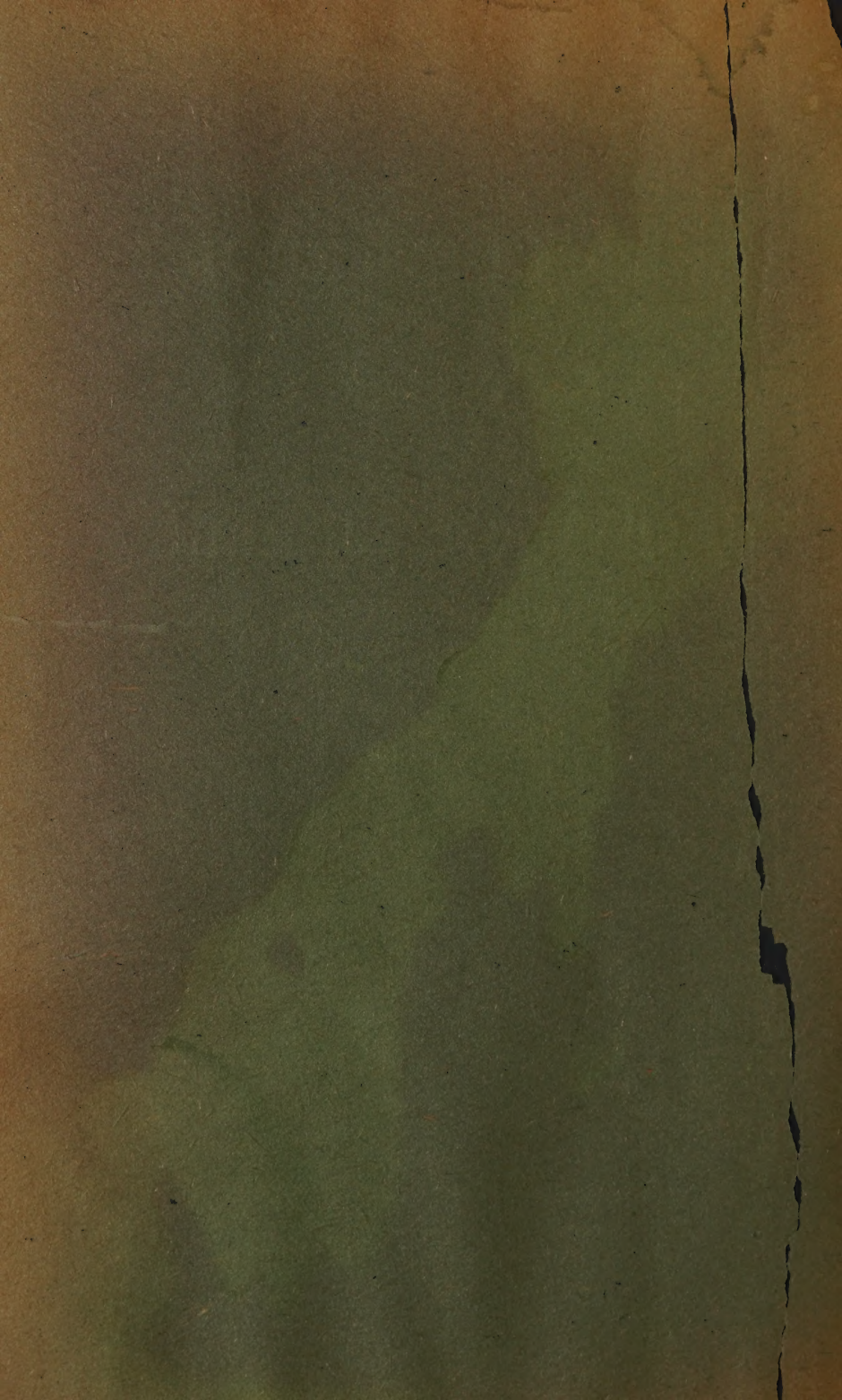

SCHOOL REPORT.

On our election to the school board last spring the first proposition was a law suit called on the next Wednesday, Lisbon School District No. 1 vs. School District Landaff. We went to Woodsville, and an agreed statement of facts was put before the Court by the lawyers. Judge Chamberlin refused to decide, therefore it went to the Supreme Court September term, judgment for us was given by the Court, and our expenses are given in the financial report.

Then came the Benton tuition; we were given to understand there were hard feelings over the price of tuition. The Benton School board said they asked exactly what they paid other towns, \$12.50 per week, which you will readily see is perfectly fair, and it takes a fair-sized school to make expenses at that rate. We paid \$45 for 1908 tuition at Benton, the 1909 tuition is paid which amounts to \$36.50.

Another thing that looks bad is the use of paper and pencils, where slates used to be used, some say, "Slates make a lot of noise." Well so do a string of scholars going to the desk for paper, the expense of paper and pencils is about \$20 per year. Good wire bound 10 by 12 slates cost $12\frac{1}{2}$ cents each and should last a long time. We are in favor of using slates.

We have put in new seats at Foster Hill changing it from the old-fashioned way of seats down each side, it is now a nice school room, the expense was \$35.60. At the Scotland School house the floor timbers are badly rotted and unless something is done will soon be unsafe, last winter they did not use the girls' side much, the underpinning needs repairing too. At the Blue School house we graded and pointed up the underpinning to do away with banking and unbanking each year. We save this in three years in banking and unbanking. This school house needs shingling on the side next the road and it should be done this year. We have had to make some repairs on every school house; in four large pieces of plastering

were off and more ready to fall, glass was broken and so were doors.

Well, now about the schools, we hired what we supposed were good teachers, some were good and taught very good schools, the rest we do not say anything about. A little co-operation on the part of the parents would help the schools more than anything else, it does not cost any more to run a full school, than it does half a school, it is not the teacher who is spited by keeping the children home, it is a boomerang that hits the child.

We heard a general complaint about the Milne Arithmetics (the ones in use) and on looking the books over did not blame the teachers. We tried to get the Greenleaf's Common School Arithmetic but they are not to be had so we got the nearest thing to it in the Greenleaf's New Practical, these books give satisfaction. We have not changed any books, simply purchased what were needed, there are some books now in use in the schools that it is almost impossible for a scholar to get any practical good out of, when your scholars bring home books from school look them over and see what you think about them.

Now a word about wood, you probably saw this in last year's report, "You will notice that we have paid quite a good price for wood at two school houses, but we calculate it will last two years at those two places so it will only make the cost about the same as in former years, although wood has advanced a great deal in price." Those two school houses were the Blue and Scotland, at the Blue two cords of wood was not paid for, and at Scotland there was not enough wood and we run long fall and short winter terms to save wood. That's all.
