## **TOWN MEETING WARNING**

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To the Inhabitants of the Town of Pittsburg in the County of Coos in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at Town Hall in said town on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March next, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
3. To see what action the Town will take in regard to Police and make appropriation for same.
4. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid and make appropriations for same.
5. To see what action the Town will take in regard to Street lighting and raise money for same.
6. To see what action the Town will take in regard to Fire Department and raise money for same.
7. To see how much money the Town will vote to raise more than is required by law, for highways and bridges.
8. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue the highway in the Town of Pittsburg leading from the William McKeage place, so-called, across the Connecticut River past the Alma Cross place to the Fred Washburn place, so-called.

9. To see what action the Town will take in regard to the Road as laid out by the County Commissioners and make appropriations for same.

10. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$1,780.00 to meet the State in a like amount for maintenance of State Road and oil the State road as far as possible with this amount, beginning at the Town line between Pittsburg and Canaan.

11. To see if the Town will vote to exchange the Town truck for one or more Ford trucks and make appropriations for same.

12. To see how much money the Town will raise for the upkeep of the cemeteries.

13. To bring in your votes for the election of Delegated-at-large, District Delegated, Alternate District Delegates to the National Conventions of the Democratic and Republican parties, to be held for the purpose of nominating party candidates for President and Vice-president of the United States.

14. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

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### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Feb. 1, 1923 to Feb. 1, 1924.

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Looking back over the past year we find cause for gratification and also some cause for disappointment. The progress of the pupils has been generally satisfactory and the teachers have worked hard to bring about good results. Attendance has been fairly good, but not as good as we expect, for there is considerable unnecessary absence.

The average daily cost of maintaining our schools is about \$92.00: thus with an average registration of 138, the daily cost per pupil is 67 cents. This expense goes on every day school is in session whether all the pupils are present or not. Last year there was an average of 15 pupils absent each day. This gives us an economic loss of \$10.00 a day. Why not help to eliminate this waste by making our attendance record better? Our percent of attendance for the year ending June 30, 1923 was 89 as compared with 86 the previous year. We should be able to make it 94 or 95. Tardiness is another evil to be guarded against. Every pupil should be in school every day unless prevented by sickness, and be there on time.

Health supervision is a new feature of the work this year, and we trust that it will prove of great help to increased efficiency in the school work of the pupils.

Today, as never before, every child needs to be educated. He must be so educated that he can bear his full share of life's burdens and not become a parasite on society. An efficient education is possible only when we have good schools, regular attendance, and hard work by the pupils. We have good schools, and I trust that every citizen will cooperate to bring about

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the result desired. May our goal for the future be excellent attendance, no tardiness and efficient work.

During the year I have made 165 official visits to Pittsburg schools, have noted the work of the pupils, and tried to cooperate with the teachers for the progress of the children.

In closing, I wish to thank the teachers for their interest and the citizens for their help and cooperation; also to extend to all my best wishes for continued progress and prosperity.
