- 4th. To choose all other necessary Town Officers.
- 5th. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary,

- g For maintenance of Cemeteries. 3<sup>00</sup>
- h For maintenance of street lights. 2150<sup>00</sup>

- j For maintenance and building of sidewalks. 1000<sup>00</sup> *built by spring*
- k For removal of snow from highways and sidewalks. 700<sup>00</sup>
- l For State Highway construction. *passed over*

  - x For maintenance of public band concerts. *500<sup>00</sup>*
- 6th. To see if the Town will vote to grant to the Woman's Study Club, American Legion, Public Schools (under proper supervision) and other organizations for public purposes, the free use of the Town Hall, or by the payment of actual expense of heating, lighting and janitor service. *yes*
  - 7th. To see is the Town will vote to abate the local taxes of any new industry put in operation in Whitefield for the term of five years. *yes*
  - 8th. To see what action the Town will take with reference to the lease of the tannery property by the Hampshire Tanning Company, and to take any action thought necessary with reference to the same. *yes*
  - 9th. To see if the Town will vote to sell the Cemetery purchased last year and purchase another one elsewhere. *yes*
  - 10th. To see if the Town will vote to give prescription permits to the local druggists to sell spirituous liquor for medicinal, mechanical and sacramental purposes under the provisions of our Public Laws.
  - 11th. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before the meeting.
