## Board of Health.

*To the Selectmen and Inhabitants of the Town of Danville,  
N. H.,*

In accordance with custom the Board of Health of Danville, N. H., herewith submit a report of the expenditures for the year, together with a list of the number and character of the contagious diseases reported to the Board.

The general, every day duties of the health officer increase from year to year, and at each successive gathering of the legislature new responsibilities are added, so that while there seems little to be done in the absence of contagion, yet to a busy man it is hard to find time to do, satisfactorily, all the things the board is expected to do.

The board does not receive the help it should from the citizens of the town. Tuberculous persons are not often enough reported in early stages, so that proper measures can be taken and advice given to help in the suppression of the dreaded disease. A good many people are careless of their sanitary surroundings, until someone is stricken with typhoid, diphtheria or other possibly fatal, always fearful, disease. The head of every family should be very careful about the condition of his well, vault, etc. Another very



important thing is not to allow any old rubbish to accumulate to breed germs. These little things would do much to keep our loved ones from the suffering we have seen so much of in the past year.

It is the duty and privilege of the health officers to aid in the prevention of disease, also to protect the well from those whose near presence may be a menace to any who may come in contact with them. The physician who keeps his families well is deserving of all the praise which may be bestowed upon him.

During the past year there have been five cases of diphtheria, and one case of scarlet fever.
