To the Inhabitants of the Town of Rumney, in the County
[L. s.] of Grafton, in said State qualified to vote in
Town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall, in
said Rumney, on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March next,
at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act on the following
subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town Officers for the year
ensuing.

2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary
to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make ap-
propriation of the same.

3. To see how much money the town will vote to raise
and appropriate for the support of schools in addition to
the amount required by law.

4. To see how much money the town will vote to raise
and appropriate for the maintenance of highways in addition
to the amount required by law.

5. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropri-
ate three hundred dollars for the care of the Public Library
for the ensuing year.

6. To see how much money the town will vote to raise
and appropriate for the care of the common.

7. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropri-
ate twenty-five dollars for Memorial day.

8. To see if the town will vote to have the inventory
blanks distributed at the time of taking the appraisal of pro-
perty.

9. To see how much money the town will vote to raise
and appropriate for putting up guide boards on the high-
way.

10. To see what action the town will take about procuring a place to be used for a lobby.

11. To see what action the town will take about repairing the belfry on the town hall, and building a water-closet at the town hall and raise and appropriate money for the same, also purchase land for the same if necessary.

SCHOOL REPORT

We take pleasure in again announcing to the people of Rumney that the schools are, as a whole, in a prosperous condition: that the school work has been carried on without special hindrance, and all the teachers have been in a measure, successful.

Teachers who have earned a place in first rank by faithful work in the schools in town and those who have a well established reputation have been employed whenever it has been possible to secure their services.

We think we have made no mistake in securing the services of our town teachers, and we cannot help but feel proud of the most excellent work they have done in our schools the past year. There are others who are filling positions in other towns who should be secured if possible.

We wish to thank the town on behalf of the schools, that through its munificence we have been enabled to maintain and give to each child in town the full benefit of thirty-two weeks of school during the past year. The salaries paid the teachers this year average higher than in the previous year, and we think the work done by them has justified the advance. Our registers show a greater number of visits by parents and others, and we are glad to note the increased interest the past year. We hope this custom will continue, for these visits contribute much to the interest, and encourage both teacher and pupil: as a rule less tardy and absent marks, less disorder, and more progress is made in schools where parents make the largest number of visits.

During the past two years extensive repairs have been made on the school houses and school yards and they are

now in very good condition, although it is nearly always necessary to make some repairs each year. We think a good school house is closely connected with a good school and exerts a good influence upon the character of a school.

During the past year as in former years, we have given "Roll of Honor" badges for perfect attendance. Our list shows an increase over last year; with about the same number of pupils, we have given one hundred and sixty-two term badges and twenty-five annual badges: this gives an increase of forty-one term and eleven annual badges. Besides this reward of perfect attendance, there are many pupils in each school who deserve "Honorable Mention" for attendance, those who have failed only through one or two marks.

In submitting our report for the year ending Feb. 15, 1906, we wish to thank parents, teachers, and pupils for the interest they have manifested during the past years, and hope the united efforts of the school board, parents, teachers and scholars in the coming years will place the schools of Rumney in the highest rank.
