(As far as known February 14)

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town officers for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the year ensuing and make appropriations of the same.

Article 3. To see how much money the Town will raise and appropriate for the Abbie Greenleaf Library, and for the salary of the Librarian.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to apply to the State for State Aid and Trunk Line Aid and Maintenance for our highways for the coming year; and to raise and appropriate money for the same.

Article 5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of highways and bridges for the year ensuing.

Article 6. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial Day and to choose an agent to receive the same.

Article 7. To see how much money, if any, the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for oiling our roads.

Article 8. To see how much money the Town will raise and appropriate for lighting the streets for the coming year.

Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to extend our cement sidewalks and raise funds for the same.

Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money, not exceeding \$150.00 to be expended under the direction of the Selectmen, in cooperation with State and Federal Agents, in the work of preventing the spread of the Pine Blister Rust.

Article 11. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a suitable sum for the purpose of buying a Bronze Honor Roll or other suitable memorial for our boys in "The World War."
