We wish to inform the townspeople that we have exempted property from taxation under the Soldiers' and Widows' law to the amount of \$13,000 00. This has made quite a little difference in the tax rate.

We have dropped from the town's books the amounts of the property sold for taxes bought by town and not redeemed. C. Shaw list, '88-'89, \$60 55; J. W. Tuttle hst, 1895, \$115 18; J. L. Hall list, 1896, \$17 74; E. A. Scribner list, 1897, \$168 37; J. W. Tuttle list, 1898, \$17 26. We have thoroughly investigated and found these lists not collectable.

We have also dropped the amount of \$28 61, which has been carried on the books a great many years as due School District No. 11 before annexed to No. 10. This was outlawed many years ago.

Adding the amount of these back taxes to our gain for the year, and subtracting therefrom the amount due School District No. 11, would have left us a total gain for the year of \$2,076 82.

We herewith submit our annual report.

We have endeavored to comply with the intent of the law by giving the pupils in every part of the town as near the same advantages for instruction as the unequal distribution of our population would permit.

The first work in the care of schools was to call a meeting of those desirous of teaching, for a written examination.

Our main care in preparing a list of questions to be submitted to the would-be teachers, was to have list of sufficient breadth to cover all the branches taught in our schools.

A written examination, though not always a pleasant task, is, we believe, the best test of a teacher's ability.

In employing teachers we have endeavored so far as possible to secure those who have had previous experience, but in this we have labored under a disadvantage, as teachers, like others, prefer to go where they can obtain the most money, and other towns, with better pay and longer schools, offer greater inducements.

Notwithstanding this obstacle, we were able to secure teachers who have generally proved equal to the wants of the schools.

For information in regard to the attendance, wages paid, etc., you are referred to the table of statistics.
