# Warrant for the Annual Town Meeting March 12, 1929

#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the town of Brookfield in the (L.S.) County of Carroll in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Brookfield on Tuesday, the twelfth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- [1] To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- [2] To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.
- [3] To see if the Town will vote to close the Public Library.
- [4] To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid and appropriate money for the same.
- [5] To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid at the rate of 4 to 1 on bill pending in State Legislature. This article subject to passage of bill.
- [6] To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint such Highway Surveyor or Surveyors as they deem necessary.
- [7] To see if the Town will vote to give a 2% discount on taxes paid on or before August 1st of each year.

- [8] To see if the Town will vote to raise money to paint the Town Hall, and shingle the shed.
- [9] To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Gentlemen, - It is my privilege to submit to you, and through you to the citizens of the town, my tenth annual report as superintendent of the schools of Brookfield.

Our record for per cent of attendance excels even our high record for the preceding year. I doubt whether any town in the state has a better record.

Our corps of teachers is the same as last year. The District is to be congratulated upon this fact.

The Stoneham school opened last August with ten pupils enrolled. Four of these reside in Wakefield. Since that time one family has moved from Brookfield removing four of the pupils from this school. Of the present enrollment of six, only two live in Brookfield.

Three Brookfield children are attending school at Wakefield Corner and one in Wolfeboro.

Mr. Wallace C. Wright is again supplying the Churchill School with milk for a free lunch during the forenoon recess. Mr. Wright, we thank you.

The Stoneham building was renovated both inside and outside during the summer vacation. Our next move in the way of improvement should be consideration of the possibility of providing the Churchill School with more modern and more comfortable furniture.

Medical inspection in the schools has been continued by Mrs. Agnes T. Weeks. Her report will follow.

Arrangements were made last May for the children of Brookfield to share in the opportunity of receiving free treatment for the prevention of diphtheria at the toxin-antitoxin clinics held at Sanbornville. I am pleased to say that all but two or three pupils of the Churchill School availed themselves of the opportunity.
