GOVERNOR HASSAN REMAINS POPULAR; GRANITE STATERS SUPPORT 30 DAY RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT FOR VOTING

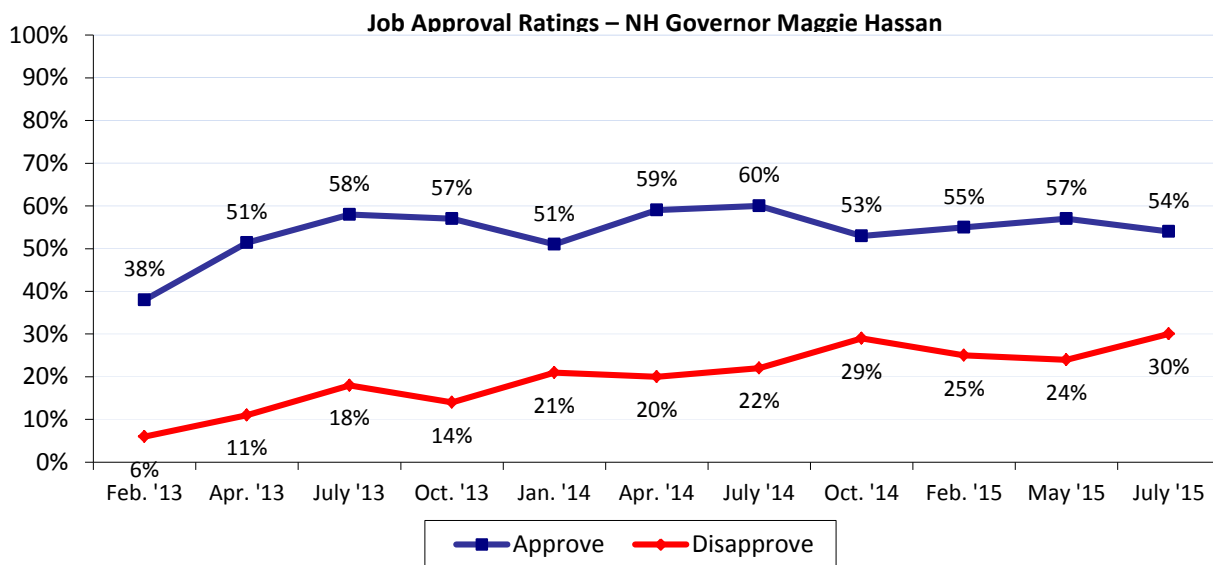

DURHAM, NH – Governor Maggie Hassan continues to be popular in the state and is strongly positioned for reelection, should she decline to run for the US Senate. A majority of New Hampshire residents approve of a bill to establish a 30 day residency requirement in order to vote in a state election.

These findings are based on the latest **WMUR Granite State Poll**,* conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and thirty-two (532) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by landline and cellular telephone between July 7 and July 20, 2015. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.2 percent. Included were four hundred seventy-two (472) likely 2016 general election voters (MSE = +/- 4.5%).

Gubernatorial Approval

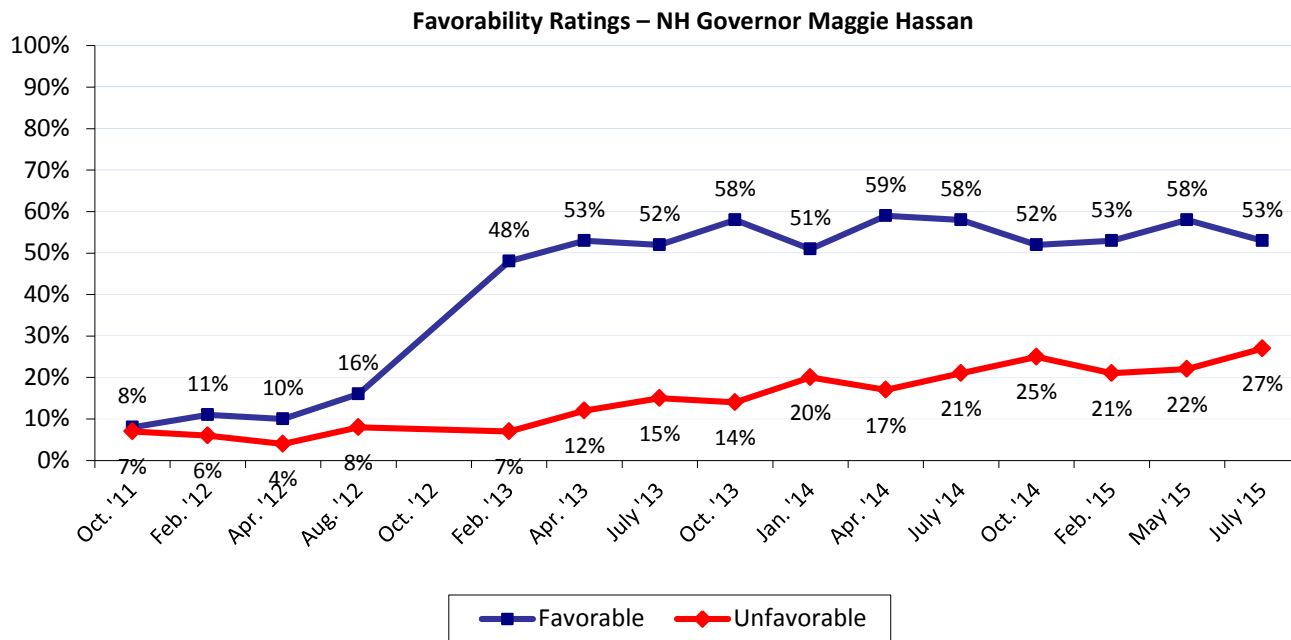
Democratic Governor Maggie Hassan continues to have the approval of a majority of New Hampshire adults. In the most recent Granite State Poll, 54% of Granite Staters say they approve of the job Hassan is doing as governor, 30% disapprove, and 15% are neutral or don't know enough to say. Hassan's job approval rating has been over 50% since early in her first term as governor but her disapproval rating has reached 30% for the first time. Democrats (80% approve, 9% disapprove) and Independents (56% approve, 23% disapprove) approve of Hassan's job performance, while Republicans disapprove (29% approve, 56% disapprove).

Favorability Ratings – Governor Maggie Hassan

Currently, 53% of New Hampshire adults say they have a favorable opinion of Hassan, 27% have an unfavorable opinion, 10% are neutral, and 11% say they don't know enough about her to say. Hassan's net favorability rating, the percentage having a favorable opinion minus the percentage having an unfavorable opinion, is +26%, which is down from +36% in May. Hassan is very popular among Democrats (+72% net favorable) and Independents (+39%), but unpopular among Republicans (-25%).



Favorability Ratings – Potential NH Governor Candidates

It is unclear whether Governor Hassan will run for a third term as governor or instead run for U.S. Senate against incumbent Republican Kelly Ayotte. Other potential candidates, including three of the state's five executive councilors, are largely unknown by New Hampshire residents, even in their own districts.

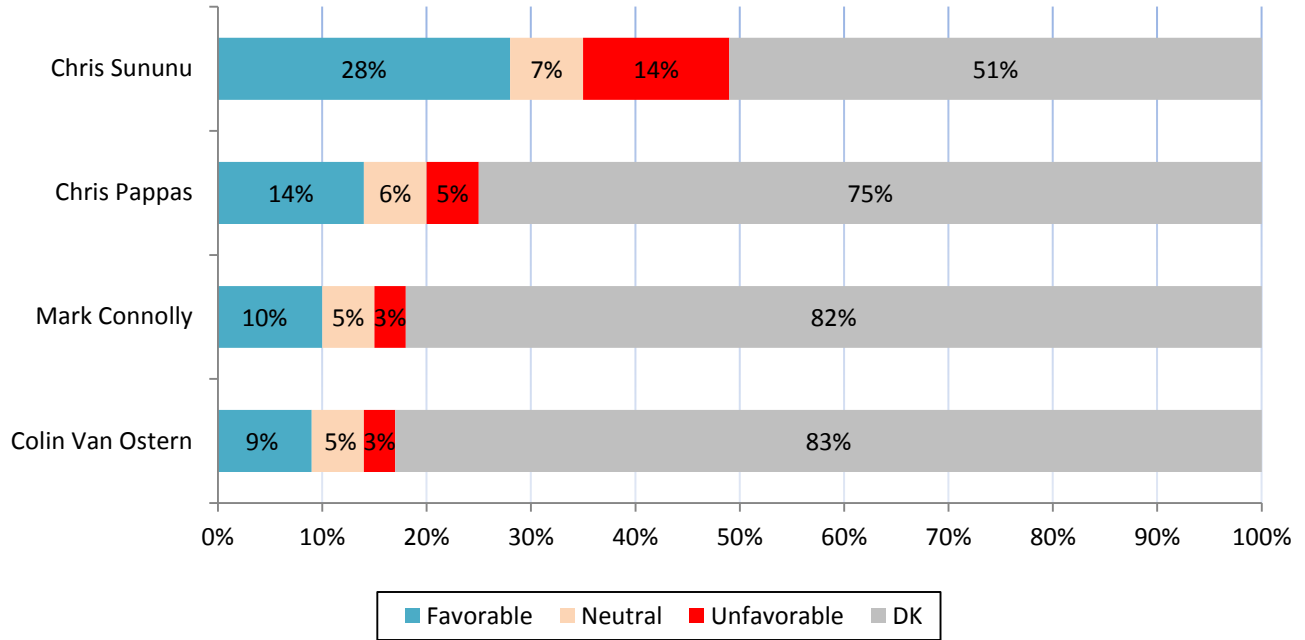
The best known of these potential candidates is Republican Chris Sununu of Newfields, who is the son of former governor John H. Sununu and the brother of former U.S. senator John E. Sununu. Currently 28% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Sununu, 14% have an unfavorable opinion, 7% are neutral and 51% don't know enough about him to have an opinion (including 31% in the 3rd district which he represents).

The next best known Executive Councilor is Democrat Chris Pappas of Manchester -- 14% have a favorable opinion of Pappas, 5% have an unfavorable opinion, 6% are neutral and 75% don't know enough about him to have an opinion (including 57% in the 4th district which he represents).

Only 9% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Democratic Executive Councilor Colin Van Ostern of Concord, 3% have an unfavorable opinion, 5% are neutral and 83% don't know enough about him to have an opinion (including 76% in the 2nd district which he represents).

Another potential Democratic candidate for Governor is New Castle resident and former New Hampshire Securities Chief Mark Connolly – currently 10% have a favorable opinion, 3% have an unfavorable opinion, 5% are neutral and 82% don't know enough about him to have an opinion.

Favorability Ratings - Potential NH Governor Candidates - July 2015

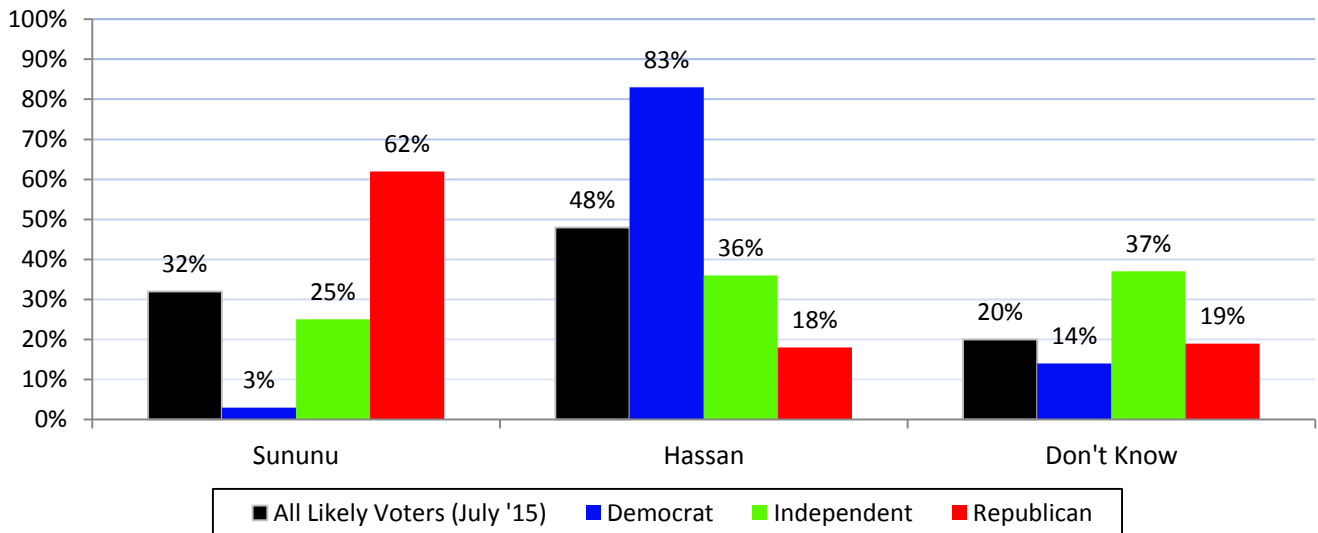


With the exception of Hassan, all potential candidates for governor are essentially unknown, so a high percentage of 2016 likely voters do not know who they would vote for in hypothetical matchups. Head to head matchups at this early a date are based on the name recognition that these candidates have. Currently just 3% of likely voters say they have definitely decided on who they will support, 7% are leaning toward a candidate, and 90% are still trying to decide.

Governor – Sununu vs. Hassan

If the election was held today between Sununu and Hassan, 48% of likely voters say they would vote for Hassan, 32% would vote for Sununu, and 20% are undecided. Hassan currently holds a 36%-25% edge among independents and gets support from 18% of Republicans.

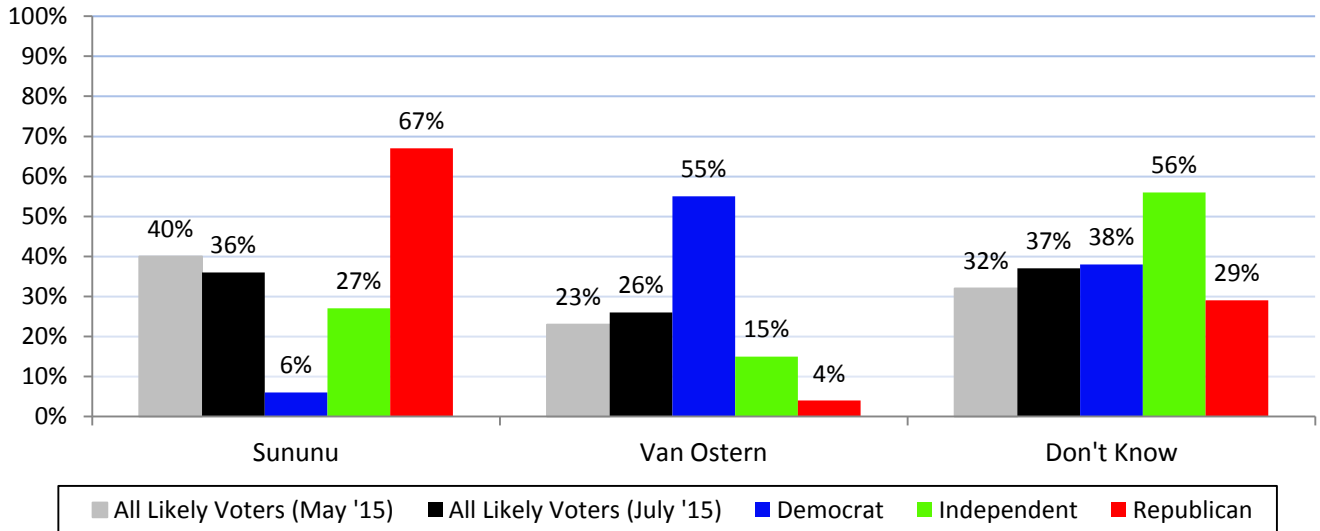
Governor - Sununu vs. Hassan

If the election was held today between Sununu and Van Ostern, 36% of likely voters say they would vote for Sununu, 26% would vote for Van Ostern, and 37% are undecided.

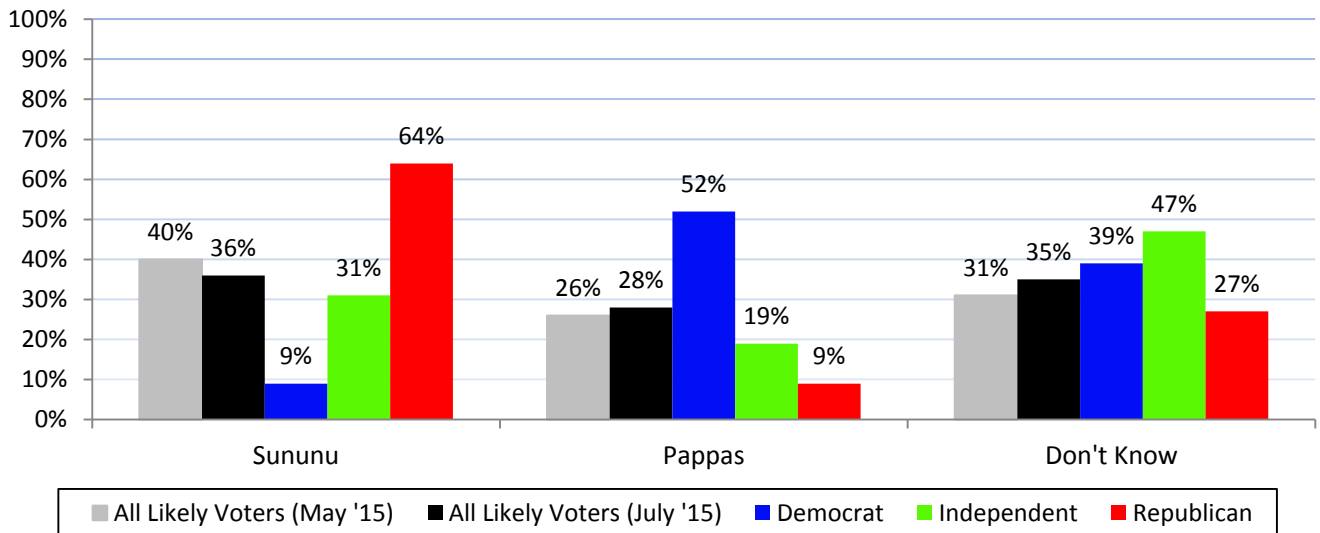
Governor - Sununu vs. Van Ostern



Governor – Sununu vs. Pappas

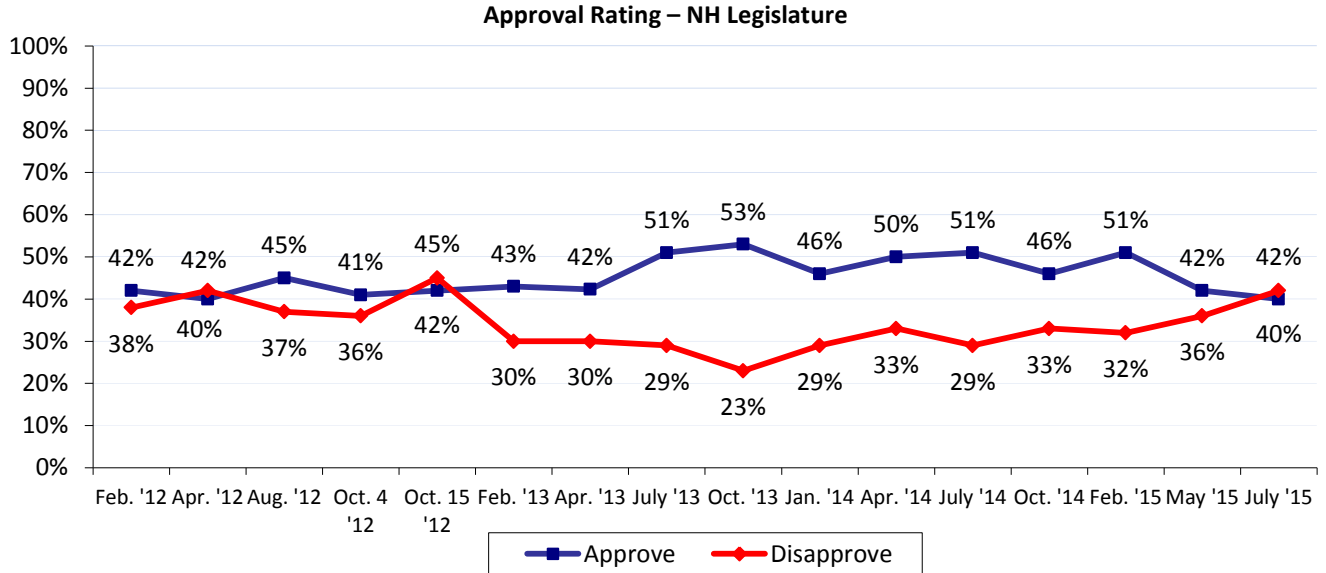
If the election was held today between Sununu and Pappas, 36% of likely voters say they would vote for Sununu, 28% would vote for Pappas, 1% support someone else, and 35% are undecided.

Governor - Sununu vs. Pappas



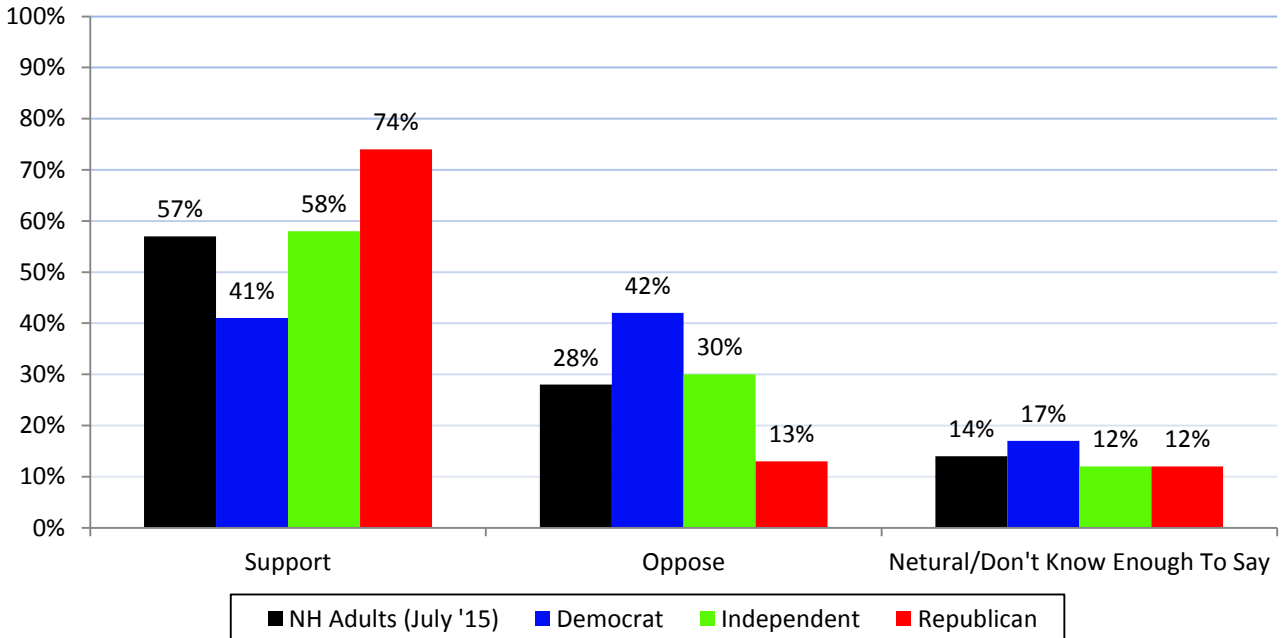
Approval of New Hampshire Legislature

New Hampshire residents are divided on the job the state legislature is doing. Currently, 40% of New Hampshire adults approve of how the State Legislature is doing its job, 42% disapprove, and 19% are neutral or don't know enough to say. This sentiment is bi-partisan as 42% of Democrats, 39% of Republicans, and 37% of Independents approve of the job the legislature is doing. This marks the first time since October 2012 that more Granite Staters disapprove of the legislature than approve.



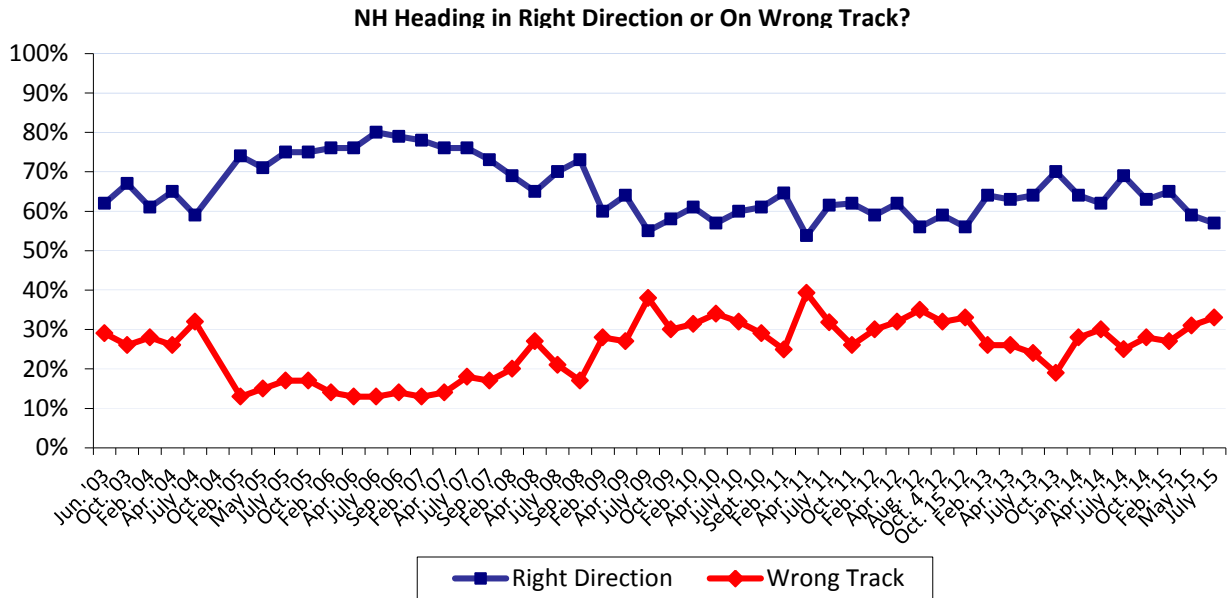
Support/Oppose 30 Day Residency Law?

One contentious issue in Concord was a bill passed by the legislature that would require a person to live in New Hampshire for 30 days before being allowed to register to vote. Governor Hassan recently vetoed this bill. However, a majority (57%) of Granite Staters support this law (42% strongly and 15% somewhat), 28% oppose it (20% strongly and 8% somewhat), and 14% are neutral or don't know enough to say. Republicans (74% support, 13% oppose) and Independents (58% support, 30% oppose) support the legislation, while Democrats (41% support, 42% oppose) are divided.



Right Direction or Wrong Track?

New Hampshire residents continue to think the state, as a whole, is headed in the right direction. Currently, 57% of New Hampshire adults feel the state is heading in the right direction, 33% think the state is seriously off on the wrong track, and 11% are unsure. Majorities of Democrats (62%), Republicans (55%) and Independents (55%) say the state is headed in the right direction.



Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest WMUR Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred and thirty-two (532) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between July 7 and July 20, 2015. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.2 percent. Included were four hundred seventy-two (472) likely 2016 general election voters (MSE = +/- 4.5%). These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 1.2% and 1.2% for the sample of likely 2016 general election voters.

The random sample used in the WMUR Granite State Poll was purchased from Scientific Telephone Samples (STS), Foothill Ranch, CA. STS screens each selected telephone number to eliminate non-working numbers, disconnected numbers, and business numbers to improve the efficiency of the sample, reducing the amount of time interviewers spend calling non-usable numbers.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, age, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
