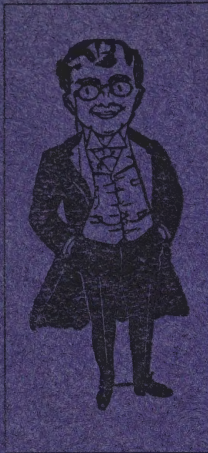

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Deerfield in the County of Rockingham, in said State, Qualified to Vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house in said town on Tuesday, the 9th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.

3. To see if the town will vote to shingle the town house and raise money for the same.

4. To see if the town will vote to accept the gift of Mrs. Mary Veasey Towle of a piece of land on the shore of Pleasant Pond for a public grove to be known as the Veasey grove, according to her conditions.

5. To see if the town will vote to build a house on the town house land for the road machines and tools, and use the lumber that is in the shanty that stands on the Stevens land near the creamery building.

6. To see if the town will vote to buy chairs or settees for the town hall and raise money for the same.

7. To see if the town will vote to raise money sufficient to receive state aid for highways.
