## REPORT OF THE SELECTMEN

We hereby submit our annual report to the citizens of the Town of Lisbon:

This has been a trying year. We had three major rain storms that did considerable damage to our highway system. Basically the roads are back to normal with the use of a considerable amount of gravel. This has added to our normal operating budget.

The new bridge at Barrett's Crossing, North Lisbon, is completed and has been accepted as such by the Town from the State.

Chevron Park was completed this spring with the planting of shrubs and trees.

Updating deteriorated sidewalks has continued with paving of School Street from the bridge to the foot of School Hill and the portion of sidewalk in front of Indian Head Bank to the Lisbon Laundry.

The rebuilt portion of Pearl Lake Road, known as Savageville Hill, was oiled and resurfaced along with an additional two and one-half miles of oiling to the Sugar Hill town line. Walker Hill Road has been rebuilt to TRA specifications with the oil and mix applied and the sealing to be completed during the summer of 1982. This section is approximately one and one-fourth miles to the Littleton town line.

The Elderly Housing project at the former Warren Inn on Main Street has been completed and all the units are occupied. We feel this is an asset to the Town.

A considerable loss of Federal and State funds is creating a major problem in holding the tax rate at a favorable level.

We want to thank you all for the cooperation received during the year.

**TOWN OF LISBON**  
**TOWN MEETING WARRANT**

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lisbon, in the County of Grafton, and the State of New Hampshire qualified to vote in Town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Lisbon Town Hall in said Lisbon on Tuesday the ninth day of March next at ten o'clock in the forenoon; at which time polls shall open and not close earlier than nine o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects except 1 & 2 to be considered at seven-thirty o'clock in the afternoon.

**ARTICLE 1.** To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

**ARTICLE 2.** To hear reports of agents, auditors, and special committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

**ARTICLE 3.** To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes for the current year.

**ARTICLE 4.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate twenty-six thousand five hundred twenty-nine dollars and fifty-nine cents (\$26,529.59) for Town Road Maintenance and authorize the withdrawal of the amount required for this purpose from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund. (\$25,535.00 Revenue Sharing and \$994.59 Interest.)

**ARTICLE 5.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges and make appropriations for the same as set forth in the following budget:

**ARTICLE 6.** To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell and convey property acquired by Tax Collectors' Deeds in accordance with New Hampshire law.

**ARTICLE 7.** To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for and receive Federal Disaster Assistance Funds through the State Disaster Coordinating Office and to expend the funds so received to repair the damage to Town Roads and/or bridges caused by any declared emergency and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums as may be necessary to defray the cost of repairing damage in anticipation of Federal Disaster Funds to be received through the State Disaster Coordinating Office.

**ARTICLE 8.** To see if the Town will vote to establish a Conservation Commission under the provisions of R.S.A. 36-A as amended, and that the Selectmen shall appoint a commission of 5 members within 30 days of said meeting and they shall appoint a temporary chairman for the purpose of calling the first commission meeting.

**ARTICLE 9.** To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,275.50 to provide for an annual contract with Ross Ambulance service to make available 24 hour emergency ambulance service to the Town of Lisbon. Said money to be taken from surplus funds.

**ARTICLE 10.** To see if the Town will vote to elect the Planning Board in accord with R.S.A. 36:4 in 1983. (5 member Board - 2 for 1 year., 1 for 2 years, 1 for 3 years, then 3 year term's.) (This article is by petition.)

**ARTICLE 11.** To see if the Town will vote to elect the road agent by Ballot. This vote to take effect at the annual Town Meeting in March 1983. (This article is by petition.)

**ARTICLE 12.** To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply for, accept and expend money from the State, Federal or other governmental unit or a private source which becomes available during the year in accordance with the procedures set forth in R.S.A. 31:95-b.

**ARTICLE 13.** To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## **LISBON LIFE SQUAD**

### **1981 Annual Report**

The Life Squad responded to 64 calls for assistance during 1981. Again, the leading problem was heart related. The Jaws of Life were requested on 5 occasions resulting in 3 live rescues from auto accidents. The Squad sponsored a Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) course resulting in 15 new CPR qualified people in our community.

During the last several years our membership has decreased. In order to continue to provide quality service we have three current members upgrading skills and four new members in training. These seven people are enrolled in a 110 hour Emergency Medical Technician course. Three other members have recently completed a refresher course. A substantial amount of time and money is devoted to obtaining the skills necessary to provide a quality level of emergency care.

## LISBON FIRE DEPARTMENT 1981

In 1981, your fire department had another very active year answering 86 emergency calls for assistance. In addition to their firefighting duties, firefighters donated many additional hours for training, maintenance of equipment, and the continuing construction of the fire station meeting room area.

The department responded to four major "structure fires," three of which were extinguished in time to avoid major destruction of property valued at \$66,600. These saves can be credited to quick and efficient response by Lisbon's firefighters as well as the support and assistance received from neighboring towns which responded as members of the Twin State Fire Mutual Aid System. We would not be able to boast of such a record if we didn't have outside help available to us.

All department members attended at least one State-approved training school in 1980 and six drills of Lisbon's held throughout the year. Continuing training for our department makes us one of the best in the North Country.

Six new firefighters are now in training to become regular members of the department. We suffered the loss of a good fireman, who had given 15 years of dedicated service; as many of you know, Glenn Guyette moved to Lebanon in December.

The department continues its search for an aerial ladder truck suitable to the needs of our town. This equipment is necessary to provide for the protection of some of our larger buildings, and is also required by the State Board of Underwriters.

The fire department made seven rescue calls with the Hurst Tool, or "Jaws of Life" in 1981. We also made six calls to transport Twin State air tanks to fires in other mutual aid towns. Both of these services are provided by volunteers at NO COST to the Town of Lisbon.

Once again the Lisbon Fire Department **must** re-emphasize the extreme caution that citizens must take when they burn wood for home-heating purposes. In 1981 we responded to 17 chimney fires, and several other wood-related problems, many of which could have turned into major fires. Carelessness with fire can be tragic, and we recommend the proper installation of wood-heating units and urge the use of smoke detectors and fire extinguishers to protect you and your family.

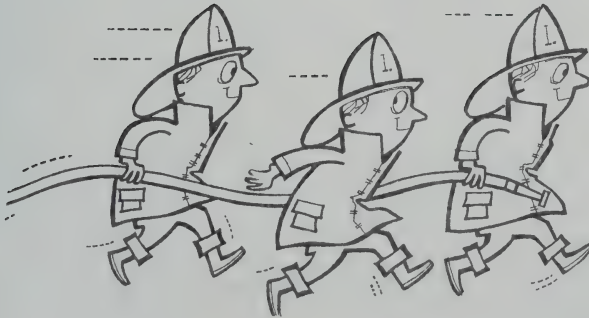

## LISBON PLANNING BOARD AND BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

In 1981, there were no requests for subdivision. The Board of Adjustment heard five requests for special exceptions and three for variances. Abutters requesting a re-hearing resulted, on advice of town counsel, in withdrawing one variance approval and giving the owner of the property the opportunity to request a new hearing when additional information is available. Three special exceptions allow for industrial expansions, two were for excavation permits. Land has already been restored in one excavation and bond posted for the other. Variances were for smaller than required lot sizes.

The Soils Survey is completed and partially delivered to the town. The remainder should arrive soon. The Board will have some training in the use of this new information through a course offered by U.N.H. School of Continuing Studies.

The public opinion survey done last year will be reviewed and printed by North Country Council. The results show the public is well aware of the need to develop and shape the future of our community with concern for the soils, terrain, and natural resources along with a need for adequate funding and desire to solve our problems.

A study of the Ammonoosuc River flood plain in Lisbon from Salmon Hole down through the business district is being made with the co-operation of the U. S. Soils Conservation Service, the Water Resources Co-ordinator from Durham, the Selectmen, the Planning Board, and those citizens willing to help. It may be impossible to prevent flooding, but we hope to find some means of minimizing the ice and water damage.

Planning Board meetings are the fourth Tuesday of each month, except when held in conjunction with public hearings, which are posted in the newspaper. The Board of Adjustment meets at the call of the chairman at least twice a year and whenever necessary for public hearings. All meetings are open to the public and all records available for public inspection.

Planning Board funds are used for the Town Plan, office supplies, current operating expenses, and such other expenditures as approved by the Selectmen.

## NORTH COUNTRY COUNCIL REPORT

North Country Council provided information and assistance to the Planning Board on a variety of planning questions. The Council also assisted with the water system and the plans for the Chevron Park.

The past year was a busy one for the Council in terms of providing a variety of information and technical assistance to the towns in our region. For nine months, the Council had an active Business Development Program with a staff member contacting industries in southern New Hampshire and northeastern Massachusetts to discuss the characteristics and advantages of the region's growth centers and labor force. As a result, several companies expressed serious interest in locating their industries in the North Country. The Council was also very active in other aspects of economic development including initiation of an industrial park study in Lancaster and providing assistance to the Littleton Industrial Development Corporation in expanding their Park. An application was prepared and submitted to the Economic Development Administration for a \$600,000 Revolving Loan Fund to help finance the location of industries in growth center communities.

The mainstay of our assistance to towns has been community planning. The Council staff met throughout the year with planning boards, boards of adjustment, and master plan committees to discuss solutions to local community issues - such as zoning, subdivision review, sign, parking and mobile home regulations, recreation, and more. The Council organized a seminar for Coos County towns on the subdivision review process in April. After the amendment of the subdivision law during the recent legislature session, we sponsored three subregional seminars on the new procedure for subdivision review. Fact sheets on both the new mobile home law and the new subdivision law were prepared and sent to the planning boards and selectmen.

In the area of solid waste, the Council continues to provide assistance to numerous communities by helping them find cost-effective solutions to the solid waste problem, such as sanitary landfill, incineration, and resource recovery. The Council has also worked with legislators to draft appropriate amendments to the recently-passed solid waste law. In the area of transportation, the Council has continued to encourage the state to improve regional highways. The Council has worked in support of commuter air service to both the Berlin Airport and the Whitefield Regional Airport. The Council worked with the Railroad Division of the DPW&H to encourage the retention and improvement of rail service on the state-owned lines in our region and also to improve other important lines such as the Conway Branch line.

In the area of community development, the Council prepared four applications for community development assistance in 1981 with one, the development of a water supply for Whitefield, receiving full funding from HUD. The Council has been keeping up on the proposed regulations to the Small Cities Community Development Program so that communities in the North Country may benefit from the grant monies as they become available through this program.

In the area of housing the Council has initiated a survey to determine the potential for rehabilitation of existing units in towns as an alternative to the traditional approach of building new housing units. There appears to be general support from the area selectmen for this type of moderately-priced housing project. Energy continues to be a very important project of the Council with NCC acting as a coordinator and clearinghouse for energy conservation and planning information.

During this past session, State Legislators requested our comments on certain bills such as the proposed enterprise zone and the amendments to the Industrial Development Authority legislation. NCC continues to be active in such groups as the National Association of Regional Councils, the NH Environmental Law Clinic, and New Hampshire Regional Planning Commissions, in order to bring valuable information and services to our communities.



The Council is a very cost-effective local organization, as was shown by a recent survey which showed that for every dollar that was appropriated by towns in 1980, almost six dollars in services were provided by the Council. As in the past, the Council's major emphasis will continue to be technical assistance and information on municipal planning and development for local governments, especially selectmen, planning boards, and other related groups. The Council staff is always available to meet with local officials to discuss projects and needs of the towns and ways in which NCC can provide assistance.

## GRAFTON COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

In our continued effort to communicate more directly with the taxpaying citizens of Grafton County, we are taking this opportunity to reach you through your annual town/city report.

We are pleased to report that, due to the unusually high interest rates during our 1981 fiscal year, Grafton County had a very good investment year, realizing \$71,375 in interest earned, which contributed to the \$257,458 surplus, most of which was applied to the fiscal year 1982 budget to reduce tax requirements. Budget appropriations for the current fiscal year beginning July 1, 1981 are about on target. However, we may be looking to a deficit at fiscal year end and we definitely anticipate a sizeable budget increase next fiscal year due to shifts in programs and financial responsibilities without accompanying federal/state funding to administer these programs, many of which are mandatory, not optional. Impact is already being felt by towns as well as counties in the educational, child protection/placement, and medicaid programs. In line with state and local "belt tightening", the County Commissioners will be taking a hard look at budget requests this next fiscal year. Priorities must be established to "hold the line" in future budget appropriations.

The computerized bookkeeping system is working out well, proving to be an asset in controlling appropriations and allowing on-demand reports showing the County's financial position at any given time.

Grafton County Commissioners, along with the maintenance supervisors and Nursing Home administration, continue to work closely with Dynamic Integrations in effecting energy conservation measures, both for the Courthouse and Nursing Home Complex. Many dollars have been and will continue to be saved through these efforts.

Superior Court has requested finishing the second courtroom in the very near future as there is a greater demand for jury hearings and use of two courtrooms at the same time. The Commissioners have engaged Wright-Pierce architectural firm to submit proposals for finishing the second courtroom, with the intent of having funds included in the next fiscal year's budget to carry out the project.

Again this year the farm has been productive. Cattle sales grossed an all time high of \$35,235. While cattle sales have been very successful, our herd has remained consistently highly rated in the Dairy Herd Improvement Association reports. Cattle were entered into eight various sales in three different states. The total herd, including milkers, heifers and calves, numbers about 187. The swine program has also had a most fruitful year, with a combination of production and sales. As in the years past, we maintain a waiting list for piglets. There have been quite a few field trips through the facility by the local school districts and Future Farmers Association, utilizing our farm for their educational programs. The Nursing Home purchased \$32,402 of food and produce from the farm, which was advantageous to our residents by having fresh produce in season and frozen produce during the winter months, not to mention the cost saving factor.

Grafton County had the highest census ever this past year in the Jail and House of Correction, resulting in an increase in management problems such as overcrowding, staff stress, and much higher than anticipated inmate medical costs. Inappropriate admissions to county jails of mentally disturbed inmates has created a great portion of inmate behavior problems within the facility.

The Commissioners hold their regular meeting every Monday, except holidays, at 9:30 a.m. in the Commissioners' Office of the Grafton County Courthouse, followed by a second meeting at the Grafton Country Nursing Home Complex at 1:00 p.m., which regularly includes visits to farm and jail facilities. Public and press are welcome, and, in fact, are encouraged to attend the meetings.
