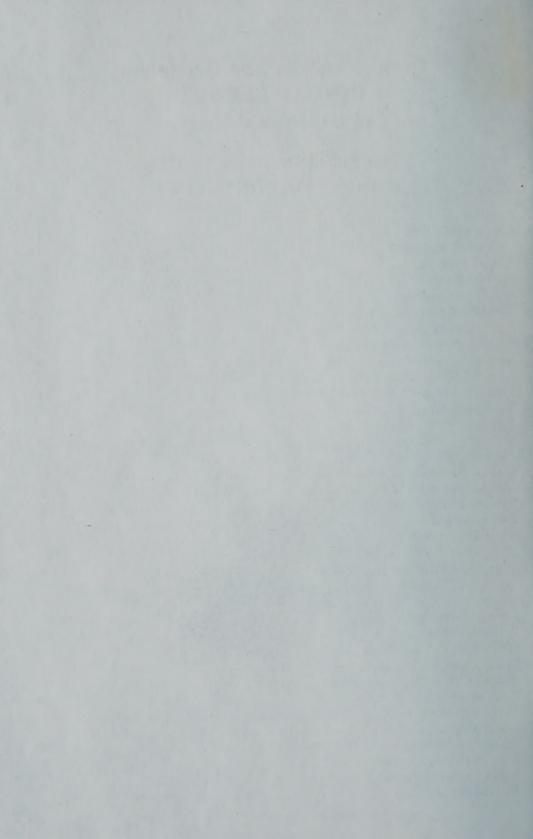

Moved by Earl W. White and seconded by Florence Goodrich to accept the budget of \$568,579.93.

David Valorose spoke on the ski tow. Why are we appropriating \$1,000.00 for the tow when it was not open? Wallace Clough spoke on the cost of liability insurance and the property in the process of being transferred to the Lions Club. The tow will run next year on the \$1,000.00 by the Lions Club to be used where necessary.

Dorothy Blodgett asked why the increase of \$6,000.00 in the Police Department and Selectmen explained due to inflation.

David Beasley asked why is damage and legal expenses up to \$10,000.00. Wallace Clough explained the Town had two court cases coming up that could be very expensive to the Town.

VOTE IN AFFIRMATIVE.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell and convey property acquired by Tax Collectors' Deeds in accordance with RSA 80:42.

Moved by Earl W. White and seconded by Curtis Sawyer. VOTE IN AFFIRMATIVE.

ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for and receive Federal Disaster Assistance Funds through the State Disaster Coordinating Office and to expend the funds so received to repair the damage to Town Roads and/or bridges caused by any declared emergency and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums as may be necessary to defray the cost of repairing damage in anticipation of Federal Disaster Funds to be received through the State Disaster Coordinating Office.

Moved by Earl W. White and seconded by Florence Goodrich. VOTE IN AFFIRMATIVE.

ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to establish a capital reserve fund for the purpose of capping the Town of Lisbon landfill and to appoint the Board of Selectmen as agents to carry the purposes of said fund into effect. Further, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to be placed in said fund. Said fund to be for the coming fiscal year, and to continue for ten (10) years.

Moved by Wallace Clough and seconded by Rachel Houston. VOTE IN AFFIRMATIVE.

ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed twentyfive thousand dollars (\$25,000.00) for the purpose of engineering fees and monitoring wells for the closure plan for the dump, and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow, upon credit of the Town a sum not to exceed \$25,000.00 and to issue serial notes of the Town for the cost not to exceed said sum, to be negotiated by them through a bank; the dates, maturities, denomination, the interest rate, and other details of said notes, to be delegated to the discretion of the Selectmen as may be for the best interests of the Town, and as may be necessary, in accordance with the laws of the State; and to authorize the Selectmen to execute said notes and any other papers necessary for the purpose of this article. (*To be voted on by ballot*)

> Moved by Wallace Clough and seconded by Richard Trelfa. Ballot vote. 121 YES 8 NO. VOTE IN AFFIRMATIVE.

ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue that portion of the road as laid out on October 7, 1904, Vol. 10 Page 306 as reads: N 14½° E 11 rods and 4 links; S 14½° W 11 rods and 4 links; such road connects to Clough Street from the residence of Conrad M. Quinn, Jr., 25 Clough Street.

Moved by Wallace Clough and seconded by Earl W. White Moved to adopt. VOTE IN AFFIRMATIVE. **ARTICLE 11.** To see if the Town will vote to discontinue and abandon all rights the Town may have in Old Sherman Road (portion bypassed by new bridge construction) beginning at Route 302 proceeding westerly about 700 feet to a line 30 feet south of the centerline of the new Sherman Road. All rights for existing utilities shall be retained.

Moved by Wallace Clough and seconded by Florence Goodrich.

John Kaspszak asked who requested this. Wallace Clough explained this road is to the old Gordon Property.

VOTE IN AFFIRMATIVE.

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue and abandon all rights the Town may have in Old Route 302 beginning at Old Sherman Road approximately 100 feet east of Route 302 and proceeding southerly about 400 feet of the right-of-way for Route 302. All rights for existing utilities shall be retained.

Moved by Wallace Clough and seconded by Earl W. White.

John Kaspszak asked who requested this. Wallace Clough spoke on this article. It was moved to adopt.

VOTE IN AFFIRMATIVE.

ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint a zoning officer to handle the administration and management of the zoning ordinance and such other duties as the Selectmen find necessary for the purpose of assisting them in carrying out the administration and enforcement of the zoning ordinance and other land use regulations and to compensate said officer at a rate commensurate with other town officers, but not to exceed \$5,000.00 per year.

Moved by Earl W. White and seconded by Agnes Andross.

Barbara Jesseman, Chairperson on the Planning Board spoke on this article. Said the job is becoming almost a full-time position.

Lillian Brooks asked how does the Selectmen feel about this. Wallace Clough spoke on behalf of himself stating we do not get \$7.50 an hour, we volunteer a lot of our time. A motion was made by Barbara Jesseman to amend the amount of compensation requested in the article from \$5,000 to \$2,000. Voice vote NO's have it. Article gone.

PASSED OVER BY VOICE VOTE.

ARTICLE 14. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate \$2,150.00 to purchase a property by property tax map; a cross indexed computer print out, by location and owner; and a dispatch map locating all buildings for fire department use.

Moved and seconded to adopt.

Donald Butson spoke on a composite map, size, shape, location.

Voice vote, I's have it.

VOTE IN AFFIRMATIVE.

ARTICLE 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00) for support of the Community Action Outreach Program.

(This article by request)

Frank Clark moved to pass over article. Was seconded.

ARTICLE WAS PASSED OVER by voice vote.

ARTICLE 16. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand three hundred ninety-five dollars (\$1,395.00) for the Upper Valley Senior Citizens Council, Inc. (*This article by request*)

Moved by Dorothy Blodgett and seconded by Florence Goodrich. ARTICLE WAS DEFEATED by voice vote. **ARTICLE 17.** To see if the town will vote to oppose the burial, storage, transportation and production of high level radioactive waste in the town of Lisbon and State of New Hampshire; and to call upon Congress to conduct an independent investigation with full public participation into the feasibility and prudence of the US Department of Energy's (DOE's) present plan to dispose of radioactive waste and into the DOE's competence to carry out such a plan.

Moved by Dorothy Blodgett and seconded by Florence Goodrich. The article was done by hand vote. In favor yes, VOTE IN AFFIRMATIVE.

ARTICLE 18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply for, accept and expend money from the State, Federal or other governmental unit or a private source which becomes available during the year in accordance with the procedures set forth in RSA 31:95-b.

Moved by Florence Goodrich and seconded by Robert Reed. Voice vote. VOTE IN AFFIRMATIVE.

ARTICLE 19. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

Harry Andross asked reference to alarm system put in Town Hall, was the monitoring going to be done by the dispatchers? Wallace Clough explained that Kipp Alarm was awarded the bid. At this time there is no monitoring but when the final hookup is done, the Fire Department will be contacted.

Philip Weymouth gave thanks to Earl W. White for his services as Selectman given the Town of Lisbon for the past 18 years. A round of applause was given by the townspeople.

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ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to sell and convey property acquired by Tax Collectors' Deeds in accordance with RSA 80:42.

ARTICLE 7. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to apply for and receive Federal Disaster Assistance Funds through the State Disaster Coordinating Office and to expend the funds so received to repair the damage to Town Roads and/or bridges caused by any declared emergency and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow such sums as may be necessary to defray the cost of repairing damage in anticipation of Federal Disaster Funds to be received through the State Disaster Coordinating Office.

ARTICLE 8. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 to place in the capital reserve fund for the purpose of capping the Town of Lisbon Landfill.

ARTICLE 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate an additional sum not to exceed thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000.00) for the revaluation and reassessment of the taxable property in the Town by the Appraisal Division of the Department of Revenue Administration starting in 1987 or thereafter, and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow, upon the credit of the Town a sum not to exceed \$30,000.00 and to issue serial notes of the Town for the cost not to exceed the said sum, to be negotiated by them through a bank, the dates, maturities, denominations, the interest rate, and other details of said notes, to be delegated to the discretion of the Selectmen as may be for the best interest of the Town, and as may be necessary, in accordance with the laws of the State, and to authorize the Selectmen to execute said notes and any other papers necessary for the purpose of this article. (To be voted on by ballot)

ARTICLE 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed fifty-five thousand dollars (\$55,000.00) for the purpose of purchasing a new loader for the Town Highway Department, to replace the existing Highway Department Loader which will replace the existing tractor at the Town Dump, said money to be taken out of surplus funds.

ARTICLE 11. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum not to exceed forty thousand dollars (\$40,000.00) to purchase a new truck for the Town Highway Department, and to authorize the Selectmen to borrow, upon the credit of the Town a sum not to exceed \$40,000.00 and to issue serial notes of the Town for the cost not to exceed said sum, to be negotiated by them through a bank, the dates, maturities, denominations, the interest rate, and other details of said notes, to be delegated to the discretion of the Selectmen as may be necessary, in accordance with the laws of the State; and to authorize the Selectmen to execute said notes and any other papers necessary for the purpose of this article. (*To be voted on by ballot*)

ARTICLE 12. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed eleven thousand nine hundred dollars (\$11,900.00) to purchase a new Police Cruiser, money to be taken out of surplus funds.

ARTICLE 13. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand four hundred fifty-one dollars (\$1,451.00) for support of the Grafton County Senior Citizens Council, Inc. (*This article by request*)

ARTICLE 14. To see if the Town of Lisbon will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of six hundred seventy-five (\$675.00) dollars to contribute to a regional Household Hazardous Waste Collection Project. This program will provide for the proper disposal of hazardous household products which are corrosive, toxic, reactive, and/or flammable, including household cleaners, paint products, pesticides and herbicides, and the like. Subject to adequate funding, collection will take place by June 30, 1987.

ARTICLE 15. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of one thousand seven hundred dollars (\$1,700.00) for support of the Community Action Outreach Program. (*This article by request*)

ARTICLE 16. To see if the Town will vote to instruct the town's representatives to the General Court to take all necessary measures to insure that no low level radioactive waste from the Seabrook nuclear plant shall be stored or disposed of within this Town of Lisbon unless and until the proposed site of the proposed storage or disposal has been approved by the voters of the town at the annual Town Meeting by written ballot. (*This article by petition*)

ARTICLE 17. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to appoint the Overseer of the Poor. This vote to take effect on March 8, 1988.

ARTICLE 18. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the National Fire Protection Association, Inc. Life Safety Code 101, 1985 Edition with any and all subsequent amendments thereto.

ARTICLE 19. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed eight thousand dollars (\$8,000.00) for the purpose of purchasing a new computer and software, and to give the Selectmen authority to use their discreation on the purchase of software, money to be taken out of surplus funds.

ARTICLE 20. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Board of Selectmen to apply for, accept and expend money from the State, Federal or other governmental unit or a private source which becomes available during the year in accordance with the procedures set forth in RSA 31:95-b.

ARTICLE 21. Are you in favor of adopting Amendment #2 as proposed by the Lisbon Planning Board as follows:

Article VII Section 7.03 CLUSTER DEVELOPMENT (SINGLE FAMILY) is the arrangement of single family dwellings closer together and on smaller lots than those required by the traditional subdivision planning or zoning specifications. The resulting differences in the lot areas are then consolidated into open spaces for the common benefit of the adjacent residents. The overall density, the total number of families to the total acre in the development, remains substantially the same as in a conventional layout.

ARTICLE 22. To see if the Town will vote to adopt the provisions of 60.3 (c) (4) of the National Flood Insurance Program and Related regulations, Federal Emergency Agency Guidelines by adding paragraph 14 to Article III Section 3.01.5.3 of the Lisbon Zoning Ordinance.

3.01.5.3.14 Where floodproofing is utilized for a particular structure, a registered professional engineer or architect shall certify that the floodproofing methods are adequate to withstand the flood depths, pressures, velocities, impact and uplift forces and other factors associated with the base flood, and a record of such certificates indicating the specific elevation (in relation to mean sea level) to which such structures are floodproofed shall be maintained with the official designated by the community under regulations containing detailed floodproofing specifications which satisfy the watertight performance standards.

ARTICLE 23. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

LISBON FIRE DEPARTMENT

Increased activity was evident in 1986 as the number of calls rose from 108 in 1985 to 117; chimney fires were increased from 13 to 15. We had three structure fires: The Winn apartments (former Clark house) on Main Street was a big save with the help of Twin State Mutual Aid; 96 bottles of air were used in fighting the fire, and four men were injured as a result of a backflash. Mitch McPherson, one of our veteran firefighters, pulled the four men out of the building, and our department honored him as our Firefighter of the Year.

Calls from alarm systems still give many problems, but they are being addressed and some have been straightened out.

We purchased a 500 gpm pump and it is mounted on a truck ready for use. This will give us a better flow of water in areas such as North Lisbon where water has to be pumped from the river. During the year we were able to furnish pagers to all personnel making it possible now to notify all members with a tone. White Mountain Hydroelectric installed a dry hydrant for us in the new canal.

Fire Prevention was an important undertaking. Mark Humphreys and other department members did a great job with two sessions at the elementary and high schools.

Plans for 1987 call for more Certification courses, which will bring up to 85% Certified personnel-very good for a small department.

The Selectmen have asked for future program planning for our department. We have presented a list of many items that need to be taken care of in the next few years including replacement of a truck chassis, building a new tanker, replacing the rescue van, improving our radio communications, purchasing new hose and nozzles, and buying air systems for the protection of our people.

Another engine and a new fire station are not too far down the road for consideration. And ISO recommendations will be up for review again in a few years.

Fund raising is always an important part of our year. The Lilac Time Raffle and our dances along with the generous donations from some taxpayers have helped tremendously in allowing us to buy many extra things we need, such as the River Rescue suits, which the Life Squad and Fire Department bought last year.

Personnel changes included two resignations, Chris Hartwell went into the Armed Forces, George Stevens returned to Lisbon, and Bryan Dodge is a new member. Our complete roster:

REPORT OF TOWN FOREST FIRE WARDEN AND STATE FOREST RANGER

Between July 1985 and June 1986, we experienced fewer fires than normal. The two leading causes of forest fires were again children and fires kindled without written permission of a Forest Fire Warden. Both causes are preventable, but only with your help.

Please help our town and state forest fire officials with forest fire prevention. Contact your Forest Fire Warden for more information.

Enforcement of a state timber harvest regulation is the responsibility of State Forestry officials. Our state has excellent timber harvest regulations; however, your assistance is needed.

If you know of a logging operation and suspect a state timber harvest law may be violated, call your Forest Fire Warden.

If you own forest land, you became responsible for the timber tax payment starting April 1, 1986. This is a change in the Timber Tax Law that will impact all forest landowners. Contact your Board of Selectmen for timber tax forms.

LISBON LIFE SQUAD

The Lisbon Life Squad responded to 134 calls in 1986. Twelve of the calls were to Landaff, four to Lyman, one to Bath and the rest were in Lisbon.

There were 19 auto accidents involving 27 people. Again, the area of Varney and Smith Lumber Company on Rte. 302 is of particular concern closely followed by the Salmon Hole Bridge, Lyman Road turn on Rte. 302. Use care, especially at these places and remember that drinking and driving cause problems.

Heart and breathing problems lead the list of calls with 24. There were seven industrial accident calls and seven calls for seizures. Seven Lisbon Firefighters were treated in two different incidences, with an increasing number of fire calls and increased technical capacity, the numbers of firefighter injury's will tend to increase.

Donations from the community have provided sufficient funds to replace equipment and supplies used and to provide for upgrading of skills. During the year a new portable radio, a cold water rescue suit and a light bar for the rescue truck were purchased. Training was provided to keep existing members skills up to date and five new members took an extensive course to qualify for the Squad. And, we were able to add to our capital reserve fund for replacement of the rescue truck.

Our thanks to Stanley and Marcia Snell for their years of service to the community and we welcomed the assistance of Mary Erb during the year. We are pleased that George Stevens is back on the Squad. New members Bill Doyle, Donna Knighton, Laurie Guilmette, Greg and Dianne Hartwell and Linda Deming are welcome additions to the crew.

Thanks also to our great dispatchers, Charlotte Derosia, Joan and Laurie Guilmette, they made the job a little easier with their professional approach. And, First Assistant Fire Chief Bob Clark always seems to be there when we need him.

A quick salute to Tom Andross and Todd Landry. Their early interest in Emergency Services was kindled at the Lisbon Fire station. We are pleased to see them responding back to our community as part of the Ross Ambulance Service professional crews.

PLANNING BOARD AND BOARD OF ADJUSTMENT

In 1986 the Lisbon Planning Board considered at public hearings and approved five subdivisions and one propertyline adjustment. The board reviewed all notices of intent forwarded to it by the Selectmen.

The Board of Adjustment granted five variances and three special exceptions following public hearings.

Hearings were held prior to town vote to change the status of our Flood Hazard Insurance from "emergency" to "regular".

The town's zoning and subdivision ordinances will be reprinted in a loose leaf format so they will be easier to amend, copy and will be computer ready. The original supply of ordinance copies lasted 14 years but were incomplete after the first year due to amendments. With the new format we need to only have a few copies on hand at any one time to be reproduced when wanted.

Hearings were held to consider a proposal to adopt cluster development regulations, which provides for the same density of development but having homes closer together than usually required, with a larger open area left undeveloped. This can better utilize certain types of land and create a more rural look than some more conventional layouts, according to its advocates. There was no response from the public to the hearing notices so the town vote by ballot will determine if there is a desire to utilize this type of development.

All meetings, minutes, and other records of the boards are open to the public. The Planning Board meets the third Wednesday of each month unless otherwise noticed in the newspaper. The Board of Adjustment meets at the call of the chairman as necessary to conduct hearings or to elect officers.

Some towns may have seen increased county taxes due to evaluation and apportionment formula used by the N.H. Department of Revenue Administration. However, public services at the county level still usually reflect more equitable distribution of tax dollars. County tax averages 6.2% of base property taxes.

The county is facing the same problems in the insurance market as the towns. However, we have joined in the N.H. Municipal Association's insurance programs for most coverage needs at reasonable cost. We shall also have to deal with the loss of Revenue Sharing funds in the next budget.

It is too early to make a comprehensive report on the new welfare system under Senate Bill-1. We do know that with the change in program liabilities, county costs will substantially increase, and towns should realize a decrease in welfare assistance payments. County focus under SB-1 is to serve the needs of the children, the elderly and disabled. Because the north country is growing with changing needs, growth in the elderly population, and expanded service requirements, we must look to the future to meet those needs.

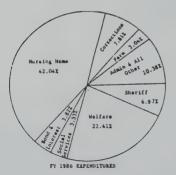
The House of Correction occupancy figures have grown dramatically due to week-end sentencing, new DWI laws, and continuous one year sentencing to avoid incarceration at state prison, causing overcrowding at the Correctional facility. One option now under consideration is the construction of a two story dormitory type addition for 30 beds. The result would be a net increase of 18 beds meeting space standards under a plan in line with previous jail study recommendations, and at far less cost than a new facility.

The farm continues to be self-supporting, provides work for inmates, and offers access for experimental projects. The Register of Deeds net profit margin is 3.6% of county revenues. The Sheriff's Department provides essential services in transport, superior court, dispatch, and other law enforcement activities, with increased revenue in fees. The Nursing Home is one of the finest in the state.

We are proud of our county; of the dedicated staff, exemplary services and high standard facilities.

Commissioners meet weekly, and encourage public attendance. We welcome facility tours.

NORTH COUNTRY COUNCIL ANNUAL REPORT

Calendar year 1986 was a busy and productive year for the North Country Council as it continued to provide a wide range of assistance to towns and cities in the North Country.

The Council is a regional non-profit, public agency chartered under NH RSA 36:45 and is responsible for providing its member communities assistance in local community planning, economic development, solid waste, transportation, and various other community services. Besides the direct assistance the Council provides each member community, it is an advocate for all North Country towns in legislative and funding issues at the state and federal governments.

Growth and development is no longer unique to southern New Hampshire; North Country towns are experiencing similar growth pressures. The Council recognizes the impacts associated with this development to schools, roads, waste disposal, water, etc. The Council is dedicated to assisting town officials with these complicated issues. Because most of the Council member towns do not have a staff of their own to do the research, answer the questions and respond to incoming requests, the Council has revised the way we help member towns. Now, each town has a staff person assigned to assist the local officials of that town with their daily needs. In this way, the Council serves its membership more efficiently.

In Lisbon, the Council administered a Housing Improvement Community Development Block Grant Program, and is providing circuit-rider planning assistance. The Council helped the town with several economic activities including development of a Community Profile to be used for industrial development promotion, in cooperation with Town officials. We also coordinated the development of a regional industrial promotion program aimed at creating manufacturing jobs in Lisbon and the region.

Economic Development is an important part of the Council's overall agency mission. This year the Council developed two marketing products; a regional brochure promoting the region and community profiles which the ten growth communities in the region are using to market their industrial development potential. The Council also produced a series of magazine advertisements, along with a display at the Eastern States Exposition, promoting the North Country as the sensible place to do business. The Council is now developing a workshop series on industrial development marketing for local officials in the region who are actively seeking economic development.

This past summer the Council co-sponsored the very successful North Country legislative tour. Over 285 legislators and their guests toured the North Country getting a glimpse of the life, economy, and culture that makes our region unique. A follow-up legislative reception was held in December to develop a legislative agenda for 1987. The tour and reception should have future beneficial legislative impact to the North Country.

The Council again provided information and guidance to several towns on federal and state grant and loan programs. This past year saw the Council administer over \$3.0 million in Community Development Block Grant funds. The funds cover such activities as housing rehabilitation, downtown revitalization, business revolving loan funds, and housing rehabilitation feasibility studies.

Community planning assistance has emphasized master planning and improvement in local land use controls. New state mandated and commerical and residential growth in several towns have created busy work loads for planning boards. The Council's assistance takes many forms: regional workshops, newsletters, regulation review and update, and assistance on a regular or one-time basis for subdivision and site plan applications.

The Council again co-sponsored the Municipal Law Lecture series with the NH Municipal Association. The Law Lecture this year covered such topics as local planning board procedures, administration and enforcement of ordinances and review of recent court cases and state law changes regarding local land use planning.

Overall, the Council's major objective is to work with North Country towns in solving local and regional problems. We rely on and appreciate the involvement of town officials and residents and look forward to assisting your town this coming year.
