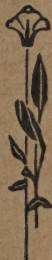

School Report

As the school year ends August 31, the town year January 31, and school meetings must be held in the month of April, it is difficult to make a report, but we can say we have kept our thirty-six weeks of school; five days for a week, except the legal holidays. At the school meeting in April, 1920, the district voted a total of \$1,304. for school purposes. C. A. Young was chosen clerk of the district, E. M. Cooley, treasurer and Katherine L. Bowles, member of the school board for three years. A few weeks later Mrs. H. L. Dodge and Mrs. Clayton Glover, members of the board, resigned, and Fred H. Bowles accepted the office, by

appointment. Mrs. Francella Cooley, who had been an efficient teacher for over a year, resigned at the close of the fall term and Mrs. Roscoe A. Young was hired as teacher. As she lives near the pupils who must be transported, she takes a team which can carry them all. Mrs. Young is a graduate of Tilton Seminary; a good musician, has taught domestic science and promises to make a success as teacher of a mixed school. We have paid superintendent's salary \$76.22.
