RESULTS OF THE 1984 LISBON WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Lisbon, in said State, qualified to vote in Town and State affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Lisbon Town Hall in said Lisbon on Tuesday the thirteenth day of March next at ten o'clock in the forenoon; at which time polls shall open and not close earlier than nine o'clock in the afternoon to act upon the following subjects except 1 & 2 to be considered at seven-thirty o'clock in the afternoon.

ARTICLE 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the ensuing year.

The following Town Officers were elected:

Moderator - George H. Marshall

Library Trustees - Harold H. Haywood, Dorothy W. Presby

Overseer of Public Welfare - Brenda L. Chase

ARTICLE 2. To hear reports of agents, auditors, and special committees heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.

Town report approved as printed. Vote in affirmative.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes for the current year.

The Town voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes for the current year.

ARTICLE 4. The Town voted to raise and appropriate twenty-one thousand one hundred nine dollars and sixty cents (\$21, 109.60) for Town Road Maintenance and authorize the withdrawal of the amount required for this purpose from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund. (\$19,796.00 Revenue Sharing and \$1,313.60 Interest.)

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges and make appropriations for the same as set forth in the following budget:

Moved and seconded to act upon Article 10 before budget. Voted to discuss Article 10.

ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate increases in the present rate of pay for each member of the Town Highway Department and benefits. (This article by petition)

Motion was made to passover.

Done by ballot. YES - 126 NO - 29.

This article was passed over.

ARTICLE 5. Moved and seconded to accept budget of \$499,871.67. Vote in affirmative.

ARTICLE 6. The Town voted to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell and convey property acquired by Tax Collector's Deeds in accordance with New Hampshire law.

ARTICLE 7. The Town voted to authorize the Selectmen to apply for and receive Federal Disaster Assistance Funds through the State Disaster Coordinating Office and to expend the funds so received to repair the damage to Town Roads and/or bridges caused by any declared emergency and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums as may be necessary to defray the cost of repairing damage in anticipation of Federal Disaster Funds to be received through the State Disaster Coordinating Office.

ARTICLE 8. The Town voted to authorize the Planning Board to adopt site plan review regulations as provided by RSA 674:43.

ARTICLE 9. The Town voted to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed seven thousand five hundred dollars (\$7,500.00) to purchase a new Police Cruiser, and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow, upon credit of the Town a sum not to exceed \$7,500.00 and to issue serial notes of the Town for the cost not to exceed said sum, to be negotiated by them through a bank; the dates, maturities, denomination, the interest rate, and other details of said notes, to be delegated to the discretion of the Selectmen as may be for the best interests of the Town, and as may be necessary, in accordance with the laws of the State; and to authorize the Selectmen to execute said notes and any other papers necessary for the purpose of this article.

ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town of Lisbon shall call upon the Governor and Executive Council, its State Representative(s) and State Senator to promptly convene a Special Session of the Legislature for the sole purpose of preventing the imposition of huge cost increases in electric rates resulting from the Seabrook Nuclear Power Plant on the citizens, businesses, schools and agencies in the Town of Lisbon, and to direct the Selectmen to promptly notify our above listed elected officials of the Town's desire. (This article by petition)

This article was moved and seconded to pass over.

ARTICLE 12. The Town voted to raise and appropriate one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) to assist in the cost of purchasing equipment and defraying maintenance and operation expense of the Outing Club Ski Tow and Slope. (This article by petition)

ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for support of the Community Action Outreach Program. (This article by petition)

This article was moved and seconded to pass over.

ARTICLE 14. The Town voted to accept ownership and upkeep of a piece of property presently owned by Gunthwaite Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution, which consists of land and monument located on Route 302 in the Town of Lisbon.

ARTICLE 15. The Town voted to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply for, accept and expend money from the State, Federal or other governmental unit or a private source which becomes available during the year in accordance with the procedures set forth in R.S.A. 31:95-b.

ARTICLE 16. The Town voted to raise and appropriate the sum of twenty-seven thousand dollars (\$27,000.00) for the purpose of paying the Town's share of the costs of repairing the bridge across the Ammonosuc River on School Street, and for this purpose to authorize the Selectmen to borrow, by the issue of serial notes of the Town in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 33 of New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, being known as the Municipal Finance Act, and any amendment thereto, the sum of twenty-seven thousand dollars (\$27,000.00) and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the time and place of payment and the rate of interest on said notes and do whatever may be necessary or convenient in connection with the issuance thereof.

ARTICLE 17. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Motion made and seconded to print warrant articles and how voted every year in Town Report. Vote in affirmative.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate twenty-two thousand seven hundred thirteen dollars and fifty cents (\$22,713.50) for Town Road Maintenance and authorize the withdrawal of the amount required for this purpose from the Federal Revenue Sharing Fund. (\$21,250.00 Revenue Sharing and \$1,463.50 Interest.)

ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for and receive Federal Disaster Assistance Funds through the State Disaster Coordinating Office and to expend the funds so received to repair the damage to Town Roads and/or bridges caused by any declared emergency and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums as may be necessary to defray the cost of repairing damage in anticipation of Federal Disaster Funds to be received through the State Disaster Coordinating Office.

ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed thirty-three thousand dollars (\$33,000.00) to purchase a new truck for the highway department, and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow, upon credit of the Town a sum not to exceed \$33,000.00 and to issue serial notes of the Town for the cost not to exceed said sum, to be negotiated by them through a bank; the dates, maturities, denomination, the interest rate, and other details of said notes, to be delegated to the discretion of the Selectmen as may be for the best interests of the Town, and as may be necessary, in accordance with the laws of the State; and to authorize the Selectmen to execute said notes and any other papers necessary for the purpose of this article. (To be voted on by ballot)

ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) to assist in the cost of purchasing equipment and defraying maintenance and operation expense of the Outing Club Ski Tow and Slope.

ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) for the revaluation and reassessment of the taxable property in the Town by the Appraisal Division of the Department of Revenue Administration, starting in 1987 or thereafter, and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow, upon credit of the Town a sum not to exceed \$30,000.00 and to issue serial notes of the Town for the cost not to exceed said sum, to be negotiated through a bank; the dates, maturities, denomination, the interest rate, and other details of said notes, to be delegated to the discretion of the Selectmen as may be for the best interests of the Town, and as may be necessary, in accordance with the laws of the State; and to authorize the Selectmen to execute said notes and any other papers necessary for the purpose of this article. (To be voted on by ballot)

ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed seven thousand dollars (\$7,000.00) for the purpose of purchase and installation of a fire alarm system for the protection of the Town building and contents, including the complete fire and police department, which has a replacement value of approximately \$400,000.00; and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow, upon credit of the Town a sum not to exceed \$7,000.00

and to issue serial notes of the Town for said sum, to be negotiated by them through a bank; the dates, maturities, denomination, the interest rate, and other details of said notes, to be delegated to the discretion of the Selectmen as may be for the best interests of the Town, and as may be necessary, in accordance with the laws of the State; and to authorize the Selectmen to execute said notes and any other papers necessary for the purpose of this article. (This article by petition - to be voted on by ballot)

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for support of the Community Action Outreach Program. (This article by request)

ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one hundred-fifty dollars (\$150.00) for the Upper Valley Senior Citizens Council, Inc. (This article by request)

ARTICLE 14. To see if the voters of Lisbon will authorize the Selectmen to spend up to sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000.00) as the Town's share of the installation cost of the Lisbon Community Area Flood Prevention Measure, and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow, upon credit of the Town a sum not to exceed \$60,000.00 and to issue serial notes of the Town for the cost not to exceed said sum, to be negotiated by them through a bank; the dates, maturities, denomination, the interest rate, and other details of said notes, to be delegated to the discretion of the Selectmen as may be for the best interests of the Town, and as may be necessary, in accordance with the laws of the State; and to authorize the Selectmen to execute said notes and any other papers necessary for the purpose of this article. (To be voted on by ballot)

ARTICLE 15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply for, accept and expend money from the State, Federal or other governmental unit or a private source which becomes available during the year in accordance with the procedures set forth in R.S.A. 31:95-b.

ARTICLE 16. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

LISBON FIRE DEPARTMENT

We were busier this year - overall calls numbered 101 (up from 92 in 1983) and chimney fires were 24, an increase from 18 in 1983.

Twenty-six calls were alarm calls, emphasizing again the importance of smoke detectors and fire extinguishers. Kerosene heaters remain a dangerous item, both from the standpoint of fire safety and general health because of the hazardous conditions when burned in an enclosed area. I remind everyone that these devices are not allowed in any commercial building or rented area.

A few of our calls were outstanding. Structure fires at the Caswell Farm, Mini-Mart, and the Town Garage, and a dramatic river rescue to help save two young men last spring were all attributed to the skill and cooperation of the people who make up our department.

Training of personnel remained an important part of our program. Nine people completed 90 hours for certification. A house donated by Donald Clough for training with air has been a great help to us. One training session was devoted to helicopter rescue.

In addition to the many hours the members of the department put in for fire service and training, many of them take on the added responsibility of planning and working on fund raising events to help us maintain and buy equipment and improve and maintain our quarters. We appreciate the support from the citizens of Lisbon and surrounding communities for our dances, raffles, Lilac Time barbeque, and others. We are especially thankful to those who made donations either because of personal interest, or for memorials.

Our town was reviewed by ISO Commercial Risk Services, Inc. for insurance rating purposes. No report has yet been issued, but we were able to respond affirmatively to recommendations and improvement required from our previous evaluation.

It is especially gratifying to me when new candidates appear who are willing to make the commitment that is required for training and service, and we were fortunate to add Christopher Hartwell, Gerald Houston, Mark Humphreys, and Walter Johnson to our roster. The complete list is:

REPORT OF FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST RANGER

Our first forest fire prevention law was enacted by our State Legislature 90 years ago. This early law set in place a cooperative forest fire prevention and suppression effort between city and town governments and State government. It simply stated that no open fire could be kindled, when the ground is free of snow, without the written permission of the town/city Forest Fire Warden. This law also stated that anyone kindling a fire without written permission shall be liable for the damage caused and subject to a \$1000 fine.

During the past 90 years, this law has worked so well that it has remained unchanged. All open fires when the ground is not covered with snow must be authorized by the local Forest Fire Warden. Persons kindling a fire without a permit when one is required are liable for damages caused, fire suppression costs and subject to a \$1000 fine.

This cooperative fire prevention law has contributed significantly to our nationally recognized annual forest fire loss record.

LISBON PLANNING BOARD AND BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

In 1984 the Lisbon Planning Board considered and approved four subdivision applications, reviewed ten notices of intent, and renewed two gravel pit permits. Study has continued on the proposed dike to prevent flooding of Main Street. Installation of the hydro plant has eliminated the alternative of lowering the dam for flood protection; options left are building a dike or living with the flooding. No progress has been made on the problems with sewage disposal and future development of Hodge Hill. Improving the permit system has been studied, but the present "Intent" system will continue until a better method is devised.

The Board of Adjustment considered and approved one special exception, two variances, and conditionally approved the expansion of a non-conforming use.

The Planning Board meets the third Tuesday of each month unless otherwise noticed. The Board of Adjustment meets at the call of the chairman (for hearings) and when necessary to elect officers. All meetings and records are open to public inspection. The Boards' finances are handled as one since there is no appropriation for the Board of Adjustment.

GRAFTON COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

Grafton County Commissioners submit the following report in a continued effort to communicate with you on a more direct basis.

The county fiscal year 1985 tax rate to towns increased by 6.76%, mainly due to increased liabilities and mandates for services. One reason is that the child placement budget has escalated from \$40,000 in fiscal year 1982 to over \$250,000 in fiscal year 1985. These costs are a direct result of RSA 169 when towns succeeded in getting laws changed to place financial responsibility on the counties. Also, the settlement statute, RSA 164, was changed regarding accumulating days for settlement, so that once the County has liability, the liability now remains with the County indefinitely. In addition, as experienced by towns and cities, the cost of nursing care has rapidly increased because of reduced federal and state funding, and will continue to increase at the local level with property taxes funding more of these services in the future.

We anticipate some budget relief with the new unified court system as soon as total costs of the court operations are fully funded by the State as intended in the legislation.

Because of the increasing unfunded mandated services and the unknown nature of federal and state participation in those mandated services, it becomes more difficult each year to budget in a realistic manner - a problem shared in common with towns and cities.

We are continuing energy conservation measures, with appreciable cost savings to the taxpayers. Window modification, with a five year payback, is one of our long term conservation measures, as well as modification to the heating control system.

Correctional needs and facilities are continually monitored and reviewed to comply with current standards and regulations. Studies have been completed and new construction was not recommended at this time.

In accordance with federal revenue sharing requirements, all county facilities and services are regularly reviewed for compliance with handicap regulations.

The Commissioners hold regular weekly meetings every Monday and encourage public attendance. Grafton County budget is processed through May and June and the Commissioners welcome input and strongly recommend your attendance at the public hearing normally held in mid-June.

We appreciate your continued interest and support.

NORTH COUNTRY COUNCIL REPORT

Calendar year 1984 saw the North Country Council, Inc. observe its twelfth year of successful operation for towns in the North Country. The Council, as a regional, non-profit, public planning agency chartered under NH RSA 36:45, is responsible for providing assistance in local community planning, economic development, solid waste, transportation, and municipal services.

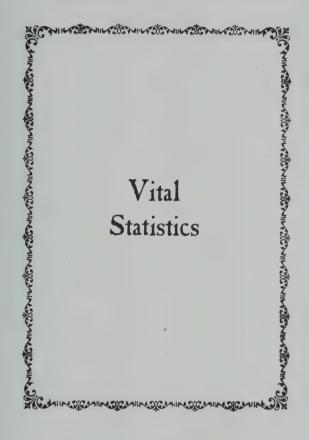
In Lisbon, we've continued to work on the Solid Waste District Plan for the Lisbon-Landaff-Lyman District, including a review of the septage disposal situation. We also provided technical assistance to the Planning Board on subdivision and zoning matters.

In economic development, the Council hosted in the spring two region-wide economic development conferences with over 200 business, industry and government leaders attending. From the conferences, regional strategies were developed to address such issues as highway improvements, air service, regional promotion, mechanisms for regional communication, development funding, and regional job expansion. As an outgrowth of these conferences, the Council is presently coordinating the preparation of a North Country Videotape project, which, when complete, will examine the potential for industry to locate in the North Country. The Videotape will be available to Chambers of Commerce, local development corporations, and municipalities in order to promote their communities to businesses looking to expand or relocate in the North Country.

The Council has provided information and guidance to several towns on federal and state grant and loan programs. This past year saw well over \$2.0 million in Community Development Block Grant funds come to the region for such activities as housing rehabilitation, water and sewer system improvements, a downtown revitalization study, an industrial park feasibility study, and business revolving loan funds.

Community planning assistance has emphasized master planning and improvement in local land use controls. New state mandates and commercial and residential growth in several towns have created busy work loads for planning boards. The Council's assistance takes many forms: regional workshops, newsletters, regulation review and update, and assistance on a regular or one-time basis for subdivision and site plan applications. Subdivision review workshops were held in Littleton, Campton, and Dalton and we co-sponsored the Municipal Law Lecture Series in Twin Mountain.

Overall, the Council's major objective is to work with North Country towns in solving local and regional problems. We rely on and appreciate the involvement of town officials and residents and look forward to assisting your town this coming year.
