SCHOOL REPORT.

During the year just ended there were seven schools of one hundred and forty-seven weeks.

That more has not been accomplished is not the fault of the teachers, for they have been untiring in their efforts to make the schools successful, and the results have been more satisfactory than usual.

During the last term there were eighty-two scholars enrolled, an increase of eight from the term before. The number of absences during this term will surprise many, there being 1,103 half days. Whose fault is this? The best results can hardly be expected of a school whose daily absences average one third of its membership.

Parents and friends showed a good degree of interest in the school work, there being two hundred and seventy-three visits during the year, forty-eight being by the committee.

What was needed of the funds so generously appropriated by the town for repairs, was used in painting the inside of Putney Hill and Pleasant Street schoolhouses, and other necessary repairs.
