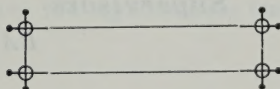
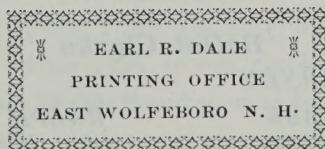

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

*To the inhabitants of the town of Brookfield in the (L. S.)
County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Brookfield on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

[1] To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.

[2] To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.

[3] To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid and appropriate money for the same.

[4] To see if the Town will vote to purchase a snow plow before the winter 1928 to cost not less than \$2,000.⁰⁰ and not more than \$8,000.⁰⁰ said plow to be paid for in 1929-1930 - 1931 - 1932 - 1933, and if necessary to pay cash in full, Selectmen shall have the right to issue long term notes covering same.

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[5] To see if the Town will vote to appropriate \$600.⁰⁰ for town poor.

School Report

Superintendent's Report

To the School Board of Brookfield:

Gentlemen,- It is my privilege to submit to you, and through you to the citizens of the town, my ninth annual report as superintendent of the schools of Brookfield.

The usual statistics relating to the schools will be found in the following table.

Our record for attendance shown by this table is superior. It has not been equalled at any time in the past nine years and probably never. Our per cent (97.32) is 1.57 % higher than for the preceding year and is 2.75 % higher than the average for the entire state.

The following pupils have not been absent nor tardy for one or two terms as indicated. No pupil had perfect attendance for the full year.

Three pupils completed the work of the eighth grade last June: Nellie Clark, Gladys Hooper, Marion Drew. One of these entered Brewster Academy and one entered Nute High School last September.

We are fortunate in having no change in teachers for the present school year. Mrs. Willey continues in charge of Churchill School for the ninth successive year and Miss Eldridge is serving her second year at Stoneham.

The expense of the District for transportation and elementary school tuition in other towns will be larger this year. One new family moved into a remote section of Brookfield where transportation to one of our own schools was impossible. Two children from this family are being transported to East Wolfeboro. Another family settled in a locality from which it seemed best to send the children to Wakefield Corner.

To offset this increased cost, however, we shall receive tuition from two Wakefield children who are attending Stoneham School and shall receive more aid from the state.

Our thanks are again extended to Mr. Wallace C. Wright for supplying Churchill School, at his own expense, with milk for a free lunch during the forenoon recess.

During the past summer the interior and exterior of Churchill School was painted. The same thing should be done at Stoneham next summer. The latter building really needs a new floor, but I advise that this work be postponed for one or two years.

Mrs. Agnes T. Weeks has continued in charge of special health work in the schools. Her report will follow.
