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The school board are required, P. S., C. 92, §1, ¶260:  
 “The school board of every district shall provide schools at such places within the district, and at such times in each year, as will best subserve the interests of education, and will give *to all the scholars of the district as nearly equal advantages as*

may be practicable. They may use a portion of the school money, not exceeding twenty-five per cent., for the purpose of conveying scholars to and from the schools."

In District No. 5 there were reported 122 scholars, we therefore placed the primary scholars in the lower room of the school house, and opened an intermediate school, seating the scholars in the room with the grammar scholars, using the entry as their recitation room. The school was held two terms. Expecting bad travelling and cold weather would lessen the attendance, and there being no facilities for heating the entry, for the winter term the scholars were divided between the teachers of the grammar and primary schools.

An article has been inserted in the warrant for the school meeting to consider the question of building a school house for the primary scholars, near the center of the population in District No. 5.

In order to keep the title to the school house in District No. 1, the building was repaired, and a school kept for seven weeks. The rest of the school year, tuition was paid in the schools of Hampton Falls and South Hampton.

Two truant officers were appointed, and absentees were looked up, causing increased interest in attendance.

As the Literary fund is apportioned according to the number of scholars between 5 and 15 that have attended school two weeks, the expense incurred will be more than made up. Excellent progress has been made, the record and examinations showing a steady advance. The average attendance has been high and the Roll of Honor large, a good index of the enthusiasm of the scholars. Department and scholarship cards were introduced the winter term. These will enable the parents to know the weekly rank of the scholars.

In the grammar schools supplementary reading has been introduced for those who have completed the books pre-

scribed. Advanced studies have been introduced for those who would otherwise have to seek such elsewhere. On an average a half hour each day has been devoted to penmanship, the work accomplished deserving especial commendation.

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
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


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
