

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

TOWN WARRANT

THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Goshen in the County of Sullivan in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Goshen on Tues., the fourteenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- Art. 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- Art. 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriation of the same.
- Art. 3. To hear the reports of the Selectmen and other Town Officers heretofore chosen and pass any vote relating thereto.
- Art. 4. To raise and appropriate such sums of money as may be necessary for repair of Highways and Bridges.
- Art. 5. To see if the Town will vote to apply for State Aid for permanent improvement of Highways, and raise and appropriate the necessary money therefor.
- Art. 6. To raise and appropriate the money necessary for State Aid Maintenance.
- Art. 7. To raise and appropriate the money necessary for Trunk Line Maintenance.
- Art. 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the Library.
- Art. 9. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to administer or dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town through Tax Collector's deeds.
- Art. 10. To see what sum of money the Town will vote for support of poor.
- Art. 11. To see what action the Town will take in regard to building a toilet for the Town Hall, and pass any vote relating thereto.

- Art. 12. To see if the Town will vote to buy more snow fence.
- Art. 13. To see what action the Town will take in regard to building cemetery fence, and pass any vote relating thereto.
- Art. 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Blister Rust control.
- Art. 15. To see if the Town will vote to rescind the vote taken on March 8, 1932 in regard to plowing snow from the dooryards.
- Art. 16. To see what action the Town will take about building a drain from J. Gocha's house and pass any vote relating thereto.
- Art. 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100 for a History of Goshen.
- Art. 18. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen and Treasurer to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- Art. 19. To transact any other business that may legally come before this meeting.

REPORT OF LIBRARY TRUSTEES

The records of the library for the past year show an increased patronage and prove that it continues to be a source of instruction and entertainment to the public. It now contains 4,900 volumes, of which 46 have been added during the past year, most of them by purchase. There is still need of more young peoples' books and more extensive book rebinding. Circulation, 1,620 volumes. Gifts of current magazines are acceptable.

The income of the library was materially increased last November by the receipt of \$40 interest on the trust fund of \$1,000 received from the estate of the late Edwin N. Pettis. The library has been well cared for during the past year by Misses Doris and Ruth Nelson, who have jointly had it in charge and whose courtesy and willing helpfulness have been much appreciated.

We trust there will be many more years of usefulness and prosperity for this institution.

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the members of the School Board, Goshen, N. H.

As far as financial affairs are concerned, conditions have not changed materially from last year. I would recommend that you re-read my previous report.

Both of our teachers of last year resigned, and we have replaced them with inexperienced teachers at a lower salary. This was provided for in the budget which was adopted at the 1932 district meeting.

In the budget for this year, the only apparent place for a reduction is in the salary of the superintendent of schools, and this has been made. On the other hand, because of an increased number of pupils who will go to high school, it is necessary to increase the appropriation for tuition by \$300.

The "depression" has continued. It reminds me of the state of mind of people who "enjoy poor health." If everyone would stop talking about it, and buy in the usual manner, the depression would cease. Of course, we are all waiting for bargains, and by the time the bargains appear, we have no money to take advantage of them. So long as this frame of mind continues, we can have no prosperity.

The only reason I have mentioned this is because we are now getting to the point where we want to stop buying good schools. We can get along without shoes without any particular danger, because we can get them later, but if we stop having schools for a few years, the children will keep right on growing up, and it will be too late to do anything about it. I hope no such attitude will appear in Goshen.

We have an interesting condition in Goshen this year, in that there is not a single pupil in the first grade. Educationally your schools are doing well. Tests still show that your children are well up to standard. Interest on the part of the pupils is sustained and active. I have a feeling that the next generation of adults will be better able to cope with present day problems than is the generation of which we are a part.
