STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE TOWN WARRANT HANCOCK NH

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hancock, in the County of Hillsborough in said state qualified to vote in Town Affairs; You are hereby notified to meet at the **TOWN OFFICE BUILDING** in said Hancock on Tuesday, the fourteenth (14th) day of March 2006 at eight of the clock in the forenoon until seven of the clock in the evening, for ballot voting of Town Officers and all other matters requiring ballot vote; and, to meet at said **FIRE STATION** in said Hancock, on Saturday, the eighteenth (18th) day of March 2006 at nine of the clock in the morning, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

2 Are you in favor of the adoption of a proposal of the planning board to amend the Hancock Zoning Ordinance, which proposal comprises a comprehensive revision of the existing Hancock Zoning Ordinance and includes a comprehensive revision of the existing Hancock Historic District Ordinance and adopts an amended Building Code? The Planning Board recommends and approves the adoption of this proposal.

3. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to Two Hundred Fifteen Thousand dollars (\$215,000.00) for the purchase of a pumper fire truck; and to authorize the issuance of not more than Two Hundred fifteen Thousand dollars (\$215,000.00) of bonds or notes in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act and to authorize the municipal officials to issue and negotiate such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon; or take any other action relating thereto. The Select Board recommends this appropriation. (2/3 Ballot Vote Required)

4. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate One Million Five hundred Twenty-two Thousand Three Hundred Eighty-five dollars, (\$1,522,385.00) which represents the operating budget, inclusive of the Water Department operations. Said sum exclusive of all special or individual articles addressed; or take any other action relating thereto. (Majority vote required)

5. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to Three Thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) for the purpose of continuing the work of the Open Spaces Committee; or take any other action relating thereto. The Select Board recommends this appropriation. (Majority vote required)

6. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to Eleven Thousand dollars (\$11,000.00) to repair the metal roof on the Highway Barn; or take any other action relating thereto. The Select Board recommends this appropriation.

(Majority vote required)

7. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to Three Thousand Five Hundred dollars (\$3,500.00) for the purpose of maintaining the trees along Main Street and in the Historic District; or take any other action relating thereto. The Select Board recommends this appropriation. (Majority vote required)

8. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to Thirteen Thousand dollars (\$13,000.00) for the purpose of improving the parking on Main Street from the Hancock Generations Salon past the Manning House; or take any other action relating thereto. The Select Board recommends this appropriation.

(Majority vote required)

9. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to Four Thousand Five Hundred dollars (\$4,500.00) to refinish the Town Hall floor; or take any other action relating thereto. Select Board recommends this appropriation.

Majority vote required)

10. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to Six Thousand dollars (\$6,000.00) to repair the Multi purpose Court; or take any other action relating thereto. The Select Board recommends this appropriation. (**Majority vote required**)

11. To see if the Town of Hancock will raise and appropriate up to Eight Thousand dollars (\$8,000.00) for the purpose of hiring an attorney to prosecute court cases brought by the police department; or take any other action relating thereto. The Select Board recommends this appropriation. (Majority vote required)

12. To see if the Town of Hancock will raise and appropriate the sum of Three Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty dollars (\$3,750.00) for the purpose of funding The Grapevine Family & Community Resource Center programs and services for the people of Antrim, Bennington, Francestown and Hancock. This amount represents the Town of Hancock's portion of the funds needed to support The Grapevine; or take any other action relating thereto. The Select Board recommends this appropriation. (Majority vote required)

13. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to Five Thousand Five Hundred dollars (\$5,500.00) to purchase a trailer-mounted generator; and, authorize the Select Board to apply for and accept any grants that may become available toward this purchase; or take any other action relating thereto. The SelectBoard recommends this appropriation. (Majority vote required)

14. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate One Thousand Seven Hundred Fifty-seven dollars (\$1,757.00) for the repair and installation of storm windows on the second floor of the Post Office and, to take this sum from the fund balance and no amount to be raised by taxation. This sum represents the remaining balance of the 2003 Warrant Article (Post Office painting) which lapsed into the general fund at the end of the project; or take any other action relating thereto. The Select Board recommends this appropriation. (Majority vote required) 15. To see if the Town of Hancock will adopt the provisions of the optional veterans' tax credit per RSA 72:28 II, which shall replace the standard veterans' tax credit in its entirety and shall not be in addition to, in accordance with RSA 72:27-a. The tax credit will be in the amount of One Hundred Fifty dollars (\$150.00) and shall be subtracted each year from the property tax on the veteran's residential property. To qualify for the optional veterans' tax credit any applicant must meet the criteria stated in RSA 72:28 IV and V; or take any other action relating thereto. The Select Board recommends this appropriation. (Majority vote required)

16. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to Fifty-Five Thousand dollars (\$55,000.00) for the purpose of rebuilding the section of Antrim Road from Evergreen Hill to the Delia Daniels Residence (#22 Antrim Road). This sum to come from fund balance (surplus) and no amount to be raised from taxation; or take any other action relating thereto. This is a non-lapsing article and will not lapse until the project is completed or by 2011, whichever is sooner. The Select Board recommends this appropriation. (Majority vote required)

17. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of ninety thousand dollars (\$90,000.00) for a complete revaluation. This sum to come from fund balance and no amount to be raised from taxation; or take any other action relating thereto. This is a non-lapsing article and will not lapse until the project is complete or by 2008, whichever is sooner. The Select Board recommends this appropriation.

(Majority vote required)

18. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed Five Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$550,000.00) for the purpose of constructing a new bridge on Cavender Road to replace the one destroyed by floods in 2005. This sum will be offset by 75% from FEMA, 20% from the State of New Hampshire and 5% from the Town of Hancock; or take any other action relating thereto. The Select Board recommends this appropriation. (Majority vote required)

19. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$1,864.00 for the purpose of repairs and replacement of recreational facilities; and to authorize the withdrawal of this sum from the Hancock Recreation Fund (Revenue Fund) established for this purpose at the 1993 town meeting to fund this appropriation; or take any other action relating thereto. {No funds to be raised by taxation.} (Majority vote required)

20. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$2,300.00 for the purpose of repairs and replacement of town highway equipment; and to authorize the withdrawal of this sum from the Hancock Highway Special Revenue Fund established for this purpose at the 1999 town meeting to fund this appropriation; or take any other action relating thereto. {No funds to be raised by taxation.} (Majority vote required) 21. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$6,400.00 for the purpose of repairs and replacement of police equipment; and to authorize the withdrawal of this sum from the Hancock Police Equipment Repair/Replacement Fund (Revenue Fund) established for this purpose at the 1993 town meeting to fund this appropriation; or take any other action relating thereto. {No funds to be raised by taxation.} (Majority vote required)

22. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$460.00 for the purpose of purchasing baseball equipment and doing maintenance and repairs to the ball fields; and to authorize the withdrawal of this sum from the Hancock Baseball Fund (Revenue Fund) established for this purpose at the 1997 town meeting to fund this appropriation; or take any other action relating thereto. {No funds to be raised by taxation.}

23. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$8,000.00 for the purpose of preservation and storage of the town's archival records; and to authorize the withdrawal of this sum from the Hancock History Fund (Revenue Fund) established for this purpose at the 1993 town meeting to fund this appropriation; or take any other action relating thereto. {No funds to be raised by taxation.} (Majority vote required)

24. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$850.00 for the purpose of repairs to the tennis court; and to authorize the withdrawal of this sum from the Hancock Tennis Court Fund (Revenue Fund) established for this purpose at the 1993 town meeting to fund this appropriation; or take any other action relating thereto. {No funds to be raised by taxation} (Majority vote required)

25. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept the reports of auditors and committees as printed in the Town Report; or take any other action relating thereto. (Majority vote required)

26. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

2005 REPORT FROM THE HANCOCK TOWN ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Advisory Committee began meeting on November 15th this year. At that time the committee began reviewing the proposed expenses of the town departments as submitted by the various department heads.

As questions arose, the committee met with those departments which had significant expenses or changes from previous years. All budgets were reviewed with the underlying considerations of the necessity of the expense and the possibility of incurring it this year, or delaying it to some future date. It should be mentioned that this town continues to be served by dedicated, conscientious individuals, whose primary interest is the welfare of the town. The department heads' willingness to meet with the committee and review their operations was gratifying and constructive.

On January 16th, the committee met with the Select Board and presented their recommendations. It was not surprising that the Select Board had reached many of the same conclusions, and was perhaps even more stringent in their evaluations. The Advisory Committee concurs with the budget submitted for consideration at the annual town meeting.

REPORT OF THE HANCOCK SELECT BOARD 2005 YEAR IN REVIEW

Certainly this past year will be remembered for the floods and subsequent damage that we, and surrounding towns suffered in October. Roads and bridges are still being repaired and the work will continue well into this year. On a positive note, it was reassuring to see how the town pulled together to weather the storm and its aftermath. Highway, Police, Fire, Select Board and Emergency Management were all involved in the process of making sure that proper steps were taken to insure the safety of all the citizens of Hancock.

Earlier in the year we were honored to present the Boston Post Cane to our oldest resident, Catherine Moore, on her 100th birthday. We were also pleased to acknowledge the accomplishments of two of our most valued employees, Albert Anderson who attained the prestigious level of Senior Road Scholar and Allen Young who attained the level of Road Scholar 1. We regretfully accepted the resignation of Doug Bowen as Chair of the Planning Board primarily due to the well-balanced, positive leadership he had demonstrated over the course of many years. We were pleased to welcome Stephen Froling as the new chair of the Planning Board and were also pleased to welcome Margaret Carlson to the Select Board. We are indeed fortunate to have such fine people involved in town matters.

There was much activity on Main Street during the course of the year. On the north side, an experimental sidewalk and curbing were installed in front of the Mollers and the Library. On the south side, the temporary fence in front of Fiddleheads was removed, the sidewalk was lowered, a new gravel surface was installed and new curbing was put in place, making this area much safer and more useable. In addition, there was a noticeable difference along Main Street and on the Common after the trees were pruned and trimmed under the direction of the Village Planning Committee and the Common Commissioners.

The Hazardous Mitigation Committee completed its task of identifying past and potential hazards and constructed a plan to deal with them in the future. This plan was sent off to FEMA where it was approved and later accepted and adopted by the Select Board. Elements of this plan have now proven to be most useful in the aftermath of the floods. Hats off to Don Briggs and his committee for their hard work.

Our Independence Day celebration and fireworks along with Old Home Days weekend were typical of what makes Hancock so special. It takes a big commitment from all those that volunteer their time to make these events happen and their efforts are much appreciated. During Old Home Days the town was the recipient of a very special plaque presented to us by the New Hampshire Association for the Blind honoring the many achievements of Emma Coolidge Weston who founded the Association here in Hancock in 1912. Emma was a very special woman and we were deeply moved and proud that she was a resident of the town. Throughout the year Larry Schwartz has been working diligently with the Selectmen's Advisory Committee to the ConVal School District in an effort to keep the School Board and school administrators aware of the concerns of the town. His efforts have resulted in a number of positive changes and proposals. Since most of our tax dollars are spent on the schools, it's reassuring to know that Larry is on the case.

We would be remiss if we did not thank Barbara Caverly and Linda Coughlan for their daily advice and assistance as well as all those who participate in the administration of the town. Thanks also to all the volunteers who serve on the town commissions, committees, and boards. Your efforts are much appreciated and valued.

SUMMARY 2005 TOWN MEETING MINUTES

ARTICLE 1: Town officers elected by BALLOT on March 8th, 2005. Moderator Ward read the results of the March 8th election.

ARTICLE 2: Voted by a show of cards to see if the Town of Hancock would raise and appropriate one million three hundred sixty seven thousand three hundred twenty five dollars (\$1,367,325.00) which represents the operating budget, inclusive of the Water Department operations. The Article **PASSED** unanimously.

ARTICLE 3: Voted by a **BALLOT** to see if the Town of Hancock would raise and appropriate up to ninety thousand dollars (\$90,000) to purchase a 6-wheel dump truck and associated plow equipment and to authorize the issuance of not more than ninety thousand (\$90,000) of bonds or notes in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act and to authorize the municipal officials to issue and negotiate such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon. Larry Schwartz moved that the Town of Hancock vote to raise and appropriate up to eighty eight thousand dollars (\$88,000.00) for the purchase of a 6-wheel dump truck and associated plow equipment. The amount had been lowered to \$88,000.00 dollars because the bids came in lower than expected. The amended Article **PASSED** by **BALLOT** Yes 166, No -1.

Laurie Bryan administered the Oath of Office to the newly elected officials present at the meeting.

ARTICLE 4: Voted by a show of cards to see if the Town of Hancock would raise and appropriate up to four thousand dollars six hundred dollars (\$4,600.00) for the purpose of continuing the work of the Open Spaces Committee, up to \$3,000.00 of said sum to be spend on additional research and up to \$1,600.00 of said sum to be spent on expenses incurred by the Open Space Committee. The Article **PASSED** unanimously.

ARTICLE 5: Voted by a show of cards to see if the Town of Hancock would adopt the provisions of the optional veterans' tax credit per RSA 72:28 II, which shall replace the standard veterans' tax credit in its entirety and shall not be in addition to, in accordance with RSA 72:27-a. Tax credit will be in the amount of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) and shall be subtracted each year from property tax on the veteran's residential property. The article **PASSED** unanimously.

ARTICLE 6: Voted by a show of cards to see if the Town of Hancock would raise and appropriate up to two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) toward the fireworks display traditionally held on July 3rd of each year, with the balance coming from donations. A suggestion was made to include the \$2,500 in the Selectmen's Budget Line Item: Patriotic Purposes. A show of hands supported this suggestion. The Article **PASSED** unanimously.

ARTICLE 7: Voted by a show of cards to see if the Town of Hancock would raise and appropriate up to twenty-six thousand five hundred twenty six dollars (\$26,526.00) for the purchase of a new Ford Crown Victoria police cruiser. The Article **PASSED** unanimously.

ARTICLE 8: Voted by a show of cards to see if the Town of Hancock would raise and appropriate up to five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) for the purpose of maintaining the trees along Main Street and in the Historic District. Laurie Bryan moved that the Town of Hancock vote to raise up to three thousand dollars (\$3,000.00) for the purpose of maintaining the trees along Main Street and in the Historic District. The amount of the appropriation was lowered to \$3,000.00 because estimates came in lower than expected. The amended Article **PASSED** unanimously.

ARTICLE 9: Voted by a show of cards to see if the Town of Hancock would raise and appropriate up to two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) for the purpose of creating and installing approximately 100 feet of new sidewalk on the north side of Main Street. The new sidewalk will consist of test sections made from different gravel compositions that are intended to blend in with the existing surroundings. The Article **PASSED** unanimously.

ARTICLE 10: Voted by a show of cards to see if the Town of Hancock would raise and appropriate up to seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7,500.00) to install a three-zone split air conditioning system in the town offices. The article **PASSED** unanimously.

ARTICLE 11: Voted by a show of cards to see if the Town of Hancock would reclassify as a Class A trail pursuant to the provisions of RSA 231-A the Class VI portion of Mill Road starting 50' east of the Albert Pels driveway and continuing across the bridge to a point 50' west of the Albert Garand driveway (approximately 550'). The article **PASSED** unanimously.

ARTICLE 12: Voted by a show of cards to see if the Town of Hancock would convey to the Hancock Community Housing Authority the Right-To-Use, in perpetuity, the following property, subject to terms and conditions that the Select Board may deem appropriate, and for the purpose of providing affordable housing for the Town of Hancock elderly residents: Map U04, Lot 73, the Old Fire Station. The transfer of a Right-To-Use for this property would be contingent upon the satisfactory submission of information confirming the capability of the property to support a proper sewage disposal system. The Hancock Community Housing Authority shall submit this information to the Hancock Select Board. The Hancock Community Housing Authority shall be obligated to revert the property to the Town should it cease to be used for the purposes enumerated in this article. The Article **PASSED**, Yes – 106, No – 42.

ARTICLE 13: Voted by a show of cards to see if the Town of Hancock would convey to the Hancock Community Housing Authority the Right-to-Use, in perpetuity, the following properties, subject to terms and conditions that the Select Board may deem appropriate, for the purpose of providing affordable housing for the Town of Hancock elderly residents: Map U06, Lot 2A, the old Town Barn site on Longview Road and Map U07, Lot 4A, the 1.8 acre lot on Longview Road. The transfer of a Right-To-Use for these properties will be contingent upon the satisfactory submission of information confirming the capability of each property to support a proper sewage disposal system. The Hancock Community Housing Authority shall submit this information to the Hancock Select Board. The Hancock Community Housing Authority shall be obligated to revert the property to the Town should it cease to be used for the purposes enumerated in this article. A motion to was made to not consider the 1.8 acre lot in the warrant article. A motion was made to **TABLE** the motion. The motion to **TABLE** was **VOTED** by a show of cards, and **FAILED**. There was no challenge.

ARTICLE 14: Voted by a show of cards to see if the Town of Hancock would raise and appropriate up to eleven thousand dollars (\$11,000.00) for the purpose and repairs and replacement of recreational facilities; and to authorize withdrawal of this sum from the Hancock Recreation Fund. The article **PASSED** unanimously.

ARTICLE 15: Voted by a show of cards to see whether the Town of Hancock would raise and appropriate up to three thousand six hundred fifty dollars (\$3,650.00) for the purpose of repairs and replacement of town highway equipment and to authorize the withdrawal of this sum from the Hancock Highway Special Revenue Fund. The article **PASSED** unanimously.

ARTICLE 16: Voted by a show of cards to see if the Town of Hancock would raise and appropriate up to five thousand eight hundred dollars (\$5,800.00) for the purpose of repairs and replacement of police equipment and to authorize the withdrawal of this sum from the Hancock Police Equipment Repair/Replacement Fund. The article **PASSED** unanimously.

ARTICLE 17: Voted by a show of cards to see if the Town of Hancock would raise and appropriate up to two thousand six hundred dollars (\$2,600.00) for the purpose of purchasing baseball equipment and doing maintenance and repairs to the ball fields and to authorize the withdrawal of this sum from the Hancock Baseball Fund. The article **PASSED** unanimously.

ARTICLE 18: Voted by a show of cards to see if the Town of Hancock would raise and appropriate up to seven thousand nine hundred dollars (\$7,900.00) for the purpose of preservation and storage of the town's archival records and to authorize the withdrawal of this sum from the Hancock History Fund. The Article **PASSED** unanimously.

ARTICLE 19: Voted by a show of cards to see if the Town of Hancock would raise and appropriate up to two thousand eight hundred thirty dollars (\$2,830.00) for the purpose of repairs to the tennis court and to authorize the withdrawal of this sum from the Hancock Tennis Court Fund. The Article **PASSED** unanimously.

ARTICLE 20: Voted by a show of cards to see if the Town of Hancock would authorize the Selectmen to accept the reports of the auditors and committees as printed in the Town Report. The article **PASSED** unanimously. A motion to adjourn was made by Steve Froling and seconded. The motion was **VOTED** by a voice vote and **FAILED**.

ARTICLE 21: To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting. Desmond Ford spoke in appreciation of work done to support the Advisory Committee. Barbara Campbell voiced concern about truck traffic on her road. There being no other business, the meeting adjourned at 12:25 p.m.

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TRUSTEES OF TRUST FUNDS 2005

2005 was a stable year for the trust funds of the town. We continued our financial relationship with Bank of America and, on their recommendation, made an internal change in our equity (stocks) investments within our portfolio. For a number of years, the equity portion of our portfolio has consisted of individual stocks. With an asset allocation of approximately 25% equities and 75% in cash, bonds and bond mutual funds, the equity piece of the pie is pretty small.

As a result, Bank of America suggested that we sell our individual stocks and purchase a range of mutual funds and exchange traded funds or ETFs. We accomplished this early in the year and now have a much broader range of capitalization levels (small and mid-caps) as well as better international representation to add to our usual large cap S&P 500 style funds. All of the asset allocations are set by the trustees in our investment guidelines as required by the state and adhered to by Bank of America.

As mentioned in previous years, the investments are, by design, reflective of a conservative financial asset allocation. Our goal is to provide income to the beneficiaries of the various trusts held by the town. We also hope for some growth of principal over the long term to offset inflation and any increased needs of the beneficiaries.

This year the trusts did not need to fund any of the operational expenses of the Library since the Library Trustees decided to spend down their NHPDIP money market account which had a low rate of return. The Library resumed its usual withdrawal of \$2000.00 per month in January 2006 and will continue to do so for the foreseeable future.

The Hancock Elementary School was the recipient of several disbursements this year. The annual New Hampshire Dance Institute program was once again funded by the school trusts. The trusts also funded a portion of an arts enrichment program in the spring. As has been the practice for a number of years, the trusts paid for the year-end school trip bus fee and also funded a special trip for the Kindergarten on the Scenic Wilton Railroad. It is always a pleasure to know that the educational mission of the school is being helped by the past generosity of townspeople.

The new Fire Department rescue truck will be purchased by Fire Department Association funds from donations from Hancock residents and from the Helen Brown Fund established in 2000 for the benefit of the Fire Department and Hancock Rescue. No taxpayer funds will be used to purchase this \$120,000.00 vehicle. Once again, we are thankful for the planned giving preparations of some of our townspeople. Their generosity will be felt for generations to come.

HANCOCK TOWN LIBRARY TRUSTEES REPORT

INTERLIBRARY LOAN: WHY & HOW

The ruins of the oldest library yet discovered are in Nippur, a hundred miles south of Baghdad. Two small rooms hold broken clay tablets recording tax receipts, population figures and crop yields. It was a government office, not a lending library, and its main purpose was to support the power of a king who died four thousand years ago. Our own library, in contrast, exists to serve the citizens of the town. Circulation is one of its goals. The more items that go out (and come back) the happier the librarians. Two features increase the library's ability to serve its patrons by reaching out beyond its walls to bring in material. The most obvious and recent is the computer, which provides almost limitless access to our collective store of knowledge. Interlibrary Loan is an older, but still recent, means of bringing material from outside into our homes. How does it work?

Imagine that you have read our library's edition of the second volume of Jeremy Belknap's <u>History of New Hampshire</u>, which talks about the state's geography, road making, lumbering, farming, Indian relics, climate, etc. from the viewpoint of 1812. Suppose that you want to know more about Belknap. Who was this man who had both a county and a mountain range named after him, who visited Washington's army outside Boston and later organized the first scientific expedition to climb Mt. Washington? But the Hancock Library doesn't have a biography of Jeremy Belknap. This is where Interlibrary Loan comes to the rescue.

You ask at the front desk for an Interlibrary Loan Request Form. It wants your name, phone and the date of request, then asks for Author (which you don't know) and Title (which you don't know either) so you write in that space "Biography of Jeremy Belknap." The slip goes to the Director of the Hancock Library, Amy Markus, whose computer takes her into something called "The New Hampshire Union Public Access Catalog." This is a computer-maintained list of all circulating library items held by New Hampshire institutions, from Dartmouth College to our own library. Amy searches the list for books under the topic "Belknap" and gets a printout listing three biographies. You choose the most recent, published in 1982. It is available at Laconia, Stratham and North Hampton town libraries. The Laconia copy is missing, and the Stratham copy is circulating, but the North Hampton Library, agrees to lend it for a period of one month. The state library van picks it up in North Hampton on a Tuesday and drives it to the State Library in Concord where it goes into the Hancock bin. On Friday the van driver drives it to Hancock on his weekly trip to this area. George Salazar, the Hancock volunteer who manages Interlibrary Loan, logs it into a notebook and reports to Concord that it has arrived safely. You then get a call that the book is waiting. The sticker on the front of the book tells you that you have a little less than three weeks before it is due back for its return trip to Concord and North Hampton.

Who pays for these services? The state maintains the central library and pays for all services involving in-state transfer of books. It maintains The Public Access Catalog as well as other data bases, AND pays subscription fees to the Online Computer Library Center, which covers all libraries in this country, as well as many foreign ones. When Amy requests a book from another state or country, the issuing library pays postage for sending the book here, and Hancock pays the return postage. Interlibrary Loan is an amazingly good deal – and we can only be thankful that books are no longer printed on pottery.

2005 Hancock Town Library Annual Report

No possession can surpass, or even equal a good library, to the lover of books. Here are treasured up for his daily use and delectation, riches which increase by being consumed, and pleasures that never cloy. — John Alfred Landford (1823-1903)

The riches of the Hancock Town Library have been consumed voraciously during 2005. We now hold 18,775 materials (books, compact discs, audiotapes, videos, DVDs, a Polaroid camera and a slide projector) having added 1,103 materials during 2005. In addition, we offer a selection of 82 different magazines and newspapers. 19,614 items circulated throughout the town. Add to that the 1,182 interlibrary loan requests that were fulfilled (314 of those for book groups in town, 216 from other libraries around the state) and you can see how we have been busy feeding the intellectual hunger of Hancock!

119 new adult patron cards were issued, 73 patrons left town in one way or another for a net gain of 46 new adult patrons. That brings the total adult patron number up to 1,270. We also issued 33 new children's cards for a total of 207.

The two public computers and our high speed wireless internet access were used 1,573 times, the highest use being from June through August. Reference questions were answered, help with homework (children) and the internet (adults) was given, and thanks to Roberta Nylander, questions about local history and genealogy were expertly handled.

Linda Claff, Roberta Nylander (our children's librarians) and our volunteer reader, Pat Briggs, read to 77 children per week during the school year. They read to students from the Hancock Elementary School, the Hancock Preschool, and several in-home daycare groups as well as during Story and Craft Hour for Preschoolers (every Monday afternoon). Roberta Nylander and volunteer Jill Kuchinos ran the Kids Only Book Club for children ages 9-12 during the winter and spring; 25 children participated. The Summer Reading Program involved 48 children during the summer of 2005. Many thanks to the Hancock Woman's Club for their annual donation; their financial support makes the Summer Reading Program possible.

The library offered many programs specifically geared toward children during 2005 which were enthusiastically attended: Spanish classes for 6-8 year olds took place on Saturday mornings; artist Erick Ingraham kicked off the Summer Reading Program; Jack in the Beanstalk was performed by Sevanne Martin of the Peterborough Players; movies were shown every Wednesday afternoon during the summer; "Wild About Turtles" thrilled the preschool set; the Peterborough Players cast of Little Women did a rehearsal in the Daniels Room; magician Fran Ferry was our grand finale for the Summer Reading Program; and in anticipation of Halloween we did both a "Blood & Guts Workshop" and a Spooky Stories Night.

The Daniels Room was used 302 times by 25 groups other than the library in 2005. The library itself offered a few entertainments during the course of the year. The First

Monday Book Club lead by Margaret Carlson had over 20 members meeting once a month. In the fall of 2005, Bill Elliott became the facilitator and it transformed back to the First Tuesday Book Club. The Third Friday Film Series continued its successful run

with the theme of Dance movies through the spring and Trains in the fall. The popular Great Decisions discussion group met 10 times with leader Jack Carlson. Tibby Tobey taught the Shakespeare's Tragedies class for 7 weeks. Harriet Beecher Stowe (aka Ms. Tobey) came to the library in February in period dress no less, to speak to us about her life. MaryLou Moreen taught a CPR class. The Harris Center co-sponsored Bird Fest with us, featuring the talents of Walter Clark, Jane Eklund, Howard Mansfield, Sy Montgomery, Julia Older, Don and Lillian Stokes, and musician Steve Schuch of Night Heron Music. And the multigenerational Knit-Lits were created when we began our knitting class in the fall. Over the course of the year we had many speakers at the library: Jim Bolle from Monadnock Music; Allison Kerwin, to increase your garden IQ; Eric Aldrich to please your eye with his photographs; Bill and Eileen Elliott with their Walking Tour of Scotland; the Vivace String Group; Al Cantor from the Community Loan Fund; Edie Clark from Yankee Magazine; the Sisters (and Brother) in Crime Panel – Vicki Stiefel, Bill Tapply, Leslie Meier, and Leslie Wheeler; humorist Rebecca Rule; and Congressman Charles Bass.

The Friends of the Hancock Town Library had an impressive year, continuing their work to enhance the library with the funds they raise. You can thank the Friends for many things, including: the annual Old Home Day Book Sale (thanks once again to Tom Pisaturo for taking that on); museum passes to the Boston Museum of Fine Arts, the Currier Gallery, and the Montshire Science Museum; the Third Friday Film Series; the Baby Book Bag program; delivery of library materials to the homebound; the art exhibits in the Daniels Room (now booked through 2007!); and our growing DVD collection. The Friends also help pay for speakers and programming. The Friends purchased new cabinets for the children's room for much-needed storage space. Friends Handyman George Salazar built the public stocks for our Halloween skeleton (fondly known as Overdue Man). Finally, many thanks to outgoing Friends president Kim Brady for her enthusiastic tenure. We look forward to working with new Friends president Alison Rossiter.

As you can see, the Hancock Town Library not only offers riches for delectation but receives them as well, in the talents of many volunteers. It is likely that those behind the front desk or someone running a class are volunteers, their time and skills freely given to benefit the library and the Hancock community.

We are particularly fortunate to have benefited from the financial acumen of our treasurer, Sara Dowse. For five years Sara has paid the bills, kept track of funds, and made sure the library had what it needed to succeed. Before that Sara spent seven years as secretary. She has done an outstanding job in all of her roles. We will miss her thoughtfulness, her knowledge, and her tireless support of the library.

HANCOCK COMMON COMMISSION REPORT 2005

Rather than mentioning the effort put forth by certain ladies at the end of this report, let's begin by extending again, our thanks to Fran Hilner, Pat Fairchild and Tibby Tobey for the planting and maintenance of:

- The horse trough in front of the Town Offices
- The plantings around the fountain at the east end of Main Street
- The window boxes at the Post Office
- The flowers in the watering trough next to the flag pole

Their dedication helps beautify our town.

Speaking of the Post Office, a couple of years ago when the inside of the Post Office building was being re-modeled, a planter made from old railroad ties was put in front. Unfortunately, it was out of place and proportion. Last fall the top tier was removed, and this spring it will all be replanted in a more appropriate manner.

For reasons lost in ancient memory, there was a red fire hydrant almost in the middle of the commons. Certainly there was a need for a hydrant in the vicinity, but not sticking out like a sore thumb. This summer with the cooperation of the Fire Department, the Water Department, and the Highway Department, the hydrant was moved closer to Old Dublin Road and away from being a distraction to our picturesque commons. Thanks!

The Town has a water canon. It is used principally to water the recreation field behind the Fire House. However, it has, and can be, easily moved to the commons to give that struggling, unshaded turf a good soaking when the hope of a rain shower seems dim. Several years ago, that area was completely re-graded. The following year the summer was very dry and the grass could not get started. The last couple of years have been better and we're getting good cover. Kurt Grassett and his Highway Department have done a super job on improving that turf, and with the water canon available, the prospects are good for maintaining it.

Hancock uses its commons, and you can see visitors taking pictures and enjoying our picturesque village. It is, as the name implies, your commons. Have a seat, look around, enjoy!

2005 HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT REPORT

2005 may very well be remembered as the year of rain. An extremely wet year to begin with was made a record breaking year in October. During one 48 hour period on October 8 & 9, we received 7.5 inches of rain, and then one week later, we received an additional 4.25 inches. Needless to say, this amount of rain caused problems throughout the town.

The first three months of 2005 brought to us 17 winter storms. Two of the most notable storms occurred on January 22 with 22 inches of snow, and March 12 with 12 inches of snow. Both of these storms were declared excessive by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). We filed for assistance and received reimbursement for \$17,474.00. This money was used to offset the extra costs of these storms; with the rest of the money used to do some much needed work to Verney Road in the late summer.

The spring months of 2005 were the beginning of the excess amounts of rainfall. Normal rainfall for April through June is around 10 inches; we received just over 17 inches of rain. This unusual amount of rain delayed most of our spring work by a month or so. We finally completed the spring grading in the first weeks of May; we were able to add additional crush gravel to about ¹/₂ mile of South Elmwood Road, and in June we were able to start our summer maintenance program on Link Road and Elmwood Road.

The summer months of July, August and September were near normal. We completed our paving program on Link and Elmwood, we graded the gravel roads that were getting rough and potholed, and we installed the new curbing and sidewalk in front of the Library for the VPC, as well as in front of Fiddleheads for the Select Board. With the end of September we were finally back on track and out of the excessive rain we had been seeing, or so we thought. In July we took delivery of our new 6-wheeler that was approved at town meeting. Albert is still driving it with a big smile on his face. Speaking of Albert, at the end of September Albert completed his 25th year as an employee for the Highway Department, congratulations Albert.

The first weekend in October was a beautiful fall weekend. I remember it well because it was the last weekend that I, or my crew, would have off until November. During the month of October, most of us at the Highway Department had 3 days off, the 1st, 2nd and 30th. On October 8th the rain started and did not stop until October 9th. Now we have had 2 days of rain before, but I do not believe we have ever had 7.5 inches of rain in a 2-day period. It did not take long for the calls to start coming in. Around 9:30 PM on Saturday night I was called by Hancock Police and informed that the Cavender Road Bridge had collapsed. This bridge collapse left three Hancock families stranded on the other side. We had no way to get to them by vehicle, and they had no way to get out by vehicle. By the time the rain ended, we had flooding and washouts on Depot Road, Willard Pond Road, Jaquith Road, Longview Road, Antrim Road, Cavender Road and Kimball Road. Needless to say, we spent the next week repairing roads, replacing culverts and clearing ditches and water bars.

We completed the worst of the repairs at noon on Friday, October 14, 2005. On October 15, 2005, the rain started again, this time dumping 4.25 inches over a 36 hours period. By noontime on Saturday, almost all of last weeks work had washed out, and roads that were not affected the week before, were experiencing washouts or flooding. When October was all over, we saw just over 15 inches of rain for the month. Although Hancock had suffered some damage to our Road Network, and we did activate our Emergency Operation Center for a period on the 15th, we were spared the devastation that plagued some of neighbors to the West. I can't begin to imagine what they went through.

As a result of the flooding, Hillsborough County was declared a disaster area, and this allowed us to request funding from FEMA for the costs we incurred as a result of the flooding. We received two disbursements from FEMA by the end of 2005. The first disbursement totaled \$51,634.00 and went to reimburse us for expenses we incurred on our roads, work we still have to complete, and mitigation money to upgrade some culverts and ditches to better handle large run-off. We still have some work to complete, and this money was carried forward into 2006 for that purpose.

The second disbursement was for \$71,664.00. This was to cover the installation of the temporary bridge on Cavender Road, and begin the design of the new bridge for installation in 2006. The replacement of this bridge is covered under the FEMA declaration. FEMA will pay 75% of construction costs, the State of NH will pay 20% of construction cost, and we will need to pay 5% of the construction cost. I am planning on using our own work force and equipment, as much as possible, to cover our 5% share. The end result should be a new bridge on Cavender Road without raising additional funds through tax dollars.

The floods of 2005 will be remembered for a long time, and one of the best memories I will have will be the way that the Town of Hancock, its citizens and employees, all worked together for the benefit of the Town. The crew of the Highway Department worked over 900 hours during the month of October, a time when they typically work only 640 hours during the month. Their dedication is greatly appreciated. The Fire Department and the Police Department also assisted us with road closures and filling sand bags. We received a tremendous amount of help from our local contractors, Mathewson Companies, Landsite Corporation, and Hardwick and Sons. During the weekend of October 15th, we had supper prepared for us by Jennifer Grassett, and Pat Higgins provided breakfast the next morning. We also received many letters and words of thanks and appreciation from citizens of Hancock. The NH Department of Transportation provided and assisted with the installation of the temporary bridge on Cavender Road. A big thanks to all of you, this is what makes Hancock a wonderful place.

The month of November was spent cleaning up from October and trying to get all our fall work done before winter. We got most of the grading completed before the ground froze, but we were not able to get it all. The first snow came on November 24, with another one 2 days later. Winter had finally arrived. December started off bitterly cold, with some morning temperatures well below zero. By Christmas temperatures had moderated and we experienced 40 degree temperatures and rain on Christmas night. By the end of 2005, we had 26 winter weather events, and a total yearly rainfall of over 65 inches. A normal year is about 41 inches. 2005 saw rainfall that was 2 feet above normal.

I would like to thank all the residents for your continued support, the Select Board for their guidance and support, the Fire Department, the Police Department, as well as Barb and Linda for their help and support. I would also like to thank the dedicated employees of the Highway Department, 2005 was an extremely busy year and they met the challenge head on with a professional, dedicated work ethic.

REPORT OF THE HANCOCK FIRE DEPARTMENT

Three big trucks at the bottom of Nubanusit in three days – that was the headline for 2005. Drivers unfamiliar with the variable ice conditions on Nubie crashed through the ice in early February; thankfully, none of them were injured. Eventually all three vehicles were winched up and brought to shore with minimal environmental damage to our pristine lake. We hope that ice fishermen will be more vigilant this year!

In all, Hancock Fire Department members logged 1,366 hours on 136 calls in 2005. A large number of these calls were Mutual Aid responses to surrounding towns. We also dealt with the usual assortment of ambulance calls, chimney fires, power lines down, and motor vehicle accidents. We had a few fires in town in 2005, but these were relatively minor, and knocked down before they caused much damage. Someone started a fire on the last remaining timbers of the railroad trestle at Antrim Road, and we were forced to cut the beams down for safety reasons.

Early October brought record rainfall and flooding to Hancock. Although we dodged the devastation and deaths suffered by other towns, there was significant damage to some of our roads, which limited our access to parts of town. For one day, we activated an Emergency Operations Center at the fire station to stay on top of the situation. We are happy to report that operations and communications between the various town departments worked very smoothly.

Our firefighters attended 652 hours of in-house training in 2005. In addition, Tom Ball completed a comprehensive 200 hour firefighting class, and Ellen Moran became our newest EMT. Bill Eva and Kurt Grassett donated their time to train a few more members to get a Commercial Drivers License (CDL). A big Thank You goes to all members for their time and effort.

In March, we held a brief recognition ceremony for the four Conval students who helped out at a bad car crash on Rt. 202 in 2004. We are proud of the fact that several of them have joined area fire departments since then.

We welcomed two new members in 2005 – Nick Gervasio and Rob Nash, Jr. Captain Dwayne Denehy has moved out of state and resigned his position. Our captains are now Mark Thompson, Tom Bates, and Jon Grosjean. We should also recognize the services of Becky Lohmiller as our Secretary and Treasurer, and Hunt Dowse as the President of the H.F.D. Association.

At the present time, we seem to be holding steady with our personnel. Looking ahead however, our membership is not getting any younger...Small volunteer departments like ours are experiencing increasing difficulty retaining and maintaining a healthy number of available firefighters, particularly during the day time hours. As always, we would welcome any interested applicants, male or female, ages 18 and up to consider joining our ranks.

Our new Rescue Truck has been ordered and we hope to have it in service by early summer. Thanks to the residents who gave so generously to our Letter of Appeal, and HFD Association funds from our raffles and chicken barbeques, we were able to purchase the \$120,000 truck without using tax money. We have traditionally maintained our two smaller trucks and our boat in this fashion.

This year, we are looking to replace our oldest engine – a 1985 Ford pumper. Our four big trucks are on a twenty year rotation schedule as part of the town's Capital Improvement Plan; this keeps our fleet in relatively good shape, and keeps payments spread out evenly. A committee has spec'ed out an efficient new pumper that should serve the town for many years. This truck will meet all current National Fire Protection Association requirements, as well as satisfy the insurance industry requirements, which will help keep homeowner's insurance premiums down.

Looking ahead, we are moving towards a paperless electronic incident reporting system in 2006. We have set up a new computer and DSL line in the station, and will be training our personnel in the use of these systems. We are almost ready to launch our Fire Department website, to be linked with the town's website. This should be a good source for information regarding our operations and members, brush burning information, etc. It will include a few photographs, both old and new.

In closing, we would like to again thank all of our firefighters for their hard work and dedication, and the townspeople of Hancock for their continued support.

Report of the Fire Wardens

Hancock had no problems with brushfires in 2005, as it was quite a damp year – more than 24 inches of rainfall over the average year. We are grateful that Hancock landowners have abided by the rules and regulations concerning brush burning. Please remember these key points: You must have a written permit to burn brush, unless there is adequate snow cover. You can only burn clean material, with no limbs bigger than 5 inches in diameter. Burn piles should be monitored by an adult at all times, with resources to contain and/or extinguish the fire if needed. Fires are allowed only between 5 PM and 9 AM, unless it is raining. More information is available at the Town Office, or you may contact a warden. Your cooperation is greatly appreciated.



Report of Forest Fire Warden and State Forest Ranger

Your local Forest Fire Warden, Fire Department, and the State of New Hampshire Division of Forests & Lands work collaboratively to reduce the risk and frequency of wildland fires in New Hampshire. To help us assist you, please contact your local Forest Fire Warden or Fire Department to determine if a permit is required before doing <u>ANY</u> outside burning. A fire permit is required for all outside burning unless the ground is completely covered with snow. The New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services also prohibits the open burning of household waste. Citizens are encouraged to contact the local fire department or DES at 1-800-498-6868 or <u>www.des.state.nh.us</u> for more information. Safe open burning requires diligence and responsibility. Help us to protect New Hampshire's forest resources. For more information please contact the Division of Forests & Lands at (603) 271-2217, or online at www.nhdfl.org.

Fire activity was high during the first several weeks of the 2005 fire season, with red-flag conditions issued by the National Weather Service and extreme fire danger in the southern and central portions of the state. This period of increased initial attack activity prompted a 5-day ban on open burning, the first such ban in several years. Despite the dry conditions, the state's largest wildland fire was contained at 29 acres. Our statewide system of fire lookout towers is credited with keeping the fires small and saving several structures this season due to their quick and accurate spotting capabilities. Fires in the wildland urban interface damaged 10 structures, a constant reminder that forest fires burn more than just trees. Homeowners should take measures to prevent a wildland fire from spreading to their home. Precautions include keeping your roof and gutters clear of leaves and pine needles, and maintaining adequate green space around your home free of flammable materials. HANCOCK WATER DEPARTMENT ANNUAL REPORT - 2005

January started out very mild and the last two weeks were very cold and snowy. We had good snow cover by mid March, which is good for spring melt and runoff.

In March, our monthly sample came back positive, but several samples immediately following were all good, as were all our other tests.

The hydrant at the intersection of Old Dublin Road and Main Street was replaced and relocated in April.

We had no major breaks in our system during the year. We had a small break on Wilder Road and one at the intersection of Antrim Road and Norway Hill. These were promptly repaired by the Highway Department.

We had to replace both the high and low flow transmitters at the chlorinator building. This was expensive (\$6,000.00), but necessary to continue to supply the town with a good product. We also had to make some extensive repairs to our back-up generator and two injection pumps.

During the third quarter, we conducted our required tests for halocetic acids and trihalomethanes. The test results came back well below the maximum contaminant level.

We had a relatively dry summer, but this was followed by a very wet October. The year was wetter than normal and this more than filled our reservoir as we headed into winter.

All in all, our system operates well, despite its age, as we continue to supply the town with good potable water.

WELFARE OFFICER'S REPORT

In 2005, \$ 6,785.00 was expended for welfare on behalf of qualified applicants. This total is \$4,000.00 less than what was spent last year for welfare recipients. This is due to the relocation of some recipients, others who became eligible to receive aid under State programs, and others who found employment. As in past years, the majority of assistance went towards housing, food, and fuel. For information on where to get help with food or fuel assistance, or to find out what other state or local resources are available, you may contact the Town Office.

Helping Hands is an important resource for anyone in the community who needs assistance, but may not qualify for welfare under the Hancock Welfare Guidelines. The fund expends monies to help Hancock residents with food, rent, fuel oil, repairs, Christmas gifts, medication, and other expenses. This year, sixteen individuals/ families received help for Christmas. Thank you to the individuals, organizations and other donors who have given so generously to the Hancock Helping Hands Fund during the year. I would also like to thank the Bennington Catholic Church for all of their work in providing Easter and Thanksgiving Baskets to Hancock residents. Also, thank you to the Peterborough Rotary Club for their sponsorship of Operation Santa. They helped to make a happy Christmas for some of our less fortunate Hancock families. Our community continues to be a place of caring.

HEALTH OFFICER'S REPORT

The New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services (DES) has requested that municipalities in New Hampshire urge owners of residential wells to test the water quality of their wells. According to DES, drinking water from private wells in New Hampshire may sometimes contain contaminants, such as radon and arsenic, which can occur naturally in our state's bedrock at levels that can pose health risks. A water quality test, by a competent laboratory, can assure that your family is protected. Water quality testing will reduce needless health risks to residents and water quality data can help guide town planning efforts. Empty sample bottles can now be sent directly to homeowners by requesting them on line at the web site listed below. For anyone that does not have access to a computer, requests can be made here at the Town Office. To request a sample bottle or for further information, please visit the N.H. Department of Environmental Services' web site at www.des.state.nh.us/wseb, then select "fact sheets," then 2-1.

The Town Office also has information available on topics such as "Eastern Equine Encephalitis", "Symptoms of West Nile Virus" and "Reducing the Risk of Infection from Mosquitoes Around Your Home and Community."

CEMETERY TRUSTEES REPORT 2005

Hancock has three cemeteries, Pine Ridge (to the left of Route 123, Stoddard Road heading west), Norway Plains (behind the Meeting House and Vestry), and Hillside (on the right side of Bennington Road, just a mile from Main Street). So many people are unsure of how many and where, it seemed timely to bring the matter up.

Pine Ridge is our oldest cemetery and there is no more space available. Norway Plains has no further full burial plots available for sale. There are a good number of ash burials or cremation plots still available. Hillside has both full and ash burial plots available. If anyone is interested, the Cemetery Sexton, Kurt Grassett, can provide all necessary information.

The Cemetery Trustees this year adopted two new rules affecting all cemeteries. First of all, because of repeated and uncontrollable offenses (failure to clean up after dogs) particularly at Norway Plains, the Trustees have adopted a rule banning any pet from all cemeteries, whether leashed or not.

Secondly, artificial decorations, or grave adorriments, will not be permitted within Hancock Cemeteries. It is difficult to know where to draw the line in this matter. We looked at it from the community point of view that the cemeteries be maintained in respectful propriety.

Again, this year, the Cemeteries have been able to operate within a budget with funds derived from fees from sale of plots, burial fees, and income from Cemetery Trust funds. And again this year, we thank Kurt Grassett, Sexton, for innovative and resourceful management of these assets of Hancock.

2005 RECYLING (DUMP) COMMITTEE REPORT

Recycling continues to be our most effective way to manage our costs at the Transfer Station and Recycling Center. During 2005, we recycled 216 tons of material, a substantial increase over 2004. Add the approximately 50 cubic yards of glass that was recycled, and our recycling total is just over 250 tons which generated over \$17,307. By depositing recyclables over the counter, instead of in the compactor, we avoided over \$24,000 in tipping fees. Recycling does pay.

Recycling not only pays us, it pays the environment as well. Estimates from the Northeast Resource Recovery Association show just how beneficial recycling is. In 2005, the 2,650 pounds of aluminum cans we recycled through them saved enough energy to run a television for 269,664 hours. The 157 tons of paper resulted in 2,669 trees that did not have to be cut. The 6 tons of plastic conserved oil that was equivalent to 9,000 gallons of gasoline. The 63 tons of scrap metal conserved 63,000 pounds of coal, and the 13,500 pounds of tin cans conserved enough energy to run a 60-watt light bulb for 351,000 hours. Recycling is a great way to reduce our dependence on fossil fuels.

Although our recycling rate is fantastic, we still threw garbage into the compactor, but only an increase of 1 ton over 2004. The substantial increase in recycling, as compared to the minor increase in the compactor use shows that Hancock residents prefer to recycle. This is why the net result of the 2006 Transfer Station budget will have less of a tax impact than the 2005 budget year did. Keep up the good work.

During 2005, we were able to start taking Freon containing appliances at the Recycling Center. From the time we began the service in May until the end of the year, we took in just over 50 appliances. We are happy to report this new service is working well and has saved the residents who used it over \$1,500. For those residents who need to drop off a Freon containing appliance, please see Cathy first. She will take payments and give you a receipt, and then Dick will help you unload in the proper area.

During the summer of 2005, we again contracted with the City of Keene for our Household Hazardous Waste Collections. We did switch the time from spring to the summer, and we were able to receive some grant money from the State of New Hampshire to help defray the cost. Twelve collection dates were provided, and all reports from the residents who have used the service have been positive. We will again be offering this service in the summer of 2006.

During the fall, we had to make a change with the way our Swap Shop was being operated. During the summer months the volunteers who were trying to keep the Swap Shop neat and clean were finding all kinds of items that did not belong: hazardous waste and oil based paint, latex paint, moldy books, food beyond its expiration date, unacceptable furniture, and broken items. It was taking a tremendous amount of time to dispose of the junk, and a pretty hefty cost to dispose of the unacceptable material. The Recycling Committee considered many options, including closing the Swap Shop completely. A group of volunteers offered to staff the Swap Shop during business hours, and act as a filter to insure only good, workable, clean items appear in the Swap Shop. After an initial adjustment period, we are seeing a big difference and the place looks fantastic! Thank you to the Swap Shop volunteers; you have turned a problem into a benefit. For those patrons who wish to drop items off, please speak with one of the volunteers first. They have been at this long enough and know which items will be useful and which ones will not get picked up. Cooperation from everyone will insure that the Swap Shop remains a clean, viable alternative for those items that are still usable and in good shape.

The Transfer Station and Recycling Center had a record-breaking successful year. The net tax burden to dispose of our waste has actually decreased due to the interest and dedication of all our users participating in recycling. We are grateful for the dedication and knowledge of Cathy, Dick and Garrett who operate the facility cheerfully and efficiently. We thank the Select Board for their support in implementing changes to improve our operation. We are always open to suggestions or questions – please contact the attendants or call the Highway Department at 525-5087.

HANCOCK PLANNING BOARD 2005 REPORT

During 2005, the Planning Board considered and approved 2 minor subdivision applications and one application for a boundary line adjustment. We also attended to several minor matters such as modifying conditions of a prior approval and approving a new plat for filing. We did not receive any applications for major subdivisions or for site plan review of any commercial buildings. We also met with owners and others on numerous occasions to give preliminary consideration and advice.

Our major work during the year was the comprehensive revision of the town Zoning Ordinance and Historic District Ordinance, both of which have now been formally proposed to Town Meeting for adoption. The Board considered various provisions of these proposals at some over 25 meetings during the year and conducted two formal public hearings. We also carried out extensive correspondence, research and consultation with our town attorneys, various town boards, the building inspector, the regional planning commission and others.

In July, Doug Bowen – a member of the Board for 6 years and its chairman since 2001 – resigned. The Board wishes to thank him for those many years of service and for the calm, practical, straightforward and even-handed way in which he dealt with the issues which came before the Board.

As a result of Doug's resignation, the Selectboard appointed Tom Bates as a new alternate member in September 2005. At the same time, Bobbie Nylander and Mark Stevens became full members of the Board.

Please be thinking of our commitment to serving the community's elderly population when you are deciding what interest groups could benefit from any donations you give this year. We also have plans to get out and spread the word of our project now that we have a lease and some idea of financial backing.

We would like to thank John Jordan, Architect and Chair of the Authority, for donating hours of architectural designs that we hope will come to fruition in the near future. Also, thanks to Phil Mathewson and The Mathewson Companies for spending time and donating money to have the septic plans designed and approved. Without these two donations we would not have been able to get started. Thanks to all of the community members who have encouraged us along the way.

2005 ANNUAL REPORT HANCOCK CONSERVATION COMMISSION

Celebrating its 38th year, the Hancock Conservation Commission is a volunteer group appointed by the Select Board and is responsible for coordinating conservation-related activities. Notably, the Conservation Commission maintains and monitors a Natural Resource Inventory of open spaces, natural, aesthetic and ecologically sensitive areas in Hancock with the objective of acquiring research information necessary to protect and preserve these important natural resources.

In 2005, the townspeople of Hancock approved one warrant article submitted by the Conservation Commission:

 \$4,600 for natural resource data gathering for the Commission, and for activities of the Open Space Committee, including the "Hancock Open Space and Nature Series".

From this funding, two Antioch NE graduate students gathered data on several properties along the Moose Brook corridor, enhancing our understanding of both the plant and animal life using this water corridor that extends from the western highlands to the lowlands of the Contoocook River. The Open Space Committee presented a series of well-attended public lectures during the year on a variety of conservation-related topics. More lectures are planned for 2006.

Among the conservation-related activities, Conval students, as part of an environmental studies class, developed interpretive signs along the Blue and Green dot trails at the Walcott Preserve in order to give hikers a better understanding of the plants and animals in this town-owned 108 acre area. Volunteers began construction of a boardwalk between the fire station and Kepner Meadow in order to improve access to the recreation area from the school.

In April, Francelia Clark directed another successful roadside cleanup with approximately 30 residents helping to remove litter from the town's highways and byways. During Old Home Days, Mark Ellingwood and Lee Baker manned a conservation information booth. Mark exhibited the NH Fish and Game collection of skulls and furs and answered lively questioning. In November, Stephen Froling, Lee Baker, Bill Elliott and Ron Mack attended the NH Conservation Commission Annual Meeting.

Several publications are on hand or under way to help spread information. The Natural Resource Inventory Book has gone into its fourth printing. Stephen Froling has begun to identify and map the trail systems on the Walcott and Norway Pond Nature Preserve lands, using Global Positioning System (GPS) hardware. A packet of information regarding guidelines for timber cuts has been developed for use by landowners when they are applying for a timber-cut permit. Contact the town office for a copy of there guidelines.

Among regular annual business, the Conversation Commission, in conjunction with the Hancock Select Board, reviewed permits for new housing starts, home renovations/additions, logging permits, and wetland permits. All ten conservation easement properties granted to the town were monitored. On town-owned conservation lands, new identifying signs, depicting a Great Horned Owl, were posted on several properties. During 2005, Holly Wilson and Beth Frost left the Commission.Thanks to both for their time and energy.

Hancock residents are encouraged to contact the Conservation Commission if you have any questions or concerns about the natural resources in town. The Commission meets on the second Tuesday of each month at 7 PM in the Daniels Room of the Town Library. The public is invited.

2005 HANCOCK VILLAGE PLANNING COMMITTEE (VPC)

In 2005, the Village Planning Committee oversaw completion of the design study for the historic district, which was performed by Holden Transportation Engineering. This study provides a conceptual plan for improvements in safety, infrastructure and aesthetics that respond to concerns raised by the public. Voters approved a warrant article at the March 2004 town meeting to pay for the study.

Copies of the conceptual plan and design recommendations are available at the town office and the library. The full report is also online at the Hancock town website: www.mv.com/ipusers/hancocknh/. Under the heading, "Vision to Action Forum" click on Village Planning Committee; then, scroll to the bottom of the page. The engineering report is listed under "Other Information."

By the end of 2006, the VPC expects to have a workable timeline for implementing the recommended improvements to the historic district. Before any construction begins, a full survey of the historic district is needed to locate all the bounds of the Hosley Grant (common property owned by the town). Detailed construction drawings are also required. These drawings need to be based on the survey and the conceptual plan. When these items are completed, the VPC will have all the information needed for construction.

To minimize the cost to the town, the VPC is researching grants and is working with the New Hampshire Department of Transportation to secure appropriate state funding that can help the town fund the construction designs.

As funding and schedules are determined, the VPC will keep the public informed through reports in Hancock Happenings.

In 2005, the VPC also oversaw the pruning of trees on Main Street, which was paid for by a warrant article passed at the March 2005 town meeting. At that meeting voters also approved money for a test section of gravel sidewalk and curbing in front of the library.

The VPC is conducting tests of three gravel mixes to see which one will best match the older walkways in front of the Inn, as well as stand up to snow removal and mud season. The three test sections are: 1. Fine gravel held in place by a product called Invisible Structures. Invisible Structures is made of recycled plastic and acts like an egg carton to lock-in the gravel. 2. Plain gravel placed on the appropriate foundation. 3. A gravel base held together by a product called Polypavement, which is a liquid polymer that binds the fine gravel together to form a solid surface. The three different gravel mixes were installed during the summer, but the real test will come this mud season.

For the curbing test, the VPC used an antiqued granite, which has been flame treated to make it look older. We could not find old, rough-cut granite at a price that fit the test budget.

Why test sidewalk surfaces? Other towns have laid down asphalt sidewalks in a country setting, with harsh and unacceptable results. There is no off-the-rack solution for building a durable country path $-a \ 19^{\text{th}}$ Century walkway with some 21^{st} Century materials. The VPC is trying to find a new/old way to provide safe walkways that are in keeping with the rural character of Hancock. Please keep in mind that this is an experiment.

2005 HANCOCK OPEN SPACE COMMITTEE REPORT

The Hancock Open Space Committee (HOSC), a subcommittee of the Conservation Commission, was created in 2002 after a town-sponsored forum identified a concern over preserving Hancock's remaining open space, natural resources and rural character.

In cooperation with other town organizations as well as other towns, we sponsored the third very successful and well attended five part "Open Space and Nature Lecture Series." Topics included "Stonewalls in New England", "Fields and Meadows as Wildlife Habitat", "NH Audubon 21st Century Outlook for Open Space", "Sargent Center for Outdoor Education," and "Lost Village of Hancock; Surviving Stone Foundations".

We have used the Town's website to provide public information compiled by the committee, including the NRI, a map of conservation land in town, conservation easement information, etc.

A good number of people participated in the Old Home Days Parade in a variety of costumes along with good cheer.

Along with the Conservation Commission, a warrant was prepared for the town meeting, which was \$4,600 for use by the Open Space Committee for additional data gathering regarding the natural resources in town.

The Hancock Land Preservation Study Committee, sanctioned by the Select Board and made up of members of the Conservation Commission and Open Space Committee, continued to meet in order to review properties in town that are important regarding natural resource protection. This committee was originally called the Land Action Committee and then the Land Acquisition Committee, eventually ending up as the Land Preservation Study Committee.

We continue efforts to make contact with our neighboring towns regarding issues of land preservation and how we can help each other, sharing information and strategies.

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
