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To the inhabitants of the Town of Whitefield, in the County of Coos and State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in town affairs. You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Town, on Tuesday, the fourteenth of March next, at nine o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

  - g. Health department and Vital Statistics.

3. To see if the Town will vote to grant to the Woman's Study Club, American Legion, Public School (under proper supervision) and other organizations for public purposes the free use of the Town Hall.
  4. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow money by temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.
  5. To see if the Town will authorize the selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through tax collector's deeds, or otherwise.
  6. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid Construction, and raise money for same.
  7. To transact any other business that may lawfully come before the meeting.

We wish to explain the Town Report as set up this year.

Under assets years past, the Factory Buildings were entered as such from twenty to thirty thousand dollars.

We have thus made up a Schedule of Town Property and placed the Factory Buildings with other Town Property, under which you will find the total Town Debt.



We received this year about \$2,000.00 less on Income estimates, and paid out about \$2,500.00 more on account of poor relief caused by unemployment, than was raised by taxation, thereby making a deficit of \$2,413.20, at the end of this year.

Our unpaid taxes have been increasing from \$2,643.33 in 1929 to \$7,036.30 in 1932. The Gardner Pad Co., has been unable to pay their account which, has decreased our cash and caused us to borrow more money.

Our Budget this year has been reduced from \$37,045.87 in 1930 to \$25,565.00, or about 30 percent.
