(as far as known February 15)

Article 1. To choose all necessary town officers for the year ensuing.

Article 2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray Town charges for the year ensuing and make appropriations of the same.

Article 3. To see how much money the town will raise and appropriate for the Abbie Greenleaf library, and for the salary of the Librarian.

Article 4. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to apply to the State for State aid and Trunk line aid and maintenance for our highways for the ensuing year; and to raise and appropriate money for the same.

Article 5. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of highways and bridges for the year ensuing.

Article 6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise and appropriate for Memorial day and to choose an agent to expend the same.

Article 7. To see how much money, if any, the town will vote to raise and appropriate for oiling roads. (or other dust preventative)

Article 8. To see how much money the town will raise and appropriate for lighting the streets for the coming year.

An extraordinary year.

Your highway appropriation was \$1,000 less than last year. Unusually heavy rains caused serious and expensive washouts. We have endeavored to remove the likelihood of a recurrence by better drainage, and have purchased and installed nearly \$500 worth of the best culverts obtainable, and would advise completion of work this year. We built one new cement bridge, repaired dry bridge and completed sidewalk to Lisbon line. With bridge piers and revaluation of real estate it has certainly been a strenuous year. We are gratified to be able to say that all this extra work was done with an extra expense of little more than \$1,000. And the town has a good pump and derrick out of this worth \$700, so really the net loss is about \$325.

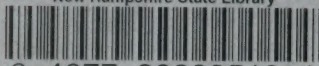
