Report of School Board

We have been very fortunate in securing the services of good teachers the past year, and we consider that our schools have been very successful.

We wish to extend thanks to Miss Ellen Webster for the gift of some 25 or 30 text books to the No. 3 school. The teacher reports that she found these books very useful for reference.

As there is a balance of \$416.65 in favor of the school district, we would recommend that no extra school money be raised for school purposes the present year.

We find there are 24 children in town between the ages of 5 and 16 years, 18 boys and 6 girls.

DISTRICT NO. 1, RIVER ROAD SCHOOL

Spring term of 7 weeks and fall term of 5 weeks, taught by Miss Annie B. Aiken of Franklin, N. H. On the roll of perfect attendance at both terms was Geo. W. B. Cass. These schools were short for lack of children to attend.

DISTRICT NO. 3, BRIDGEWATER HILL SCHOOL

Two terms of 12 weeks each taught by Miss Eva D. Smith of Raymond, N. H. Miss Smith gave extra satisfaction to parents and scholars. Number of pupils at each term 12. Roll of perfect attendance: Clarence E. Gilpatric, Wesley D. Gilpatric.
