WARRANT.

{ L. S. } STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Milan qualified to vote in Town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at Androscoggin hall in said town on the second Tuesday of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose by ballot and major vote a Town Clerk.
2. To choose by ballot and major vote three Selectmen.
3. To choose by ballot and major vote a Town Treasurer.
4. To choose Road Agents and all other necessary town officers, including Fish and Game Wardens.
5. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance of the poor, and to apply on town debt, and other necessary charges arising within the town.
6. To see what sums of money the town will raise for laying out, building and repairing highways and bridges.
7. To see what sums of money the town will raise for breaking roads during the winter of 1908 and 1909.
8. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the support of schools.
9. To see what sums of money the town will raise to pay tuition of scholars.

10. To see if the town will vote not to distribute inventory blanks until such time as the selectmen shall examine and appraise property to be taxed.

11. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the library.

12. To choose a library trustee to serve three years.

13. To see if the town will vote not to have a liquor agent.

14. To hear the reports of agents, auditors, committees or officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Chairman's Report.

To the Citizens of the School District of Milan;

It has been the custom in years past for the retiring member of the School Board to make a few remarks on the work of the year just closed, and to make a few suggestions for the coming year.

Taken as a whole our schools have been very satisfactory; the Board have endeavored to hire the best teachers possible, but owing to the scarcity of teachers throughout the Country, have not always been able to procure the best, at just the time they wished the schools to commence.

Owing to the favorable condition of the roads and weather during the fall and winter months, the expense of conveying scholars has been much less than usual. We were thus enabled to have more weeks of school than ever before; but on account of the prevalence of whooping cough and other contagious diseases the attendance has not been as good as we could have wished, especially among the smaller children.

A prescribed course of studies has been a long felt want in our schools, and this year by the help, of the course laid down by the State Superintendent for Country school, we made out and placed in our schools a course of study. We did this that our pupils when wishing to enter some other school might be prepared to pass examination in all the branches of study required by that school.

This course has been used during the Fall and Winter terms and has proved as satisfactory as could be expected under the circumstances.

Owing to the bad condition of the arithmetics and geographies it was thought best to introduce new kinds on an exchange basis, thus realizing a small amount from the sale of the old books. As required by the laws of this state we were obliged to put in to the schools enough copies of the physiologies so that each pupil could have one, and of the Constitution of New Hampshire to supply the ninth grade pupils. Having to purchase so many new books we have had to exceed our appropriation for school supplies. Owing to the bad condition of the reading books, we would advise that they be exchanged for a new kind and also that some good supplementary reading be purchased for the schools during the coming year.

Because of existing circumstances it was deemed advisable by the School Board to purchase pipe and bring the water from a certain spring to the highway on Milan Hill so that the pupils could obtain water without trespassing, the labor being given by the people of the district.

Our bills for repairs have been small this year, but there seems to be quite a lot needing to be done in the school rooms another year so we will carry over the amount left to help in our next year's repairs.

The increase of wages in all occupations, and the demand for teachers has obliged us to pay higher wages than heretofore. This state of things seems likely to continue, so we would advise that the same amount of money be raised this year as was last. We are glad to note an increasing interest of the parents, as manifested by their visits to the schools, we trust this interest will continue and our schools grow better each year.

On retiring from the Board I wish to thank the other members of the Board, the parents and scholars for the help they have given in the past and to wish them prosperity in the future.

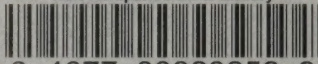
