Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the year ensuing and make appropriations of the same.

Article 3. To see how much money the town will raise and appropriate for the Abbie Greenleaf library, and for the salary of the Librarian.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to apply to the State for State aid and Trunk line aid and maintenance for our highways for the ensuing year; and to raise and appropriate money for the same.

Article 5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of highways and bridges for the year ensuing.

Article 6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial day and to choose an agent to expend the same.

Article 7. To see how much money, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for oiling our roads.

Article 8. To see how much money the town will raise and appropriate for lighting the streets for the coming year.

The appropriation for town charges was reduced \$1,000, which left the Selectmen a reduced working capital.

The state and county taxes were \$1,113.71 higher than last year.

The school appropriation was \$1,300.00 higher for which it was necessary to increase the tax rate 15 cents per \$100. (The school now receives about one third the town tax).

It is a source of gratification to the Selectmen to be able to reduce the charges to charities nearly \$1,000.00 without apparent discomfiture to those in need of public provision.
