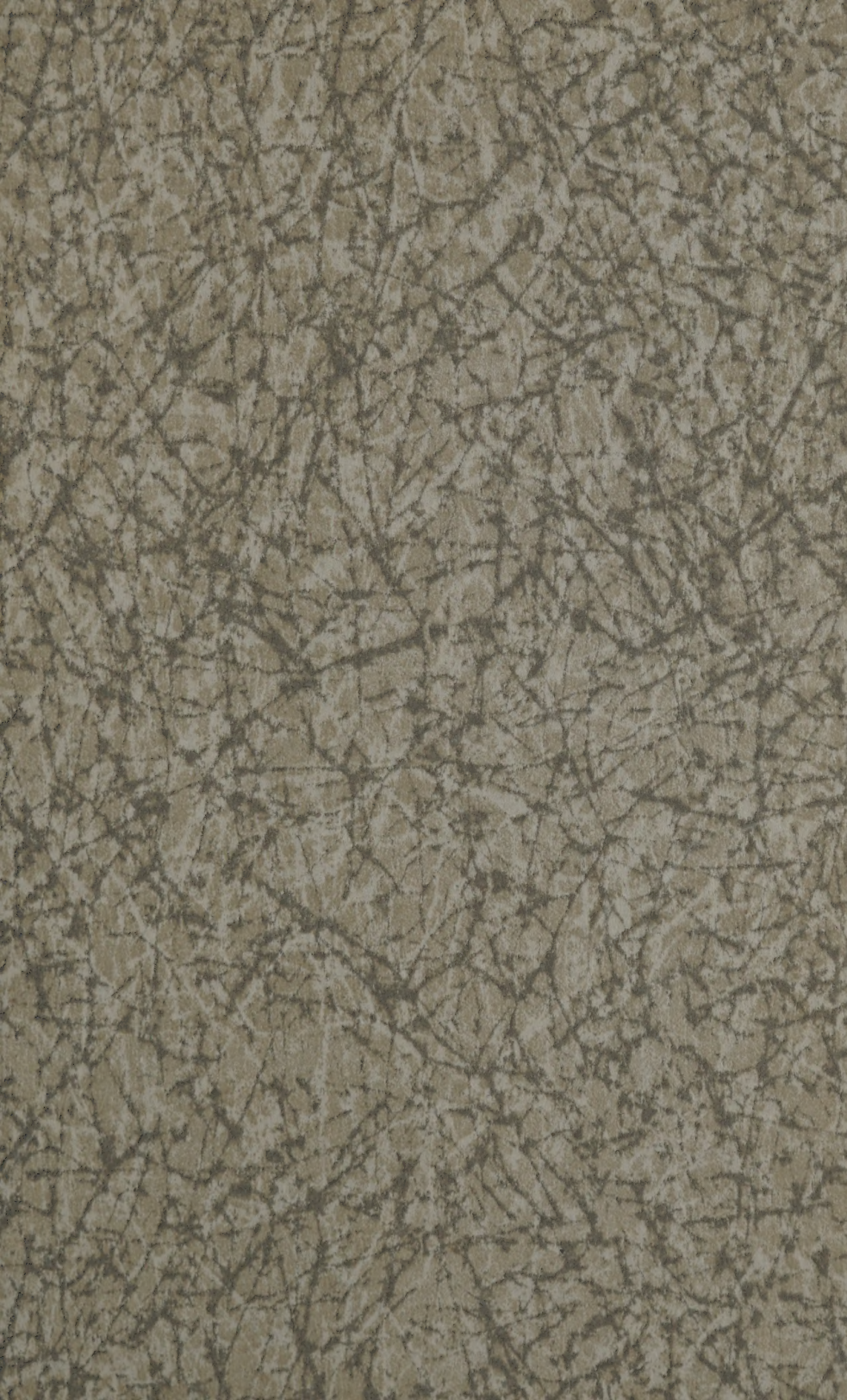
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
