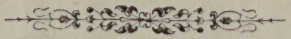

→ BOARD OF EDUCATION. ←

At the close of another year it becomes the pleasant duty of your School Board, to report the prosperous condition of our Schools. We think the Teachers have all endeavored to be faithful to their Trust, and if any have failed to give perfect satisfaction, in every particular it was not for the lack of interest on their part. If there be any School that has not been so successful in all its branches as we might wish, we trust the coming year with the united effort of teachers and scholars guided by wise council from parents and friends, will find such to be the best School in Town.

We would have the Scholars know that their committee are interested in them, in their efforts to prepare themselves for useful lives as Men and Women, also in their pleasure and happiness as Children.

We want to ask each boy and girl to make their school-room the most attractive place in town. Girls, ornament and decorate it as you would like to see the rooms in your own house made attractive. Boys, plant trees and make pleasant the surroundings.

Ask the Town to keep the house freshly painted white, with green blinds on every window. Why may we not hear the School Houses in our town, spoken of as models for others to copy

We would like to tell the girls, of the good they may do by interesting their brothers and playmates, in beautifying their School Rooms, the refining influence of which would last their whole lives.

The School at Centre Harbor Village, was taught the first term of nine weeks by Miss Julia E. True a very superior teacher.

The other two terms of ten and seven weeks, by Miss Edith L. Swain, and we will only say, that we hope the Board may be as fortunate in the selection of teachers for this school the coming year. Whole number of registered Scholars 44.

The School near the Town House, was taught by Miss Sarah P. Quimby the first two terms, and Daniel F. Webster the last term, both of whom are highly esteemed by the committee.

In perfect attendance were Emma J. Webster, John E. Canny. Number of weeks taught 24. Number of registered Scholars 17.

We hope and trust to see this, the Banner School in town the coming year.

The School near David Cram's was taught by Mrs. Mary. N. Perkins, of whom your Committee cannot speak too highly.

The School, though small shows an unusual degree of intelligence and good training. Those in perfect attendance the first term were, Elida L. Boynton, Charles A. Clark, Chester A. Clark, Willie L. This School we believe to be in very good condition, your Committee find there a very pleasant school well taught and reflecting no small amount of praise to both Teacher and Scholars.
