Report of the School Board.

There has been twenty terms of school taught in town during the past year. A large percentage of these have been successfully conducted, and good results have followed. Others have been passable; while a few have not met with our approval, or the requirements of law. It is the general opinion that an unsuccessful term of school is the result of mismanagement on the part of the teacher; ordinarily this is the case, but sometimes the cause of failure may be traced to influences outside of the school-room, over which the teacher has no control, and consequently she is not responsible. Injudicious management in school affairs certainly should meet with the disapproval of all; but to blame the innocent, or to reflect discredit upon those who have done their duty, never will correct the mistakes of others. Hasty judgment has often misplaced the blame, causing unpleasant remembrances. Nevertheless, pupils, teachers, parents and committees, are, of course, expected to bear *patiently the gentle reproofs* of each other.

Some of our teachers have left us to fill positions in other places. There is now a demand for more good teachers in town. Parents having children possessing the natural ability for teachers, should seek to qualify them for that profession. We think that our school records will show that during the last two decades, our best teachers have been residents of our own town.

Our schools are well supplied with good text books, but school books will wear out and additions must be made frequently. We would call the attention of the incoming School Board to a text book entitled "The American Citizen," which treats upon the following subjects, viz.: "The Family and Its Government," "The School-room and Its Government," "The Various Forms of Government," "The Purposes of Government," etc. The use of this book in the school-room would prove not only a great blessing to the pupils, but would help the teacher in securing and maintaining good order.

There are now ten schools in town, but two of these might be dispensed with. Nos. 2, 3, 4, 5, should form two schools. Eight school houses would accommodate conveniently all our scholars.

This would diminish the expenses for repairs, and increase the length of our schools.

Our school buildings need repairing and painting.
