#### THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

#### TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Sullivan in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Sullivan on Tuesday, the eleventh day of March, next at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To cast ballots for delegates to National Convention.
- 2. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year and make appropriations of the same.
- 4. To see if the town will vote to rescind all previous votes in regard to the number of road districts and road agents, and vote to have hence forth two road districts and two road agents to care for all town roads.
- 5. To see what sums of money, including that required by law, the town will raise and appropriate for building and repairing highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
- 6. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$330.18 for Town Road Aid. The State's share to be \$2,201.21.
- 7. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for winter maintenance of highways.
- 8. To see if the town will raise or borrow and appropriate any money for the purchase or hire of equipment for use on the highways or take any action relating thereto.

- 9. To see if the town will vote to relocate the East Sullivan end of the Old Nelson Road and raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose, or take any action relating thereto.
- 10. To see if the town will pay for digging graves of residents that are to be buried in town.
- 11. To see what sum of money including that required by law, the town will raise and appropriate for the support of the public library.
- 12. To see if the town will raise and appropriate any money for a memorial or honor roll for veterans or take any action relating thereto.
- 13. To see if the town will raise and appropriate any money for Memorial Day, or take any action relating thereto.
- 14. To see if the town will raise and appropriate any money for Old Home Day, or take any action relating thereto.
- 15. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$23.00 for the Monadnock Region Association.
- 16. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Fire Co., or take any action relating thereto.
- 17. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for other fire protection.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for the aid of the Elliot Community hospital of Keene, N. H., or take any action relating thereto.
- 19. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to borrow money on the credit of the town in anticipation of taxes.
- 20. To see if the town will authorize the selectmen to sell property acquired by tax deed by private sale.
- 21. To see if the town will raise and appropriate a sum of money to help stamp out the white pine blister rust, or take any action relating thereto.

- 22. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$148.00 for street lights, or take any action relating thereto.
- 23. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate any money for a town dump, or take any action relating thereto.
- 24. To hear the reports of agents, auditors or committees heretofore chosen, or take any action thereon.
- 25. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

### REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

Progress has been made during the school year in our efforts to restore the school property to first class condition. At the East School, better coat room facilities were provided, dark shades were installed for darkening the room when film strips was used and the school grounds were rough graded. Two pieces of playground equipment have been installed to provide the children with an opportunity for constructive activity. At the Center School a set of six swings has been installed. While playground equipment is primarily for entertainment, its use also teaches pupils to learn to consider others and share with others.

I consider it unfortunate that funds were not provided at the last session of the legislature for adequate support of schools from the state level. The formula adopted, apportioned aid on the basis of the number of pupils in attendance and the equalized valuation of local property but insufficient money was voted to meet the full needs under the formula.

Both of our teachers have taken extension work in methods of improving reading this year and efforts are being made to increase skills in the three r's. Scholars supplies are adequate and most of the textbooks in use are new.

In the face of rising costs it should be of interest to the community to note that the Sullivan schools could be closed and all pupils transported to the Wells Memorial School in Chesham, at a total savings of \$2,000 per year.

### REPORT OF THE MUSIC SUPERVISOR

I herein submit my report concerning the elementary music program in the school. The aim of the music program is to develop a love and appreciation of good music and the desire to participate spontaneously in group work, both vocal and instrumental. A comprehensive course is given, starting with rote singing in the first grade and covering the prescribed fundamentals in each grade through the eighth. An opportunity is given for each pupil to play in a rhythm band in the lower grades and in a tonette band in the intermediate grades. Folk dancing also is part of the music program as well as is music appreciation.

A Christmas program was presented at the town hall in which all eight grades took part. The upper grades gave a program at a parent-teachers meeting and at graduation. Both the tonette band and rhythm band have been featured as part of these programs and it is hoped that these bands will continue to grow and benefit the pupils.

The pupils are enthusiastic and appreciative of all phases of the music program. I find the record library available in the Union office, to be of real benefit to the pupils of the schools.
