# TOWN WARRANT.

[L. S.] STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the inhabitants of the town of Wolfeborough, qualified to vote in town affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House, in said town, on the Second TUESDAY of March next, at 9 o'clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:—

Art. 1. To choose a Moderator to preside in said meeting.

Art. 2. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.

Art. 3. To choose three Selectmen for the ensuing year.

Art. 4. To choose a Collector of Taxes and all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 5. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to defray town expenses.

Art. 6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to pay on its indebtedness.

Art. 7. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for breaking roads the past winter.

Art. 8. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to repair the highways, also to see what part of said amount shall be raised in money to operate the road machine, for the year ensuing.

Art. 9. To see what sum of money the town will vote to pay each Fireman legally returned in addition to that prescribed by law, agreeable to a petition signed by C. H. Tuttle, and others.

Art. 10. To see if the town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to contract with the Wolfeborough Aqueduct and Water Co., for hydrants

for Fire Purposes, at a sum not exceeding twenty dollars a hydrant per year, for a term of years, agreeable to a petition signed by Joseph W. Goodwin, and others.

Art. 11. To see if the town will vote to construct waterworks for fire purposes, and what sum of money they will vote to raise for that purpose and in what way or manner. It shall be expended agreeable to a petition signed by F. P. Hobbs, and others.

Art. 12. To see if the town will vote to instruct its Representatives to procure a charter for the town, to enable it to construct Water Works for domestic and fire purposes, and also to see if it will vote to issue bonds to raise money to construct the same for a sum not to exceed Thirty Thousand Dollars, at a rate of interest not to exceed 4 per cent per annum, exempt from taxation.

Art. 13. To see if the town will vote to discontinue the road leading from the Josiah Willey place to the Joseph Jenness road, known as the Willey Road agreeable to a petition signed by Cyrus L. Jenness, and others.

Art. 14. To take the sense of the qualified voters whether the alterations and amendments of the Constitution proposed by the Constitutional Convention shall be approved.

Art. 15. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## REPORT OF THE BOARD OF HEALTH.

*To the Honorable Board of Selectmen and Citizens of the  
Town of Wolfeborough:*

The Board of Health that was duly appointed at the commencement of the political year 1888, beg leave to submit the following report:

I immediately prepared and submitted to you for approval Regulations relative to the public health of the inhabitants of the town and posted the same as the Statute requires.

The first part of the year was one of general good health but the last half we have had an unusual amount of sickness and death mostly from pneumonia. Only one case of typhoid fever has been reported for the year. Twelve cases of Diphtheria and no deaths from diphtheria proper and only one as the result of it. As soon as a case was reported the family was promptly quarantined and every case of this much dreaded disease has been confined to that immediate family although other tenants occupied the same house.

Several owners of buildings have been notified to remove a nuisance which on inspection was found to exist, and the order has been promptly obeyed with one exception. I have made seventy-three official visits during the year. In my work of attending the sick I have had the cheerful co-operation of the attending physician and all the families afflicted with diphtheria. As a people we pay too little attention to ventilation, drinking water and drains for the protection and preservation of the public health.

**REPORT OF THE SCHOOL BOARD OF  
WOLFEBOROUGH, N. H. FOR THE YEAR  
ENDING MARCH 1889.**

*To the Citizens of Wolfborough:—*

It is not necessary for us to mention each school or teacher in detail, for although some schools may not have made very marked advancement, and in some instances there has not been that accuracy of instruction or that healthful emulation and enthusiasm which we desire, yet we know that there has been much hard work done by every teacher, and the schools as a whole, have been quite as successful as in former years, and as efficient, perhaps, as could be expected. True, many have failed to reach that degree of proficiency to which we wish all might attain; others, however, more fortunate in teachers and other circumstances, have been model schools.

We desire to call the attention of the parents of the district to their duties concerning the education of their children. This subject is one that should receive their personal supervision. It is of the greatest importance that the parents should exhibit an interest in the school, and know what is there being done. You give your personal presence, attention, and effort, to the common, every day transactions of business life, but too frequently neglect this the most important of all your duties. Who is there among you who would hire a man or woman to conduct important business transactions or to perform difficult tasks of labor, and leave them to do that business or labor in their own way without ever giving the same your own supervision, and looking to

see that it is properly done, and done with thoroughness and dispatch, while you trust the training of your children to one who may be a comparative stranger to you, without ever stepping in to see for yourselves how this important trust is being executed? We would also call your attention to the increasing disposition on the part of the scholars to be absent from the school room. Unnecessary absence is one of the greatest evils in our schools, and the hardest to remedy, when it is absolutely necessary on account of sickness or any other cause, it is excusable. But where parents allow their children to stay at home for trivial causes, and cannot be made to see the difference between constant attendance and frequent absence, it becomes an evil not easily remedied.

While we are gratified with the advancement that has been made in our schools the past year, we must urge upon teachers the necessity for greater advancement and higher qualifications. The standard of education of the past is not up to the requirements of the future, in almost every department of human industry, invention has changed the relation of things and is forcing competition, the scholars of the present must be able to compete with the accumulated knowledge of the future. To insure the independent thought that will guarantee success. The solid attainments of our own language and a sound practical business education comprise the most of the knowledge essential to success in almost any sphere of pursuit. How far below this standard is the average education of our adult population, let common experience answer! We would afford the highest education and expand the mental horizon of every scholar as far as practicable, but we would first be assured the person had mastered the fundamental branches of study and had a good knowledge of the language of his or her nativity, for with-

out these, no permanent or enduring basis on which to found a successful business career can be laid. The public schools should furnish the fundamental training, and can be made to do so when systematic and thorough teaching becomes the rule.
