

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

Town Warrant.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Whitefield, in the County of Coos and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs. You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town, on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects :

1. To choose a Town Clerk, one Selectman to serve for a period of three years, a Town Treasurer, Highway Agent, two Library Trustees, two Trust Fund Trustees, Auditor, Memorial Field Committeeman to serve for six years, and all other necessary town officers.
2. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for---
 - a. Town officers' salaries.
 - b. Town officers' expenses.
 - c. Election expenses.
 - d. Municipal Court expenses.
 - e. Care and repair of town buildings.
 - f. Police department.
 - g. Forest fires.
 - h. Health department and Vital Statistics.
 - i. Highways and Bridges.
 1. Snow removal.
 2. State Aid maintenance.
 3. Trunk Line maintenance.
 4. Town maintenance.
 5. Street lighting,
 6. General expense highway department.
 - j. Public Library.
 - k. Town Poor.
 - l. Memorial Day.
 - m. Band concerts.
 - n. Cemeteries.
 - o. Sewer maintenance.
 - p. Advertising.
 - q. Interest.
 1. Temporary loans.
 2. Town debt

- r. State Aid road construction.
 - s. Sidewalk construction.
 - t. Sewer construction.
 - u. Payment on principal of town debt.
3. To see if the Town will vote to elect the collector of taxes commencing with the Town Meeting of 1932. (Petition.)
 4. To see if the Town will vote to grant to the Woman's Study Club, American Legion, Public School (under proper supervision) and other organizations for public purposes the use of the Town Hall by the payment of actual expenses of heating, lighting and janitor service.
 5. To see if the Town will vote to reimburse the Fire Precinct for services of firemen called and attending fires outside the bounds of the Fire Precinct.
 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money by temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.
 7. To see if the Town will vote to assume the expense of rebuilding the road to the factory buildings (which amount is to be repaid to the Town from rentals of the Gardner Pad Company), and authorize the Selectmen to borrow the same on the credit of the Town.
 8. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before the meeting.

Given under our hands and the seal of the Town this twenty-third day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, and of the Independence of the United States of America the one hundred and fifty-fifth.
