

REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Errol:

Herewith is presented the annual report of the Superintendent of Schools together with figures of school attendance for the last complete school year ending July 1, 1924.

During this year, the Superintendent has made 92 visits of supervision and inspection among the classes of the four teachers of the school. At the beginning of the year the work for the different classes was outlined, the program of study and daily schedule for the high school made out.

At subsequent visits classes in all subjects were heard and examined both orally and by some written standard test in order to ascertain that different grades were accomplishing work comparable with the same grades in other schools.

As a result of these visits of inspection, I feel that in the majority of cases the work for the year has been well done. In some few instances there have been exceptions where work has not been accomplished as it should be. These, however, are the exceptional cases and certainly the entire work of the school should not be judged by these comparatively few exceptions.

The low record of percentage of attendance for the year was caused mainly by an outbreak of measles. There have been but a few instances of pupils remaining unnecessarily away from school.

The interest shown by the pupils in their work has been excellent especially in the high school. The work in manual training is somewhat handicapped by lack of room in the basement; while the intermediate teacher's classes are still being conducted in the hall; thus being exposed to the annoyances caused by pupils passing to the basement. If the school is to grow, it will be some time necessary to provide additional space for class rooms.

As in the previous year, warm lunches were served to pupils who remained during the noon hour and who desired such lunch. These lunches were served at the bare cost of material, averaging around three cents per day per pupil.

At the close of the year in June five pupils were graduated from the tenth grade. Four of these pupils are now carrying on their work in senior high schools in this or other states.
