

REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.

The number of scholars attending school as shown by the registers is 75, all of whom are between the ages of six and sixteen. Of this number 32 are boys, and 43, girls.

Three schools were maintained during the spring and winter terms, and four during the fall.

The village schools retained the same teachers through the year; Miss Mason completed her fifty-second term's work in the primary school.

In the west part, Miss Grace Webster taught during the spring, and Miss Kathryn Woods during the fall and winter. This was Miss Woods first experience in teaching. She has the qualifications of a good instructor and the scholars made good progress.

A school of fourteen weeks' length was maintained in the south part during the fall, and was taught by Miss May Capes. This was her first attempt at teaching and she did very good work.
