



#### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE TOWN WARRANT HANCOCK NH

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Hancock, in the County of Hillsborough in said state qualified to vote in Town Affairs; You are hereby notified to meet at the Hancock Town Office Building on March 8, 2011 at eight of the clock in the forenoon until seven of the clock in the afternoon to vote on ballot of Town Officers and all other matters requiring ballot vote; and, to meet at said Hancock Fire Station in said Hancock, on Saturday, the twelfth (12<sup>th</sup>) day of March 2011 at nine of the clock in the morning, to act upon the following subjects:

- 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year ensuing.
- 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate up to three hundred fifty-five thousand dollars (\$355,000.00) for the purpose of funding a five-year Road Reconstruction project on Prospect Hill Road, Sugarbush Road, Ledge Road and Juniper Circle; and, to authorize the issuance of not more than \$355,000.00 of long term notes or bonds in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (RSA Chapter 33); and, further, to authorize the municipal officials to issue and negotiate such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon. This is a non-lapsing article and will not lapse until the project is complete or by December 31, 2015, whichever comes first. Selectboard recommends; Advisory Committee 4 to 1 in favor. 2/3 BALLOT VOTE REQUIRED
- 3. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate \$1,862,259.00. This represents the operating budget, inclusive of the Water Department operations. Said sum exclusive of all special or individual articles addressed. Selectboard recommends; Advisory Committee 3 to 2 in favor
- 4. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to nineteen thousand dollars (\$19,000.00) to repair the roof on the 1988 addition to the Library; up to \$12,500 to come from Library Trust Funds and up to \$6,500 to come from taxation. Selectboard recommends; Advisory Committee unanimous support
- 5. To see if the Town of Hancock will raise and appropriate one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for the Child Advocacy Center of Hillsborough County. Selectboard recommends; Advisory committee unanimous support.

- 6. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate the amount of five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) to be placed in the Meetinghouse Capital Reserve Fund (established in 2010). Selectboard recommends; Advisory Committee unanimous support.
- 7. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000.00) for a statistical update of all property assessments in town and, to fund this appropriation from the 2010 fund balance. Selectboard recommends; Advisory Committee unanimous support.
- 8. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$2444.00 for the purpose of purpose of purchasing baseball equipment and doing maintenance and repairs to the ball fields; and to authorize the withdrawl of this sum from the Hancock Baseball Fund (Revenue Fund) established for this purpose at the 1997 town meeting to fund this appropriation. Selectboard recommends
- 9. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$934 for the purpose of repairs to the tennis court; and to authorize the withdrawal of this sum from the Hancock Tennis Court Fund (Revenue Fund) established for this purpose at the 1993 town meeting to fund this appropriation. Selectboard recommends
- 10. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$1499.00. for the purpose of repairs and replacement of recreational facilities; and to authorize the withdrawl of this sum from the Hancock Recreation Fund (Revenue Fund) established for this purpose at the 1993 town meeting to fund this appropriation. Selectboard recommends
- 11. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$5,995.00 for the purpose of repairs and replacement of town highway equipment; and to authorize the withdrawal of this sum from the Hancock Highway Special Revenue Fund established for this purpose at the 1999 town meeting to fund this appropriation. {No funds to be raised by taxation.} Selectboard recommends
- 12. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$5,838.00 for the purpose of repairs and replacement of police equipment; and to authorize the withdrawal of this sum from the Hancock Police Equipment Repair/Replacement Fund (Revenue Fund) established for this purpose at the 1993 town meeting to fund this appropriation. {No funds to be raised by taxation.} Selectboard recommends

- 13. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to \$4,109.00 for the purpose of preservation and storage of the town's archival records; and to authorize the withdrawal of this sum from the Hancock History Fund (Revenue Fund) established for this purpose at the 1993 town meeting to fund this appropriation. {No funds to be raised by taxation.} Selectboard recommends
- 14. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of three thousand seven hundred fifty dollars (\$3,750.00) for the purpose of funding The Grapevine Family and Community Resource Center programs and services for the people of Antrim, Bennington, Francestown and Hancock. This amount represents the Town of Hancock's portion of the funds needed to support The Grapevine. Selectboard recommends; Advisory Committee unanimous support.
- 15. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to remove the closed Mill Road bridge over Moose Brook on the Class A trail established in 2005 that joins the lower end of Mill Road with Garand Lane and install a walking/riding bridge (no motorized vehicles) in its place. Funding to come from donations. No funds to be raised from taxation. (This is a non-lapsing article and will not lapse until the project is complete or by 2016.) This project to be completed as funding allows. Selectboard recommends.
- 16. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) to be placed in the Bridge Capital Reserve Fund established in 2007. Selectboard recommends; Advisory Committee unanimous support.
- 17. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to raise and appropriate up to twenty-three thousand two hundred dollars (\$23,200.00) to replace the roof and paint the Grange Hall (Post Office). Selectboard recommends; Advisory Committee unanimous support.
- 18. To see if the Town of Hancock will vote to authorize the Selectboard to accept the reports of auditors and committees as printed in the Town Report.
- 19. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

#### REPORT OF THE SELECTBOARD

The challenge for the Selectboard is to find the balance in meeting all of the needs in the management of the Town affairs while exercising restraint on the operating budget. At all times it is important for its members to be good stewards of the Town's resources, but it is especially critical in these economic times. Necessary services must be provided and infrastructure maintained. The Town is fortunate to have an excellent group of employees in all departments. Their efforts are critical in keeping our costs under control. It is important to provide the proper incentives in salaries and benefits to retain these employees. It is also important to maintain our Capital Improvements Program so that more costly repairs and replacements are not needed in the future. The challenge is clear and the Selectboard is committed to finding the proper balance.

There are areas that affect the Town over which the Selectboard has little or no control. The Town's current portion of the tax rate is only 25%. Even that portion is affected by decisions that are made at the State level. Last year the State ceased the revenue sharing program and this year there is a 66% increase in our contribution to the State retirement program as well a possible increase of 15.2% in the health insurance premiums. The School portion of the current tax rate is 69% including the State education tax. As a resident, being aware of these costs and communicating your concerns to the School or State Representatives is critical in managing the tax rate.

The changes in the Town Office with the new Treasurer and part-time Bookkeeper are working out very well. The fiscal management of the Town is greatly improved and there should be future savings on the annual audit to significantly offset any added costs.

The Police Department is back to its full complement of officers with the addition of a full-time and a part-time officer. The Selectboard has received numerous complements regarding the department and their efforts are greatly appreciated.

The Selectboard wishes to thank all of the Town departments, employees, and volunteers for their work over the past year. It is a pleasure to serve in this Town because of them.

This year saw the completion of projects that have been many years in the making. The Main Street Improvements are complete and the Village Planning Committee is retired with gratitude from all. The Norway Pond Beach and Parking improvements are also complete thanks to the efforts of the Norway Pond Committee. The water main was extended up Antrim Road and that section was repaved after having been delayed for a few years. Many other smaller projects were completed by both employees and volunteers. Thank you to all.

There are many continuing and future projects as well. The Fire Station, Public Works Facility, and Recycling Center will have photovoltaic electric systems installed thanks to a grant obtained by the HEAT Committee. These systems should provide 75% of the electrical power used by these facilities. There will be a weatherization program affecting the Town Offices, Meeting House and Fire Station also thanks to a grant obtained by the Heat Committee. These two programs should result in some meaningful energy and cost savings to

the Town. The Police Station, Fire Station, and Public Works Facility will be getting new emergency generators as the result of a cost—sharing grant from FEMA. The need for these generators was clearly demonstrated during the ice storm.

Future projects include a 5 year road improvement program as part of a 10 year road plan, replacement of the Bandstand, and restoration of the Meeting House. The needs of the Meeting House will be determined by a study partially funded by a Moose Plate Heritage Grant with the remaining funds from the Church and Town. There is at present no firm timetable for the Bandstand and Meeting House projects.

Please take the time in looking through the Town Report to note the efforts of all of the Town Committees and Boards. The success of these groups represent a great many hours of work by their volunteer members. We all owe them our continued gratitude and appreciation.

# REPORT OF THE HANCOCK BUDGET ADVISORY COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR 2011

As members of the Hancock Budget Advisory Committee, we continue to express concern and caution about economic conditions, both here in Hancock and across the country – and the world. As a result of those concerns, we have adopted the following positions.

#### **General Recommendations**

We believe the town should strive for a budget that does not increase property taxes, given the financial challenges many town residents are facing. The proposed operating budget (exclusive of warrant articles) calls for an increase of approximately four percent over last year's approved budget. We believe this proposed increase is a cause for concern in uncertain financial times.

The State of New Hampshire has, for example, rescinded its contribution for police pension benefits and made this the town's responsibility. This move has a significant effect on the town's expenses, both for this year's budget and those to come. In light of the state's current budget woes, we recognize there is likely little that can be done to reverse this decision.

In fact, the HAC believes the town should prepare for the possibility of additional cost shifting by the state, coupled with the possibility of decreased revenues from vehicle registrations, rooms and meals taxes (shared by the state), and other income sources, by having a reduced contingency budget in mind. Overall, we encourage the select board and department heads to remain cautious about proposed income and expenditures in the coming months.

Finally, we continue to recommend that warrant articles with a tax impact of \$10,000 or more be voted on by secret ballot.

#### Warrant Articles

We have taken the following positions on specific warrant articles.

We support the five-year road reconstruction plan. (4 to 1 in favor.)

We support the operating budget, although with reservations as noted above. (3 to 2 in favor.)

We unanimously support the library roof repair.

We unanimously support the contribution of \$1,000 to the Child Advocacy Center of Hillsborough County.

(We suggest this be made a part of the police budget for review purposes moving forward, in order to save time at town meeting.)

We unanimously support the addition of \$5,000 to the Meetinghouse Capital Reserve Fund.

We unanimously support the consolidation of recreation funds. (Articles 7, 8, 9 and 10.)

We unanimously support a statistical update of the town's property values.

We unanimously support the contribution of \$3,750 to The Grapevine Family and Community Resource Center:

(We suggest this be made a part of the health and human services budget for review purposes moving forward, in order to save time at town meeting.)

We unanimously support the addition of \$5,000 to the Bridge Capital Reserve Fund.

We unanimously support the roof repair and repainting of the Grange Hall (Post Office.)

We did not take a position on the remaining warrant articles, which do not impact the town's budget or tax rate. As a group, we felt the above warrant articles were a wise use of funds.

#### **SUMMARY OF 2010 TOWN MEETING MINUTES**

- **ARTICLE I:** Town officers were elected by ballot on March 9th, 2010. Moderator Haskins read the results of the March 9<sup>th</sup>, 2010 election.
- **ARTICLE 2:** Voted by a ballot to see if the Town of Hancock was in favor of Amendment 1 to the existing Zoning Ordinance as proposed by the Planning Board which would add Article 3.5A "Building Permit Not Required" which would increase from 100 square feet to 200 square feet the size of certain accessory structures which may be built without a building permit. The Article **PASSED** Yes: 357 No: 48.
- **ARTICLE 3:** Voted by ballot to see if the Town of Hancock would vote to raise and appropriate \$1,793,500.00 which represents the operating budget, inclusive of the Water Department operations. The Article **PASSED** Yes: 186 No: 5.
- **ARTICLE 4:** Voted by a show of cards to see if the Town of Hancock would vote to raise and appropriate one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) for the Child Advocacy Center of Hillsborough County. The Article **PASSED** with a majority.
- **ARTICLE 5:** Voted by a ballot to see if the Town of Hancock would vote to raise and appropriate up to twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) to repair and rebuild components on the 1994 Mack in place of purchasing a new truck. The Article **PASSED** Yes: 187 No: 2.
- **ARTICLE 6:** Voted by a show of cards to see if the Town of Hancock would vote to raise and appropriate up to three thousand seven hundred fifty dollars (\$3,750.00) for the purpose of funding The Grapevine Family and Community Resource Center programs and services for the people of Antrim, Bennington, Francestown and Hancock. This amount represents the Town of Hancock's portion of the funds needed to support the Grapevine. The Article **PASSED** with a majority.
- **ARTICLE 7:** Voted by a show of cards to see if the Town of Hancock would establish a Capital Reserve Fund under the provisions of RSA 35:1 for the purpose of maintaining the structure of the Meetinghouse and to appoint the Select Board the Agents to expend the fund and to raise and appropriate the amount of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) to be placed in this fund. The Article **PASSED** with a majority.
- **ARTICLE 8:** Voted be a show of cards to postpone a motion to see if the Town of Hancock would vote to raise and appropriate up to five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) as the town's share to paint a portion of the Meeting House. A motion was made to postpone this indefinitely. The motion was voted on by a show of cards and **PASSED** with a majority.

Select Board Chair John Jordan administered the Oath of Office to the newly elected officials present at the meeting.

Bill Eva gave a Maple Syrup Report and Kurt Grassett spoke on the Main Street Improvements.

- **ARTICLE 9:** Voted by ballot to see if the Town of Hancock would vote to rescind the provisions of Article 11 of the 2004 Town Meeting which stated that 50% of the Land Use Change Tax, up to a maximum of \$6,000 be placed in the Conservation Land Use Change Fund and was authorized by Town Meeting pursuant to RSA 79-A which if adopted, would take effect April 1, 2010. An amendment was made to Article 9 to see if the Town would vote to rescind for a period of two years the provisions to Article 11. The amended Article was voted on by a show of cards and did NOT PASS. The Article was voted on by ballot and **PASSED** Yes: 102 No: 67.
- **ARTICLE 10:** Voted by a show of cards to see if the Town of Hancock would raise and appropriate two thousand two hundred eighty seven dollars (\$2,287.00) for the purpose of repairs and replacement of recreational facilities and to withdraw this sum from the Hancock Recreation Fund (Revenue Fund). The Article **PASSED** unanimously.
- **ARTICLE 11:** Voted by a show of cards to see if the Town of Hancock would raise and appropriate three thousand eight hundred ninety one dollars (\$3,891.00) for the purpose of repairs and replacement of town highway equipment and to authorize the withdrawal of this sum from the Hancock Highway Special Revenue Fund. The Article **PASSED** unanimously.
- **ARTICLE 12:** Voted by voice vote to see if the Town of Hancock would raise and appropriate up to four thousand nine hundred fifty dollars (\$4,950.00) for the purpose of repairs and replacement of police equipment and to authorize the withdrawal of this sum from the Hancock Police Equipment Repair/Replacement Fund (Revenue Fund). The Article **PASSED** unanimously.
- **ARTICLE 13:** Voted by voice vote to see if the Town of Hancock would raise and appropriate up to six hundred thirty one dollars (\$631.00) for the purpose of purchasing baseball equipment and doing maintenance and repairs to the ball fields; and to authorize the withdrawal of this sum from the Hancock Baseball Fund (Revenue Fund). The Article **PASSED** unanimously.
- **ARTICLE 14:** Voted by voice to see if the Town of Hancock would vote to raise and appropriate up four thousand twenty three dollars (\$4,023.00) for the purpose of preservation and storage of the town's archival records and to authorize the withdrawal of this sum from the Hancock History Fund (Revenue Fund). The Article **PASSED** unanimously.
- **ARTICLE 15:** Voted by voice vote to see if the Town of Hancock would vote to raise and appropriate up to nine hundred sixty one dollars (\$961.00) for the purpose of repairs to the tennis court and to authorize the withdrawal of this sum from the Hancock Tennis Court Fund. The Article **PASSED** unanimously.
- **ARTICLE 16:** Voted by ballot to see if the town would vote to approve the following resolution to be forwarded to our State Representative(s), our State Senator, the Speaker of the House and the Senate President. Resolved: The citizens of New Hampshire should be allowed to vote on an amendment to the New Hampshire Constitution that defines "marriage". **BY PETITION.** The Article **FAILED** Yes: 32 No: 102.
- ARTICLE 17: Voted by voice vote to see if the Town of Hancock would vote to authorize the Select Board to accept the reports of auditors and committees as printed in the Town Report.

David Carney asked to have the article amended to include all financial reports. The amendment was voted on by voice vote and **PASSED** but not unanimously. The amended Article was voted on by voice vote and **PASSED** unanimously.

**ARTICLE 18:** To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting. There being no further business a motion was made to adjourn the meeting. The MOTION was voted on by voice vote and **PASSED** unanimously.

The meeting adjourned at 1:45 p.m.

#### INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Members of the Board of Selectmen Town of Hancock Hancock, New Hampshire

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the governmental activities, each major fund and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Hancock as of and for the fiscal year ended December 31, 2009, which collectively comprise the Town's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Town of Hancock's management. Our responsibility is to express opinions on these financial statements based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinions.

The government-wide statement of net assets does not include any of the Town's capital assets nor the accumulated depreciation on those assets, and the government-wide statement of activities does not include depreciation expense related to those assets. These amounts have not been determined. Therefore, in our opinion, the financial statements referred to above do not present fairly the respective financial position of the governmental activities of the Town of Hancock at December 31, 2009, and the respective changes in financial position thereof for the year then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America

As discussed in Note 13 to the financial statements, management has not disclosed a liability and all other information for other postemployment benefits in governmental activities. Accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America require that other postemployment benefits be disclosed on the government-wide financial statements, which would possibly result in liabilities, reduce the net assets, and change the expenses of the governmental activities. The amount by which this departure would affect the liabilities, net assets and expenses of the governmental activities is not reasonably determinable.

Also, in our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of each major fund and the aggregate remaining fund information of the Town of Hancock as of December 31, 2009, and the respective changes in financial position thereof for the year then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

The budgetary comparison information is not a required part of the basic financial statements, but is supplementary information required by accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. We have applied certain limited procedures, which consisted principally of inquiries of management regarding the methods of measurement and presentation of the required supplementary information. However, we did not audit the information and express no opinion on it.

The Town of Hancock has not presented a management's discussion and analysis that accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America have determined is necessary to supplement, although not required to be part of, the basic financial statements.

Our audit was conducted for the purpose of forming opinions on the financial statements that collectively comprise the Town of Hancock's basic financial statements as a whole. The combining and individual fund schedules are presented for purposes of additional analysis and are not a required part of the basic financial statements. They have been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements, and in our opinion, are fairly stated in all material respects in relation to the basic financial statements taken as a whole.

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# INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S COMMUNICATION OF CONTROL DEFICIENCIES AND OTHER MATTERS

To the Members of the Board of Selectmen Town of Hancock Hancock, New Hampshire

In planning and reporting our audit of the financial statements of the Town of Hancock as of and for the fiscal year ended December 31, 2009, in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, we considered the Town's internal control over financial reporting (internal control) as a basis for designing our auditing procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinions on the financial statements, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Town's internal control. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the Town of Hancock's internal control.

Our consideration of internal control was for the limited purpose described in the preceding paragraph and would not necessarily identify all deficiencies in internal control that might be significant deficiencies or material weaknesses. However, as discussed below, we identified certain deficiencies in internal control that we consider to be significant deficiencies and other deficiencies that we consider to be material weaknesses.

A control deficiency exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent or detect misstatements on a timely basis. A significant deficiency is a control deficiency, or combination of control deficiencies, that adversely affects the Town's ability to initiate, authorize, record, process, or report financial data reliably in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles such that there is more than a remote likelihood that a misstatement of the financial statements that is more than inconsequential will not be prevented or detected by the Town's internal control. We consider the following deficiencies to be significant deficiencies in internal control.

#### Financial Statements

Again, in 2009 the recordkeeping of the Town was inadequate, necessitating members of the audit staff to assist in performing numerous reconciliations of the various general ledger proprietary accounts. In addition, it was noted that the treasurer was not providing the administrator with month-end reconciliations, along with year-end financial reporting.

We did note that the Town treasurer resigned at the end of 2009 and was replaced by an individual with an accounting background. In late 2009, the Town hired a bookkeeper who has been working with the new treasurer to ensure that going forward in 2010, the general ledger is balanced and properly reconciled.

#### Treasurer's Duties and Responsibilities

The treasurer did not provide a monthly report to the Town. Also, it was apparent that he did not reconcile the various cash accounts maintained by the Town with the monthly bank statements received. Likewise, there were no cash journals maintained for any of the various escrow accounts.

There was initially a variance of \$49,022.52 between the general fund cash control account and the treasurer's check register at December 31, 2009. Considerable additional time was spent by the audit staff, the bookkeeper and new treasurer to reconcile this variance, all of which was eventually accounted for. Finally, we noted that the tax collector and the treasurer were not reconciling their records on a regular basis.

The treasurer's duties and responsibilities include adequate record keeping for all Town cash and investment accounts, along with the monthly reconciliation with depository banks and institutions, as well as with the bookkeeper, tax collector, and town clerk. Likewise, a monthly report to the Board of Selectmen indicating the cash and investment balances is required.

# Town of Hancock Independent Auditor's Communication of Control Deficiencies and Other Matters

The treasurer's duties are an integral part of the Town's internal accounting control system. It is clear that the absence of this control function in 2009 contributed greatly to the deficiencies noted with the entire general ledger system.

As mentioned above, a new Town treasurer took office in late 2009. She is fully aware of her duties and responsibilities and has been reconciling monthly with the bookkeeper, tax collector and town clerk and she is providing monthly reports to the Board of Selectmen.

We also want to discuss the following other issues that we do not consider to be significant deficiencies.

#### Town Policies

The Town's control policies should ensure that management and employees establish and maintain an environment throughout the Town that sets a positive and supportive attitude toward internal control and conscientious management. The control environment established by the Board of Selectmen sets the tone for how the Town employees and elected officials conduct its business.

As the Board of Selectmen and department heads strive to achieve the goals of the Town and provide accountability for their operations, they need to continually examine internal controls to determine how well they are performing, how they may be improved and the degree to which they help identify and address major risks for fraud, waste, abuse and mismanagement.

We noted that the Town has not yet formally adopted any policies for code of ethics, anti-fraud, disaster recovery, and accounting procedures, which are essential tools necessary to manage the Town's operations efficiently and effectively.

We strongly recommend that the Board of Selectmen develop and formally adopt the above noted policies in order to clearly communicate the Town's position on these issues. Adopting the various policies is critical in preventing interruptions due to personnel vacancies, facilitating supervision and evaluation, and will also help to minimize the risk of losses.


#### Investment Policies

RSA 41:9 for the Board of Selectmen and RSA 31:25 for the trustees of trust funds state that the investment policy should be reviewed and approved annually. While the Board of Selectmen and trustees of trust funds each have an investment policy, neither policy has been reviewed or approved since 2008. In addition, neither policy contains the required GASB Statement No. 40 *Deposits and Investment Risk Disclosures*, language which requires additional disclosures for the various types of risk that may affect the government's investments.

We recommend that the Board of Selectmen and trustees of trust funds annually review and approve their investment policies and they revise the existing investment policies to address credit risk, concentration of credit risk, interest rate risk, and foreign currency risk.

#### REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES OF TRUST FUNDS

In 2010 the trust funds for the town increased their value along with the general market trend upwards. Due to the conservative asset allocation of approximately 20% equities and 80% bonds and cash, the trust funds appreciated approximately 6% overall this year. This conservative investment asset allocation insures that two long standing goals will most likely be met over time: the portfolio will rise or fall only a small percentage of the overall market change in any given year and the money ought to be there in a stable way for a long time to provide income for the beneficiaries of the trust funds.

The requests for distributions from the funds have been fairly consistent this year as in the past several years. The elementary school, library, cemeteries and fire department are the main beneficiaries of the trust funds year in and year out. The library requested their monthly withdrawal from the trust funds for operating expenses while the cemetery trust funds once again funded the annual maintenance cost of the cemeteries. The actual distribution for the year was made in early 2011. Sales of cemetery lots provide some annual revenue for the cemetery trust funds. The Thomas and Eleanor Manning Scholarship is now at a current award level of \$900 for a student pursuing a post-secondary educational career as defined by the bequest.

The fire department used money from the Helen Brown Funds to purchase various pieces of equipment including protective turnout gear, replacement pagers, brush fire safety equipment, traffic safety clothing and equipment, and a multipro dangerous gas detector. By using the Helen Brown Funds to purchase replacement safety gear as well as other needed equipment these recurring costs do not affect the town tax rate.

The Hancock elementary school was the recipient of several disbursements again this year. The annual New Hampshire Dance Institute program was funded by the school trusts. The trusts also funded the annual author residency program in the spring. As has been the practice for a number of years, the trusts paid for the year-end school trip bus fee.

The Bridge Capital Reserve Fund was used to complete the funding of the replacement of the Antrim Road bridge.

Hancock residents have been generous in the past by making bequests to the town for the benefit of the town and its residents. Without the support of the trust funds either taxes would be higher or certain needs would go unanswered.

The trustees would like to thank the other boards, commissioners, town departments and staff for the cooperative way that all decisions regarding these funds are reached every year.

#### REPORT OF THE TOWN TAX COLLECTOR

This year I had the opportunity to continue my training and certification in the following professional development opportunities. The NH Tax Collector's Annual Spring Workshop focused on the Tax Collector's RSA's and Duties with a follow up on current legislation and a report from the NH Department of Revenue. Hillsborough County Tax Collectors met in Hillsborough to discuss Bankruptcy laws and filing of claims with a legal representative from Local Government Center. And finally the Annual Tax Collectors Conference was a wealth of information and networking opportunities with old acquaintances. All of the above opportunities continue to provide our town with the most current procedures and legal processes related to property taxation.

The 2010 property tax rate set by the Department of Revenue was apportioned as follows:

Town \$4.31 Local School \$9.80 State School \$2.19 County \$1.00

Total Tax Rate \$17.30 per \$1000.00 of assessed property value

The 2010 property tax rate represented an overall decrease of \$.85 per \$1000.00 of assessed property value.

Our town sends out bills semi-annually to generate the revenues needed to support our community. The first bill is typically due by July 1 and the second bill is due December 1 to cover the tax fiscal year of April 1 – March 31. The first property tax bill is an estimated bill based on the previous year's tax rate. The second bill generated is based on the new tax rate set by the Department of Revenue in the fall. This new rate is applied to the current assessed value of your property as of April 1<sup>st</sup>.

State law requires that tax bills be sent to the address of the last known property owner as recorded on the deed at the Hillsborough County Registry of Deeds. If there is a change of ownership or mailing address, please notify our office of these changes.

I would like everyone in town to feel free to call or e-mail me at any time with questions or concerns relative to the payment and collection of property, timber yield, current use change and excavation taxes. I check phone and e-mail messages regularly during the week. Regular hours at town offices have changed, our new hours are Monday afternoons 4pm-6pm and Thursday mornings 9am-11am.

# REPORT OF THE HANCOCK LIBRARY DIRECTOR

# In reading, as in eating, an appetite is half the feast. - Anonymous

The residents of Hancock continued to have a healthy appetite for reading and for using the library in 2010. The children in town led the way, reading 700 books over the six-week Summer Reading Program (*Make A Splash – Read!*) this past year. Having challenged the children to read that many books, the Library Director then had to come through with her end of the bargain: dying her hair blue to celebrate such an achievement. Check out the library's blog to see the results (<a href="http://hancocktownlibrary.blogspot.com/">http://hancocktownlibrary.blogspot.com/</a>). Special thanks to the Hancock Woman's Club for helping to fund our Summer Reading Program again this year.

Computer use was up this year with our four public computers being used 2,579 times. We do not track individuals using their own laptops but anecdotally we know that many people use the library as a hot spot during and after hours.

Circulation is holding strong at 25,040 which includes those who download books from our downloadable audio book site (<a href="http://nh.lib.overdrive.com/">http://nh.lib.overdrive.com/</a>). Ebooks are also available at this site. We loaned 344 books to other libraries around the state through interlibrary loan and borrowed 845 books, DVDs, and audios from other libraries around New Hampshire and other states.

The library's collection of books, books on tape and CD, videos, and DVDs, comes to 19,993. We also have 55 different periodicals from which to choose.

There are a total of 1,555 people who have library cards, 63 of whom are non-residents. We gave out 55 new adult cards and 23 new children's cards in 2010. 109 people are fans of our Facebook page (<a href="http://www.facebook.com/#!/hancocknhlibrary">http://www.facebook.com/#!/hancocknhlibrary</a>).

The library was well-used by the community-at-large again in 2010. The library sponsored 48 different programs which met 126 times in the Daniels Room drawing 1,915 people to these events. This does not include the weekly visits from preschools and the elementary school throughout the academic year. Children's Librarian, Britton Kennedy, and Roberta Nylander, read to the children and held Story and Craft Time weekly. That's 93 sessions of reading a total of 228 books to 2,218 children!

Community groups also used the Daniels Room. Thirty-three different non-library groups used the Daniels Room 172 times, drawing in 1,613 people.

2010 marked the 150<sup>th</sup> birthday of a lending library in Hancock (it all began with a couple of shelves of books in the local store). We celebrated with several events and a fundraising campaign to increase the funds which are held to meet future needs of the library building. To date over \$7,500 has been donated and at this writing more is trickling in. We are grateful

for the support and know that this library is fortunate to have such a generous community behind it.

The Friends of the Library, under the very capable leadership of Jane Richards-Jones, had another banner year with their annual book sale in August. Special thanks to Nancy Daniels and Jill Kuchinos for running the book sale so efficiently and seemingly effortlessly. The funds they raised went to the purchase of new public computers as well as all the extras that make this library so special: speakers on a wide variety of topics, summer reading program prizes and entertainment, most of the DVDs which are new releases, the fees for the rights to show movies and download audiobooks, and a thousand other small but necessary items needed to keep this library running.

As always, a heartfelt thank you to all the people who volunteer for this library. The volunteers are at the front desk checking out your books, or helping set up the computers, or sorting, boxing and carrying books for the book sale, or creating gorgeous signs, or taking things to the dump, or repairing books. It seems whenever, whatever we ask, people step up to help. We couldn't do it without you!

#### REPORT OF THE LIBRARY BOARD OF TRUSTEES

2010 marked the 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Hancock Public Library. Due to the generosity of volunteers and residents of the town, more than \$7,500 has been donated to the library to mark this milestone. This money will help ensure that there are funds for the maintenance and improvement of the library for another 150 years.

In 2010 the Trustees began the process of replacing the roof over the newer 1988 addition to the Library. If Town Meeting votes to provide 1/3 of the cost, the roof should be replaced by the fall of 2011. There remain several items that need to be addressed as part of the Trustees' capital improvement program, but the roof is the most important of these, and would not be possible without the continued generosity and support of Hancock residents.

This year the Trustees would like to extend a special thanks to the Friends of the Library. Few people realize how important this group is to the continued vitality of the Library. Their annual summer book sale provides revenue that the Friends then use to assist the Library in a variety of important ways. In 2010 this support included the purchase of several new computers, funding special programs for children and adults, and the continued donation of many DVDs which continue to be a very popular part of the Library's collection.

# REPORT OF THE HANCOCK FIRE DEPARTMENT

In reviewing the past year, I can report that not one single truck fell through the ice on Lake Nubanusit in 2010! The fire department did make a few runs up to the lake, but it was only for a loose boat and a few illegal fires on the land owned by Keene State.

We had a total of 165 calls in 2010, up a bit from previous years. Our members had 1625 man hours in these calls. Only two chimney fires were reported in the year. We set up landing zones for DHART helicopters twice, had four psychological emergencies, 11 car crashes, one search, 16 fire alarm activations, and several Carbon Monoxide alarms. We sent Mutual Aid trucks to nine different towns on a total of 34 calls. Some of these were for large fires in Antrim and Greenfield, while many were for cover trucks, including 14 runs to Peterborough.

February 2010 was a busy month for us. On the morning of the 22<sup>nd</sup>, we were called to a fire in a residence on North Road that quickly went to a second alarm. A corroded stove pipe thimble caused a fire in the wall of the house, and quickly spread through the ell. Quick work by our firefighters and those of surrounding towns kept the fire out of the main house, although there was extensive damage from the smoke. Firefighter Tom Villeneuve slipped on a wet tile and broke his wrist badly but is just about back to normal now. Four days later we had another early morning call to a house on Depot Road. This was another woodstove issue that had kindled a small fire in the attic. A small amount of water put out the fire but we had to pull down part of the ceiling and loose insulation above the stove, which made a big mess in their living room.

One other first alarm call came in May, to a house on Robinson Road. A fire in the fireplace had ignited some combustibles including chemicals that were stored to close to the hearth, creating a heavy and toxic smoke condition. The Bennington Fire Department was on scene as quickly as we were and helped out to vent the residence.

Firefighter Nick Gervasio retired from the department in 2010, and died after a long battle with cancer. Eric Aldrich and Eric Bedard were voted on as full members after one year of probationary status. Paul Towers has joined up as our newest member. We owe a big Thank You to Hunt Dowse, who filled in as our secretary/treasurer after the passing of Becky Lohmiller. Jon GrosJean has been elected to the secretary position, and MaryLou Cassidy is our new treasurer. Tom Ball was elected to be our third Captain, joining Mark Thompson and Bill Eva. These three plan and run all of our training exercises among other duties.

I owe Thank Yous to Assistant Chiefs John Pirkey and Tom Bates. John does a good deal of work with our budget and performs most of our inspections. Tom Bates has been keeping track of our hours with the new tracking software – I'm glad it's him and not me. Both men have been involved in writing grant proposals for the department.

Lastly, my thanks go out to the Hancock Police Department and the Department of Public works; the level of cooperation among our town departments is amazing. It is common to find a plow truck sanding the driveway at one of our calls, or the police chief shoveling a walkway for us. Other area towns would love to get this kind of help from their PD and DPW. ### REPORT OF THE FIRE WARDENS

We did not have any prolonged dry spells in 2010, so the brush fire threat was never too high. The Fire Department did extinguish one small fire in the woods at the junction of Routes 202 and 123, although no cause could be determined. We were toned out for a possible house fire on Norway Hill that turned out to be people with an over sized bonfire. We can issue seasonal campfire permits to Hancock residents, but remember, a campfire is a small, contained fire in a permanent pit or fire ring, not a bonfire.

I thought we were going to make it through a year without anyone in town violating State brush burning laws, and almost did....on December 26<sup>th</sup>, in the middle of a blizzard, some bonehead on Kimball Road decided it would be a good time to torch the remains of an old mobile home. That's not a brush fire, people. We spent a cold and miserable two hours up there extinguishing the mess, and are currently working to get repaid for our efforts. Brush fires are allowed for disposing of brush only; not debris, furniture, or trash. Certainly not mobile homes. We have posted flyers at the fire station and town offices that explain the do's and don'ts of brush burning. You can also get this information from our website; there is a link on the town's website. You can also call one of the deputy wardens listed below. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

# Report of Forest Fire Warden and State Forest Ranger

Your local Forest Fire Warden, Fire Department, and the State of New Hampshire Division of Forests & Lands, work collaboratively to reduce the risk and frequency of wildland fires in New Hampshire. To help us assist you, please contact your local Forest Fire Warden or Fire Department to determine if a permit is required before doing <u>ANY</u> outside burning. Under State law (RSA 227-L:17) a fire permit is required for all outside burning, unless the ground is completely covered with snow. The New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services also prohibits the open burning of household waste. Citizens are encouraged to contact the local fire department or DES at 1-800-498-6868 or <a href="www.des.state.nh.us">www.des.state.nh.us</a> for more information. Safe open burning requires diligence and responsibility. Help us to protect New Hampshire's forest resources. For more information please contact the Division of Forests and Lands at (603)271-2214, or online at <a href="www.nhdfl.org">www.nhdfl.org</a>.

This past fire season had a slightly lower number of fires, as well as lower number of acres burned than the 5 year average. What made this fire season somewhat unusual was that it lasted most of the summer. New Hampshire typically has a fairly active spring fire season and then the summer rains tend to dampen the fire activity later in the season. This year virtually all areas of the state had fires throughout the summer due to the periodic dry spells throughout the season. As has been the case over the last few years, state budget constraints have limited the staffing of our statewide system of 16 fire lookout towers to Class III or higher fire danger days. Despite the reduction in the number of days staffed, our fire lookouts are credited with keeping most fires small and saving several structures

due to their quick and accurate spotting capabilities. The towers fire spotting was supplemented by contracted aircraft and the NH Civil Air Patrol when the fire danger was especially high. The largest fire for the season was a 10.3 acre fire in Charlestown. Many homes in New Hampshire are located in the wildland urban interface, which is the area where homes and flammable wildland fuels intermix. Several of the fires during the 2010 season threatened structures, a constant reminder that forest fires burn more than just trees. Homeowners should take measures to prevent a wildland fire from spreading to their home. Precautions include keeping your roof and gutters clear of leaves and pine needles, and maintaining adequate green space around your home free of flammable materials. #### REPORT OF THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS

For the most part, 2010 was a relatively quiet and uneventful year for the Public Works Department. We had only 10 storms in the months of January, February and March. November and December saw a total of 6 storms, with 5 coming in the month of December. 16 storms in all made for a relatively light winter in 2010.

The summer months were spent doing some much needed maintenance work to our road network. The past few years we had several large projects that took up a substantial amount of time. Getting back to basics was needed to maintain our infrastructure. The only large project we undertook was the completion of Antrim Road by Norway Hill, This was completed in mid-October.

The early spring allowed us to get our sweeping and cleaning up done in March and early April. We were also able to get a jump start on brush cutting for the summer months. In late March we did have a substantial rain event that did some damage on the back side of Norway Hill Road. A culvert on private property was blocked and it ended up taking out a section of the paved road. After all was said and done, FEMA reimbursed us for the overtime and repair expenses.

During the month of May we rented a rubber tired excavator to perform ditch work on a number of our roads. This machine is faster and more efficient and maneuverable then other methods of ditch work. We were able to re-establish and shape the ditches along Mill Road, Longview Road, Old Hancock Road, Cross Road, Shady lane, Norway Hill Road, Duncan Road, Evergreen Hill road, Antrim Road Kimball Road, Knight Farm Road, Fairfield Road, and Carriage Hill Road.

In June we were able to wash and treat all our concrete bridges with a chloride neutralizer, this helps insure that chlorides do not start breaking down the concrete. We were also able to treat the wooden guardrails on Tannery Hill and Cavender Road with a wood preservative. We also painted the bridge rails on the Middle Road spillway bridge with rust inhibiting primer and a coat of paint.

Throughout July and August we replaced culverts, installed 3 new catch basins and pipes and removed some rocks that were coming up through the road. We also added gravel to Caverly Lane, Sunset Lane, Old Dublin Road, Pickering farm, Tannery Hill, Kimball Road, Daniels Road, Longview Road, Shady Lane, and Old Hancock Road.

In September we shimmed Windy Row, Vatcher Road, Hunts Pond and Kings Highway and Duncan Road in preparation for sand sealing. All of these roads were sand sealed in early October. As soon as the sealing was completed it was time to get ready for another winter season. We graded all our gravel roads, piled up our winter sand and pulled the plows out.

Amongst all the highway work, we also handled 14 burials for the cemetery, 6 water line repairs for the water department and hauled some of the recyclable material for the transfer station. We are responsible for the mowing of all the grass on the commons,

buildings, cemeteries, and ball fields, thankfully we have had a part-time buildings and grounds person that picks up the largest share of this work.

From a planning perspective, I spent 2010 determining the maintenance needs of our paved and gravel roads. I have put together a 10 year gravel road maintenance plan as well as a 5 year paved road maintenance plan. Having solid plans in place will help us to budget our limited resources in a manner that will allow us extend the useful life of our roads.

I also developed a 10 year plan of those roads that need reconstruction. The roads on this list have used up their useful life, and we are no longer getting extensions of time from our maintenance procedures. In short we are throwing good money after bad. The first phase of this plan will be addressed at the 2011 Town Meeting.

The economic slowdown has forced us to look at ways to extend the life of all our assets. It has also forced us to look at how we do things. I am happy to say that all the employees at the Public Works Department have been a part of the solution. We are now performing more maintenance in house, we are also performing some welding duties, and in 2010 we all learned how to run a paver and do the asphalt shim with our own staff. This has enabled us to minimize cost increases, but it has not enabled us to totally eliminate them. We continue to look at ways to streamline our operations, with the overall goal of providing the best service possible.

We did have some staff turnover during 2010. In October Jon Charlonne resigned to pursue other endeavors. Jeff Wright was promoted to Foreman and has been doing an excellent job in making the transition from Worker to supervisor. I did not fill the vacant slot until early in 2011, more on that next year. In late December Graham Slamin gave us his notice as he had been recalled by his previous employer for full time employment. I have filled his slot temporarily for the winter, so that we can re-evaluate this position before we hire another buildings and grounds person.

I would like to thank The Town Office staff, the Police, and Fire Departments for their help and assistance throughout the year. I would like to thank the Selectboard for their guidance and support and especially the townspeople for the continued support throughout the year. I want to personally thank my staff for their professionalism and dedication to the Town of Hancock. I cannot stress enough how dedicated employees are the main reason we can continue to operate efficiently and as productively as we do.

#### 2010 DUMP COMMITTEE REPORT

Recycling has been mandatory in Hancock for over 20 years. We are still amazed when we learn that people do not realize that you must recycle in order to use our facility. Information on how and what to recycle can be found by asking any of our attendants, calling the Public Works office (525-4087) or at: http://www.hancocknh.org/DPW/Dump-Handout-20101130.htm. Recycling continues to be the best way to manage the costs associated with the disposal of our trash.

The Hancock recycling center handled just over 565 tons of solid waste and recyclables over the year. We handled 242 tons of recycled material, which netted an income of \$25,937 for the year. Residents tossed out 323 ton of trash during the year, which cost us \$41,827. This brings our recycling rate in at 42.8% for 2010. Overall we processed 75 ton less than in the previous year.

The dump committee has been busy trying to develop the 10 year plan for the facility. In November the committee held a meeting to listen to the residents concerns and suggestions for the facility. Since that meeting we have implemented some of the suggestions that we heard. The facility is now open from 3PM until 7PM on Wednesday. Opening at 4PM was a little too late, particularly in the winter months when it is dark before 5 PM. We have also improved the parking for the swap shop. We are hoping the patrons that want to take their time exploring the swap shop will pull over into this parking area and help alleviate some of the congestion we were experiencing at the recycling counter.

Other areas that we continue to look at include later hours on Saturday, longer Saturday hours for the burn pile/demolition, and ways to encourage a better recycling rate. Our recycling rate is hovering around 40% and has done so for the last few years. There is no reason why we cannot achieve a rate of 55%-60% if everyone using the facility would separate as much as possible. Ideas on ways to achieve this goal range form Stiffer monitoring of the compactor, fines for not recycling, requiring clear bags, and looking at pay per bag. None of these ideas are a clear winner but they remain topics that the committee will be discussing over the ensuing year.

Once again our thanks go out to Cathy, Garrett, and David; they truly make a trip to the dump a pleasant experience. We would also like to thank the employees at the Public Works Department and the Town Office Staff. The Swap Shop volunteers have done a terrific job sorting and displaying good clean usable items for the ultimate in recycling. In 2010 a long time committee member decided to pursue other endeavors. Dick Bell has been on the dump committee for over 15 years. We would like to thank Dick for his countless hours he has spent at committee meetings, filling in at the facility and his guidance and history that he brought to our meetings. We wish him well in his future endeavors.

#### REPORT OF THE HANCOCK POLICE DEPARTMENT

I have completed my first full year in Hancock as the Chief of Police. We have been extremely busy this year. We have made great strides toward becoming a more community related department. We have worked hard in establishing excellent communications with other town departments as well as the citizens of Hancock. Our department continues to go through changes. Staffing has been a major concern of mine. Officer John Melia resigned in March. We were able to fill our third full-time position. We hired Melissa Hetrick. She came to us from the Swanzey Police Department. Melissa was in the medical field prior to being hired by Swanzey in 2009. She completed the New Hampshire Full-time Academy and received the physical fitness award for her academy class. Melissa has been a terrific addition to this department. She brings a very positive attitude within the department as well as to the public at large. We also hired George Xenakis at the end of the year to fill the open part-time position. George is a senior at Franklin Pierce University in Rindge majoring in Criminal Justice. He will be attending the part-time academy that starts in February. Officer Nick Weeks continues to bring knowledge and experience to the department. He has help establish a field training program for the newly hired officers while continuing to be proactive within the community. Officer John Minichiello stepped up while we were short staffed to help fill open shifts. He sustained a hand injury at home during the early fall which put him out of commission and we welcome him back at the beginning of 2011.

Main Street has been a continuing factor for traffic and parking enforcement. I have been trying to be proactive with these issues. We have been monitoring traffic on Main Street to ensure that all of the work that was done for traffic calming is working. After the completion of the Main Street project, there has been confusion on where people are allowed to park. I was asked by the Selectmen to enforce the parking regulation with regards to events and parking on the common and not in proper parking spaces. I have attempted to take a proactive approach to this issue. We purchased "No Parking" signs that could be signed out to different organizations to address this issue. Hopefully with these signs and reminders we can educate motorists on the proper parking places here in town.

We have just about completed the minor changes to the police station. You will notice that everyone will be entering through the front door. We have opened up the lobby to have it be more welcoming and to utilize the space more efficiently. The inside of the police station has been painted and there were some closets and shelving installed. I think that these minor changes have brought a more "small town" feel to the building.

We have taken advantage of several training opportunities this year. I completed a two week prosecutor program which will allow me to prosecute more effectively and sustain a higher conviction rate in the district court. We have also competed training to become certified flaggers for traffic control. We completed a day long car control program with our insurance company as well as many other training classes.

We want to take a more active roll in the community and become increasingly more accessible to the citizens. We feel that in order to provide all the services that are needed in town, it will have to be a community effort. We had officers in the school, at sporting events, the farmer market and town events. We opened the police station up for trick or treating on

Halloween with great success. It was exciting to see all of the children, of many ages, coming into the station for treats and to talk.

We have been very busy this year with major cases. We have made numerous motor vehicle arrests to include several DWI arrests. These types of incidents are very important in keeping our highway and streets safe. We have investigated many thefts and criminal mischief/vandalism cases and have solved many of these cases. We also have investigated assaults and threatening complaints where we have made several arrests. We have also investigated several drug related cases. There are two cases that stand out and are very significant. One of these cases involved a person that had mailed himself drugs from California through the US Postal Service. This person had sent the items to a friend here in Hancock. The package had been delivered to the address listed on the package, which happened to be the Hancock Historical Society. When the package was opened and the illegal substance was discovered, the Hancock Police were notified. Officer Weeks, Officer Hetrick, and I conducted an investigation. The owner of the package was apprehended and prosecuted for the incident. Information gathered from this subject lead to numerous other investigations in area communities. Hancock officers assisted in joint investigations and felony arrests were made. Another important case involved proactive police work by Officers Weeks and Hetrick. Both officers were attempting to serve a civil warrant and an exparte order on a subject at the Hancock Elementary School when they located the subject, along with a fugitive that was wanted on a \$50,000 cash warrant for a drug sales offense on Main Street at Fiddleheads Cafe. Officers Weeks and Hetrick located a large amount of marijuana, heroin and cash. Both of these subjects were charged and indicted by a Grand Jury on 2 felony counts of possession of drugs with the intent to distribute each along with a multitude of other charges and are waiting for trial. We initiated a seizure of the vehicle and the money through the Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA). If this seizure is granted, the Hancock Police Department will receive the vehicle along with a percentage of the cash.

Proactive police work by our police department was a major factor in the capture of these individuals and continues to lead to major investigations with federal agencies across the country. You should be very proud of all the officers of this agency, as I am, for their professionalism and hard work.

I want to thank all of the departments within the town for all the support and cooperation that will make for a safer community. Cooperation and communication has never been stronger between departments. I also want to thank all of the citizens for the support that you have shown. I look forward to the upcoming year and many to come. I urge you to stop into the police department to see the upgrades and to meet all of our officers.

## HANCOCK PLANNING BOARD 2010 ANNUAL REPORT

During 2010, the Planning Board held a hearing and then proposed a change to the Zoning Ordinance relating to small accessory structures which could be built without a building permit. The Board's proposal was adopted by the town in March through a ballot process.

Throughout the year the Board met with owners and others on several occasions to give preliminary consideration and advice on questions concerning the Zoning Ordinance and related matters.

The Board also received applications for site plan review, a conditional use permit and a minor subdivision relating to a wireless telecommunications facility near the intersection of Norway Hill Road and Route 202. Following a series of hearings (including a site visit and balloon test), the Board approved all of these applications subject to conditions which, we expect, will be met during 2011.

The Board did not receive or consider any other subdivision or site plan review applications during the year.

Copies of all zoning regulations and meeting minutes are now posted on the town website.

During 2010, Jack Carlson retired from the Board after 15 years of conscientious service, Ellena Weston Zimmermann moved from alternate status to full membership and Dan LaPlante joined the board as an alternate member.

#### REPORT OF THE COMMON COMMISSION

January 1, 2010 – December 31, 2010

Allison Kerwin (Ch), Richard Warner, Michael Fallon, and Phil Jones (Ch) served on the Common Commission during the year. Carolyn Boland served as liaison to the Select Board, and Kurtis Grassett represented the town Department of Public Works.

The Common Commissioners normally met in the Town Offices on the third Thursday of each month at 7:00 PM. All meetings were publicized in advance and were open to the public. Minutes of meetings were posted at the Town Offices and on the web site.

Major topics considered during the year included:

- Signs on the Common a new policy was approved and implemented regulating the placement of signs and prohibiting the placement of most commercial signs.
- Boundaries of the Common it was agreed by the Commission and by the Select Board
  that the Common encompassed the grassy areas surrounding the gazebo, the Town
  Offices, and the Memorial Park. Further, the Common Commission will take care of the
  trees along Main Street and the fountain area.
- o Gazebo the slow but continuous deterioration of the gazebo is a growing concern. The Commission set in motion an effort to firmly identify what must be done, when, and at what cost to either refurbish the gazebo or to replace it.
- Stewardship Plan data were collected as a first step in the development of a comprehensive stewardship plan for the Common.
- o Maintenance and upkeep- Allison Kerwin, with Kurt's help, selected the species and locations of the thirty-two new trees planted in conjunction with the Main Street Project.

The Commission thanks Kurt and his DPW crew for the excellent maintenance and grooming of the Common and fountain areas.

The Commission thanks the Davis Brook Nursery for many donated flowers, Daniel Beers for the beautiful Christmas Tree, and the many residents who have contributed to the decoration, upkeep, and beautification of the gazebo, fountain, and the Common. Pat Fairchild, Wayan Suarni, and the rest of the ladies of the Woman's Club who planted and maintained the Post Office planters, the Common horse troughs, the bank in front of the Town Offices, and the fountain triangle area have well-earned our deepest gratitude.

## REPORT OF THE HANCOCK CONSERVATION COMMISSION

This year the Conservation Commission experienced some major change, as all the members are new as of this past September. With that, it has taken time for us to come up to speed with what our duties are and how best to perform them.

What required the most attention this fall was the monitoring of conservation easements held by the town. Most members were able to participate in this action, which must be done on a yearly basis.

This fall, several members went to the annual meeting of the New Hampshire Association of Conservation Commissions (NHACC) and attended workshops on water-related issues, easement monitoring, and other issues that we may deal with. Another event members attended provided information on several insect infestations that are occurring in NH forests right now and how to proceed if we find evidence of an infestation. We also had Carol Andrews, Executive Director of the NH Association of Conservation Commissions speak at a meeting this fall; she discussed the basic duties of a conservation commission and the resources the NHACC could provide. In 2011, education will continue to be an area of focus to us.

We hope to provide educational opportunities in the coming year, both to the elementary school students and to the general population, with speakers and field trips offered. We will also begin the process of updating the town's Natural Resource Inventory.

We will do our best to continue the good work done by our past members and ask anyone interested in serving with us to please step forward.

## REPORT OF THE HANCOCK WATER COMMISSIONERS

Water usage for 2011 was 21,585,200 gallons. This put usage up about 1.2 million gallons from last year. This was surely attributed to a very dry, hot summer. There were a few more water breaks than usual over the year. Two of these leaks were the direct result of Main Street construction. In both cases the contractor bore most of the cost of repair. Three other leaks occurred over the year. One was at Norway Hill and Main Street, one at Bennington Rd. and Main Street and one in front of the library. As the Bennington and Main Street hydrant was in the location of one of these leaks this very old hydrant was replaced. The leaking hydrant at the bottom of Old Dublin Rd. hill across from the Dot Avery house was also replaced. The commissioners normally budget replacement of a couple of hydrants each year.

The commissioners accepted the resignation of Kurt Grassett from the board. Joel Chandler was appointed to fill out Kurt's term. As Public Works Director, Kurt will continue to maintain the water system under the direction of the commissioners.

Work continues with KV Partners of Gilford NH for engineering to incorporate a secondary disinfection system as required by the State of New Hampshire. This system must be in place by 2014. It was agreed by the commissioners and K.V. Partners that a U.V. system was the best choice. K.V. is now working with the E.P.A. to be sure that this system will meet all requirements. A schedule is in place to be sure that this requirement is met and that Hancock's secondary disinfection system will be up and running before the 2014 deadline.

#### REPORT OF THE HANCOCK CEMETERY TRUSTEES

The Trustees of the Hancock Cemeteries, with the good supervision of our Sexton, Kurt Grassett, came through the year without requiring funds from Town taxation. The money we receive comes from three sources, sale of plots, interment fees, funds from the Perpetual Care Trust, and the Expendable Trust Fund, managed by the Trustees of Trust Funds. We have been fortunate to achieve this result for at least the last ten years. Mowing the area, keeping the trees and bushes properly pruned, re-setting headstones and other maintenance efforts area all supervised by Kurt Grassett.

We are now coming towards some expenditure which will very likely require town money. #### REPORT OF THE HANCOCK HISTORICAL DISTRICT COMMISSION

The state of the economy was reflected in the number of applications that the committee reviewed this past year. With less than a handful of applications to review the entire year, the committee took time for some administrative house keeping.

We started by updating the application form that historic district residences submit prior to the commissions review and approval of changes to their property. We also updated the package of information that we send to new property owners within the historic district. This package includes a letter welcoming them to the district and briefly explains the role of the historic district. The package also includes a map that shows the extent of the historic district and a copy of the portion of the zoning ordinance that covers the historic district overlay. After the first of the year we plan to send out a similar package to all residences of the district. We are also planning to have this information available on the town web site.

The historic district has now been in existence for over 35 years. After the improvements to Main Street were completed we took a series of photographs to document the overall status of the district. We believe the last time a similar series of photographs was taken was over 20 years ago.

This past year Bobbie Coffin and Dave Robinson stepped down after many years of dedicated service to this commission. Our thanks go out to both of them especially to Dave who chaired this commission for several years. We welcomed Ruth Wilder and Deb Sampson as new commission members.

#### REPORT OF THE RECREATION COMMITTEE

The Hancock Recreation Department summer programs were a success despite the very hot, dry summer. Lisa Hunt returned as program director of the Summer Recreation Program. She was assisted by returning staffers Brady Blanchette, Olivia Wilder and new counselor, Nate Gnade. The program was well attended with approximately 45 children registered. Average attendance was about 35 children per day.

The beach area at Norway Pond looked great for the start of the season with the renovated parking area and much improved beach surface. Access via the new walkway from the parking lot is a great improvement. Grass and shrubs were planted on the hillside to prevent erosion and gravel run-off into the pond water.

We welcomed Katie Cousins as our new waterfront director who has many years of water safety and swim instruction experience. She was supported by returning lifeguards Alexis Blanchette, Carly Roland and Savannah Patten and newcomer Jacci Cousins. Swimming lessons were well attended as was the beach during our very hot summer. A new backboard and head restraint was purchased. New swim floats and rope were purchased and will replace the old for the 2011 beach season.

Even though temporary fencing and goose mitigation measures were taken early in the season a couple of resident goose parents with one gosling decided that Norway Pond was their home for the season. They had a few friends over now and then and a couple of big parties as the summer wore on. We encourage beach goers to discourage the geese whenever possible and never feed the geese. They are detrimental to water quality and leave a big mess all over the beach.

Moose Brook Park is home to Hancock's Little League teams in the spring. The baseball program continues to do very well. Most years Moose Brook gets continuous use by summer league teams, Conval Soccer Club teams and Great Brook soccer and cross country teams in the fall. Unfortunately this season both summer league teams and Great Brook did not use the field for their matches. Conval Soccer Club hosted both spring and fall home games on our pitch. Replacement soccer nets were purchased over the summer for use starting in the 2011 season. Irrigation was a challenge as Mother Nature did not provide much help.

Recreational soccer teams play their matches at the elementary school field in the fall. This program is run through the Antrim Recreational Department and is a huge success every year. Teams from Antrim, Bennington, Francestown, Greenfield and Hancock participate.

The recreation committee meets monthly on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of the month at 6:30 pm in the small meeting room at the town office. The public is always welcome to come with ideas or any input for the committee.

## CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM COMMITTEE 2010 ANNUAL REPORT

Under NH RSA 574:5, the Capital Improvement Program Committee is responsible for preparing a recommended program of municipal capital improvement projects projected over a period of at least 6 years. The program contains an analysis of population and housing trends as an aid to understanding municipal capital requirements and identifies major projects to be undertaken by the town and other bodies. Based on input from town managers and others, the report also proposes a schedule for these projects. The report is purely advisory.

In 2004, the committee prepared a comprehensive report which has been updated annually since that time. A supplemental report was prepared and delivered in December 2010.

#### REPORT OF THE HEALTH OFFICER

The New Hampshire Department of Environmental Services (DES) has requested that municipalities in New Hampshire urge owners of residential wells to test the water quality of their wells. According to DES, drinking water from private wells in New Hampshire may sometimes contain contaminants such as radon and arsenic, which can occur naturally in our state's bedrock at levels that can pose health risks. A water quality test, by a competent laboratory can assure that your family is protected. Water quality testing will reduce needless health risks to residents and water quality. Empty sample bottles can now be sent directly to homeowners by requesting them on line at the web site listed below. For anyone that does not have access to a computer, requests can be made here at the Town Office. The cost for the DES standard analysis is \$85.00.

There is a new website, the Greater Monadnock Public Health Network (GMPHN) that is available on the town website under Emergency Management. The GMPHN was formerly known as the Cheshire Public Health Network and serves all of Cheshire County and the 10 western-most towns in Hillsborough County. It is made up of members of each of the coalition communities as well as representatives of regional organizations involved in providing for the public's health and safety.

I would like to thank the Deputy Health Officer, Charlie Stevenson, for always being cheerfully responsive to any requests that are made of him. We are fortunate to have his services.

#### REPORT OF THE WELFARE OFFICER

In 2010, \$8,300 was expended for welfare on behalf of qualified applicants. This amount was up from 2009, which seems to reflect the state of the economy. As in past years, the majority of assistance went towards housing, food, and fuel. To apply for help with utility and heating costs, you can call Southern New Hampshire Services at the Peterborough office at 924-2243. For information regarding what other state or local resources are available or to request an application for assistance, you may contact the Town Office.

The Grapevine in Antrim and the River Center in Peterborough offer community members the opportunity of applying for any of the Family Assistance Programs (Food Stamp Benefits, Cash Assistance, Child Care Assistance, and Medical Assistance including Healthly Kids and Medical Coverage for Pregnant Women, Medicare Buy-In) and NH Department of Health and Human Services. NH EASY allows Internet access to trained and certified people at both locations. They will submit completed applications electronically to the Keene District Office along with a faxed or mailed signature page from the applicant. By pre-certifying in Antrim or Peterborough, community members may not need to go to the Keene District Office, however some programs will still require an appointment to complete the application and eligibility process. For additional information you can call the Grapevine at 588-2620 or the River Center at 924-6800.

Another initiative led by United Ways of New Hampshire is 2-1-1 NH which is an easy to remember telephone number that connects callers, at no cost, to information about critical health and human services available in their community. Residents in NH can contact 2-1-1 NH toll-free by dialing 2-1-1. This information is also available on our town website by clicking on Emergency Management.

Helping Hands is an important resource for anyone in the community who needs assistance, but may not qualify for welfare under the Hancock Welfare Guidelines. The fund expends monies to help Hancock residents with food, rent, fuel oil, electricity, repairs, Christmas gifts, medication, and other expenses. Thank you to the individuals, the Hancock Woman's Guild, the Hancock Woman's Club, and other donors who have given so generously to the Hancock Helping Hands Fund during the year. I would also like to thank the Bennington Catholic Church for all of their work in providing Easter and Thanksgiving Baskets to less fortunate Hancock residents. Your generosity helped to make holidays happier for some of our less fortunate Hancock families. Our community continues to be a place of caring.

#### VILLAGE PLANNING COMMITTEE

The Main Street project is finished.

During the last seven years the town advanced the Main Street project by voting for eight different warrants. Hancock has invested \$103,000 for engineering, surveying, and construction plans. This preparation qualified the town for state and federal funds totaling \$622,755. In sum, Hancock's investment has been multiplied more than six times.

In addition, the wires on the town common were buried at no expense to taxpayers. This was paid for with private donations. The New Hampshire Preservation Alliance honored this project with a 2010 Preservation Achievement Award. The Hancock Improvement Association, which raised the money, deserves special credit. The board: Mary Covington and Ted Renna, Co-Chairs; Regina Bringolf, Secretary; Larry Schwartz, Treasurer; Michael Fallon; Howard Mansfield; Byron Niederhelman; Robert Pettegrew; and Honorary Chair Ray Pierce.

As with all construction projects, there are a few remaining details. Next spring the Hancock Highway Dept. will be performing speed studies in the area of the vestry to the cemetery. These studies will be conducted before the speed table is in place, and then again when the speed table is installed. The Selectboard will use the results of the speed study and public comment to determine if the speed table will remain installed, and if so for how long each year.

The 43 new trees and 18 bushes that were planted on Main Street are under a one-year warranty. The contractor is responsible for their care. There are areas, particularly around the common, where additional loam and seed will be added to better define the edges, or to correct areas that may have settled over the winter. Also, the town will restore the cow path on the south side of Main St.

The committee has heard from many residents who are concerned about parking and speeding. So: don't park on the grass and slow down. The Selectboard has instructed the police to conduct substantial, visible, and sustained enforcement on Main St. and the roads leading to town, particularly during the commuting hours.

The VPC thanks the Common Commission for their stewardship of the Common, and Common Commissioner Alison Kerwin for the tree planting plan.

We thank everyone in town for their patience through the many meetings and the summer of construction. The VPC's work is done; the committee has sunset. The VPC's reports, minutes and other papers have been deposited in the town archives.

#### **REPORT OF THE ARCHIVES COMMITTEE - 2010**

Thanks to a small, but dedicated committee Hancock's town archives continue getting better organized and preserved for current and future generations.

One of the highlights from 2010 is the preservation of some of Hancock's oldest and most fascinating historical records. The First Congregational Church of Hancock has donated some of its early record books to the town's collection of archives. These are hand-penned records that date back to 1792 and include vital records of many families, as well as accounts of church discipline and the early abolition movement.

The committee applied for and received a grant request of \$4,153 from the N.H. Conservation License Plate Program (the Moose Plate) to conserve the church record books. The committee has made arrangements with the Browns River Marotti Company of Essex, Vt., to de-acidify the books, reinforce the brittle pages, and protect them in Mylar.

After being preserved, the books will be stored among other town archives at the Hancock Town Offices. The books, along with other town records, can be viewed at the Town Offices and searched online at <a href="www.footnote.com">www.footnote.com</a>. Just click on "Browse," then "News and Town Records" then "Vital Records."

Other activities of the committee in 2010 include:

- Continuing to investigate ways to keep temperature and humidity at acceptable and even levels in the archives room. Upcoming renovations to the Town Offices may help in this regard.
- Sorting and organizing additional archival materials. This ongoing exercise has
  yielded a number of interesting surprises, including draft records dating back to
  the Civil War, old plans of the town common and correspondence with town
  vendors and other officials.

## CNBRLAC (CONTOOCOOK AND NORTH BRANCH RIVERS LOCAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE)



As your town's representatives to this committee, here is a brief summary of what we have done in 2010 to protect the river that runs through our fourteen towns.

#### ADVISING TOWNS ON BUILDING IN THE RIVER CORRIDOR

We continue to advise towns concerning the Comprehensive Shoreland Protection Act, best management practices for the development of land along the river, and dredge and fill permits. The main focus this year has been the revision of the Rivers Corridor Management Plan. We have held a number of special sessions, including two public meetings, and expect to have the final document available by town meeting time.

#### MONITORING AND CLEANUP ALONG THE RIVER

We continue to monitor the river as part of the VRAP program. If you missed seeing a copy of the official report, contact your town rep. We also keep on the watch for the invasive alien plant species. We are always looking for more volunteers to help us in the river monitoring.

#### EDUCATIONAL LITERATURE AND PUBLICITY

We still have a power-point program on the history of the river, a large display board, a video of the river set to Vivaldi's Four Season music, and a scrapbook of pictures and historical articles about the river available for display at community functions. If you would like the display or a program presented in your town or at a regional organization, contact our secretary, Marian Baker at 478-5650 or your local representative, Warren Sponsler at 525-3034. We plan to complete brochures, up date our website, and conduct a survey of riverfront owners and others interested in the river late this spring.

#### SIGNS ALONG THE RIVER

So far we have bought and erected colorful Protected River signs in many towns along the river. Look for them! In Hancock, the signs are displayed on the Forest Road covered bridge.

#### WILDLIFE IN THE RIVER

Each month we get reports of wildlife seen along the river; eagles, herons, mergansers, migratory waterfowl, otters, and snow buntings are just a few examples. Powder Mill Pond which is part of the Contoocook River, is a treasure-trove of wildlife. Do let your town representatives know of interesting sightings in your town.

NEW MEMBERS. We have several new members on our committee, but are looking for new ones from Jaffrey, Greenfield, Antrim, Stoddard, and Hopkinton. Our monthly meetings are held the third Monday of each month, usually at Monadnock Paper Mill in Bennington. They are open to the public.

### REPORT OF THE HANCOCK ENERGY ADVISORY TEAM (HEAT)

The Hancock Energy Advisory Committee (HEAT) has accomplished a tremendous amount this year toward lowering the Town's energy use and costs. Having financed energy audits through a Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative (RGGI) grant, HEAT was able to take that information and use it to apply for Energy Efficiency Community Block Grant funds offered as part of the Recovery Act. The Town received funding to weatherize the Town Meeting House, the Town Office Building and Police Station, the DPW Office and Equipment Bay, the Post Office, and the Fire Station. The weatherization of these town buildings is slated to start this winter/spring, and will reduce the town's energy use and associated costs for years to come. HEAT also monitored temperatures in some of our most used buildings to identify energy use patterns, and made appropriate recommendations for temperature set-backs to heat our buildings more efficiently.

A second EECBG grant was written to allow Hancock to install solar arrays on the fire station, recycling center, and two buildings at the town garage. This supplement of renewable energy should reduce our electricity costs by 75-90% at several town buildings. At this writing, the first solar array has been installed at the recycling center and is operational, with the next array to be installed on the Fire Station.

HEAT most recently co-sponsored a *Button Up NH* workshop together with the Antrim and Bennington local energy committees. This workshop detailed ways homeowners can easily weatherize their homes, pinpointing those improvements that will deliver the most energy savings for the investment.

Now that Hancock's municipal house is in order, HEAT has been considering its own future. HEAT plans to turn its efforts toward Hancock's citizenry, serving as a resource to the community. It will continue to provide Energy Tips for the *Hancock Happenings*, while focusing more effort toward education and outreach. More collaborative events with other towns' Energy Committees are also being considered.
