Art. 9. To see if the town will vote to build a balcony in the Town Hall and raise money for same.

Art. 10. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to haul stream gravel on the Errol Hill road in district No. 3.

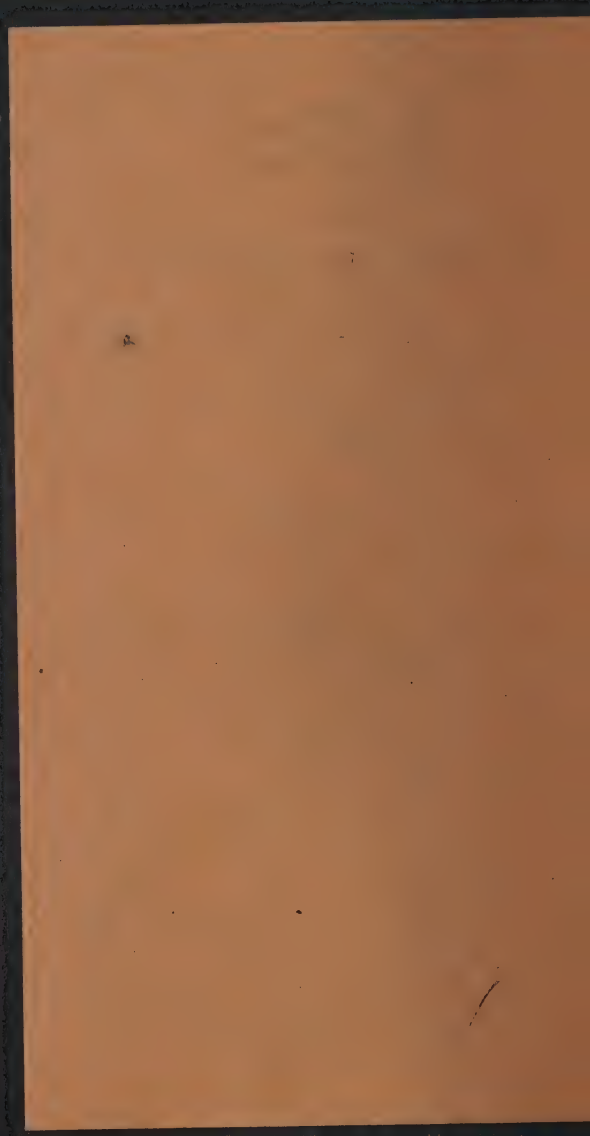
