



ACCOUNT OF THE EXPENSES

Supporting the Poor,

ZFOR THE

Year ending March 25, 1832.

THE Selectmen of Amherst, Overseers of the Poor, appointed to prepare and submit to the town a detailed account of first there annual expenses of carrying on the Farm and supporting the Poor, respectfully REPORT:

That they have devoted to the duty with which they were charged, all the time and attention which its nature and the expectation of the town seem to demand;—That on removing the poor to the Farm purchased by the town, there were seventeen in number, two of them children—five others came on immediately after, so that we commenced the year with *twenty-twc.*—Others have since come on, and one has deceased, so that the number now consists of *twenty-eight*—ten of which are over 70 years of age, and eleven whose ages average 30 years, and seven under seven years old.

The number of paupers last year supported by the town was eighteen, at the expense of five hundred and twenty-eight dollars.


