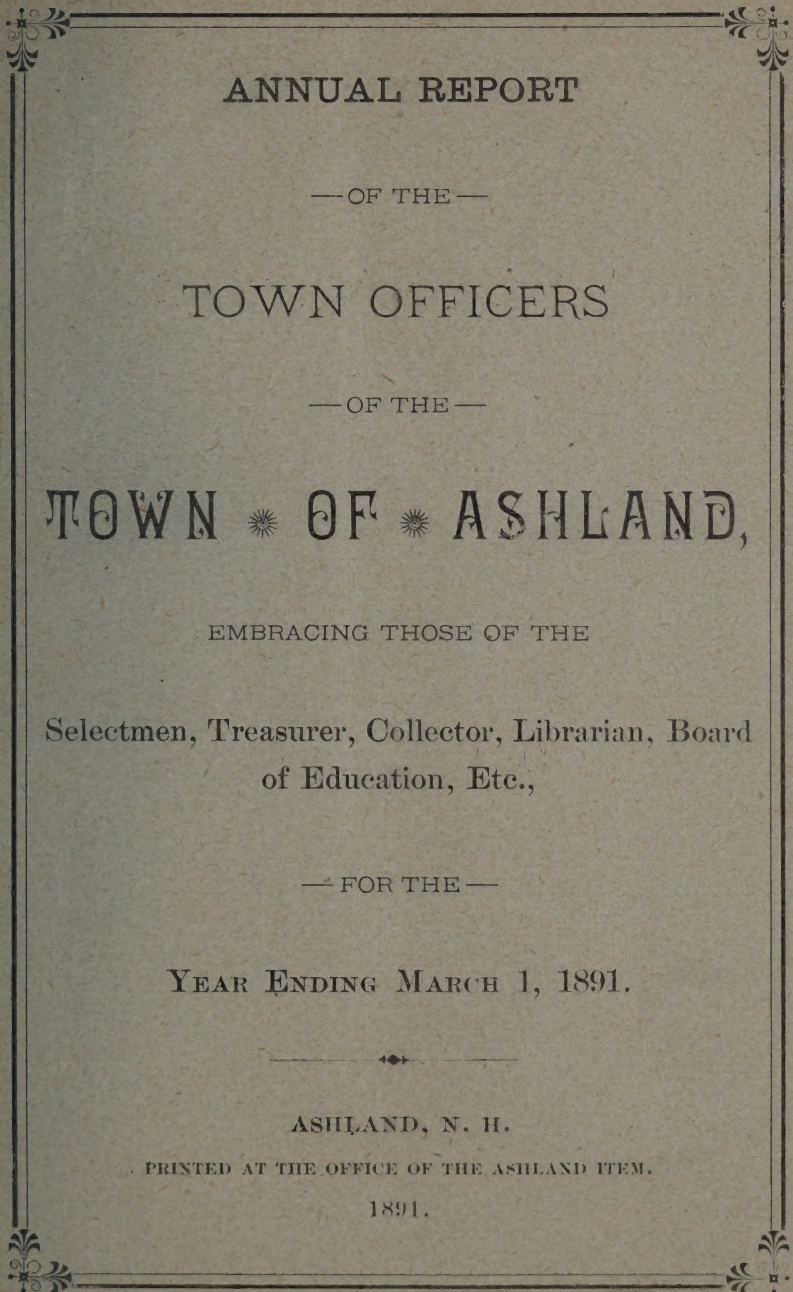

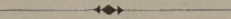

are well supplied with charts, maps, globes and blackboards. Yaggy's Astronomical and Geographical chart has been purchased the last year. We congratulate the parents and citizens upon the prosperous condition of the school.
