THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

*To the Inhabitants of the Town of Eaton, in the County of Carroll, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at Odd Fellows' hall in said Eaton, on Tuesday, the ninth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation of the same.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for highways and bridges for the year ensuing and make appropriation for the same.
4. To see if the town will vote to accept State Aid for highways and make appropriation for the same.
5. To see what sum of money the town will raise and appropriate for the repair of the Simonds road so-called.
6. To see what action the town will take regarding snow-roller and a housing place therefor, and make appropriation for the same.
7. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to hire money to pay on debts of the town.
8. To act upon any other business that may come before said meeting.
