

# Warrant for the Annual Town Meeting, March 14, 1922

### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Brookfield in the (L.S) County of Carroll, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby, notified to meet at The Town Hall in said Brookfield, on Tuesday, the Fourteenth (14) day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.
- 3. To see what the Town will vote to pay for labor on the Highway.
- 4. To see what the Town will vote to raise for the extermination of the pine blister rust and gypsy moth.
- 5. To see if the Town will vote to accept State aid for highways, and appropriate money for same.
- 6. To see if the Town will vote to accept State aid to build a new bridge, the State 50 per and the Town 50 per.
- 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100) to remove stone wall to stop snow from drifting.

- 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100) for Tumble Down Dick road and one hundred dollars (\$100) for Tibbetts Hill, the state to raise the same.
- 9. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

# Superintendent's Report

TO THE SCHOOL BOARD OF BROOKFIELD:

GENTLEMEN:- I herewith submit my third annual report as superintendent of the schools of Brookfield.

The following table of statistics should be of special interest.

From this table it will be seen that the schools have a better record than for the preceding year. The per cent of attendance rose from 89 to 94.6. This is especially gratifying, and the record for this year is excellent.

The number of tardinesses, while less than one year ago, still seems to me to be too large. I again urge the cooperation of parents in overcoming this defect. Let us try to reduce the number of tardinesses still lower this year.

All the schools were in session for a full legal year of 36 weeks. The lengthened year caused no hardship to anyone, and I believe that all parents of pupils are pleased with the results,

During the past summer some additional repairs have been made upon all the school-houses. The interior of the Churchill School has been painted and new curtains put up. The Hackett School has been re-shingled. The Stoneham School has been furnished with a new stove.

A small appropriation for repairs, which will not burcen the tax payers, made each year by the District, will enable us to continue with needed improvements. I do not recommend extravagences in any direction, but a policy of moderate and steady progress.

I wish to thank the School Board and citizens for the support which they have given to the movement to secure better and more sanitary buildings. Thereby the teachers and the pupils have been made more comfortable and happy, and the efficiency of the schools has been accordingly increased.

We are fortunate in being able to retain the services of Mrs. Willey in the Churchill School for another year. We were obliged to find new teachers for both the Hackett and Stoneham Schools. Miss Dorothea Brummitt is now teaching in the former school and Miss Gladys Laskey, in the latter. Both are doing good work.

With this report I am sending the report of the School Nurse. A comparison of her report with that of a year ago shows an improvement in the physical condition of the pupils. While some pupils are still found with defective eyes, teeth and throats; the number is smaller than last year. It will also be seen that in several instances action has been taken by parents to have these defects corrected.

Our arrangement by which we have had the services of the Red Cross nurse seems to be an excellent one, and the best means of carrying on our health work in our schools. I trust that the present arrangement can be continued.

Health literature and tooth paste have been given to the children through the courtesy of the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company. An emergency box has been placed in each school, A number of health talks have been given.
