Report of Superintendent of Schools

Mr. Chairman and Gentlemen:

I have the honor to submit for your consideration my sixth annual report of the Bartlett Town School District, it being the seventh in the series of such reports.

At the last session of the legislature was passed the following law: Chapter 122, Section 1, which reads as follows: "The fiscal year of town and special school districts beginning February 16, 1917, shall end August 31, 1918, and thereafter the fiscal and scholastic year shall end August 31, annually." Owing to this, only a partial report can be made at this time with some recommendations to guide the action at the annual meeting. A full report will be due August 31, 1918.

The revised program has been in use during the year and by the close of the scholastic year, we expect all classes to be up to grade. This apparent falling off is due to the change from the old to the new program of studies.

We have two pupils who are attending high school at North Conway: Hattie Burnell and Leon Taylor.

TESTS

Efficiency tests have been given in reading, language, writing, spelling, and arithmetic. The results of the tests are reported to the teacher in charge which gives her a means of measuring teaching progress in those subjects.

REPAIRS

A new stove with a jacket and ventilating system has been installed at Glen. This is proving very satisfactory as all parts of the room are at the same temperature. A similar jacket should be placed about the stoves in the other school houses in the district. Slate boards have been pur-

chased for the Goodrich Falls school. The other repairs have been of a minor class.

SOME OF OUR NEEDS

At Intervale. The wood shed at Intervale should be repaired, closed vaults made for the toilets, more slate boards and two chairs purchased, some foot rests made for the children or else new adjustable desks purchased and some of the trees cut about the building because their shade makes the room too dark for studying at times.

At the Falls. Some trees should be cut from the school grounds to give better light in the building. The grounds should be graded somewhat, especially at the front.

At Glen. The grounds should be graded and a suitable driveway made to the building. The lot should be squared up to improve the grounds.

ENUMERATION.

The September enumeration showed 34 girls and 36 boys in town between the ages of five and sixteen. On October 1, 1917, we had 62 pupils registered in our schools.

ATTENDANCE

The attendance for the spring term and the first part of the fall term was very satisfactory, while for the latter part of the fall term and the winter term it was far from satisfactory. Some of the trouble was due to sickness but mostly to indifference on the part of pupils and parents.

TRANSPORTATION

We have the same transportation route from Garland Ridge to Bartlett Special District as last year and, during the fall term, the children at the Falls were transported to the Glen school.

It would seem as if some satisfactory arrangement might be made, if the parents would co-operate, to transport the few children from the Hill Town school to some other school which would give them better advantages and be a saving to the district. This of course cannot be done without co-operation of those living in the Hill Town district. I hope that this may have careful and unbiased consideration and that you will act in accordance with that which will give the greatest good to the children.

Superintendent's Report

Mr. Chairman and Gentlemen:

I have the pleasure to submit for your consideration my sixth annual report of the schools of Bartlett Special District, it being the seventh in the series of such reports.

At the last session of the legislature was passed the following law: Chapter 122, Section 1, which reads as follows: "The fiscal year of town and special school districts beginning February 16, 1917, shall end August 31, 1918, and thereafter the fiscal and scholastic year shall end August 31, annually." Owing to this, it is impossible to make a full and legal report at this time. The full report will be due in August.

We are using the revised program and as far as we are able to use the program we are up to grade. We have introduced the beginning of the junior high school subjects as given in the program, viz., inventional geometry in the seventh grade and algebra in the eighth. The superintendent is working out a course of study for the geometry as none is outlined in the program.

Efficiency tests have been continued in reading, language, writing, spelling, and arithmetic. The results of these tests are reported to the teacher in charge which gives her a means of measuring teaching progress in those subjects.

Music and drawing have been continued this year under the same efficient supervisor and teacher, Miss Marion Stephen. Last May, the schools under the leadership of Miss Stephen gave a musical which was a credit to any school. With the funds was purchased a victrola for the schools. This is a great help in the marching and is used for other school exercises.

The building has been renovated inside and is much

improved. The furnaces have been taken down and made over.

The attendance in the lower grades is still unsatisfactory and will probably remain so till the parents begin to realize that they have a responsibility in the matter of seeing that the children are in school and are there on time.

We still continue the first year of high school work. It is a success and should be continued.

It seems to me that medical inspection will be a good thing for the schools, especially if it were possible by that means to get some of the bad cases of adenoids cleaned up. When the question comes up at the annual meeting to be voted upon, which it must at each meeting until adopted, I hope that it will not be turned down.

At this time, I wish to thank the Board of Education and the teachers for their hearty support and co-operation during the past year.

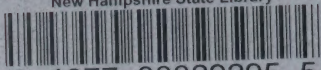
