

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Brookfield on Tuesday, the Eighth day of March next, at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

- (3) To see if the Town will vote to accept Budget as prepared by the Budget Committee.

- (6) To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid and appropriate money for the same.
- (7) Or any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

School Report

Superintendent's Report

To the School Board of Brookfield:

Gentlemen:- At the close of another municipal year I take pleasure in submitting to you and to the citizens of the town my thirteenth annual report as superintendent of the schools of Brookfield.

The statistics for the last school year are given in the following table:

Again we point with pride to the per cent of attendance in our schools. The average of 97.21 per cent is probably among the highest of all the districts in the state.

You will note that the total enrollment has dropped from 32 for the preceding year to 21. This total is again reduced for the present year to 18.

Since my last report the Churchill School has been equipped with movable seats and desks for all pupils. I am sure that all who have visited the school since these were provided, will testify that the change has greatly added to the general appearance of the room and to the comfort of the pupils.

As in former years, a lunch is being provided at the Churchill School, the milk being provided as for several years by Mr. Wright. We extend our thanks to him for this generous provision, also to other citizens who have helped the school in many ways both financially and otherwise.

One change has been made in our teaching force, the first for over five years. Mrs. Knapp, who had taught in the Stoneham School since September 1926, retired at the end of the term last December. She is succeeded by Miss Grace C. Fogg, a graduate of Plymouth Normal School with several years experience. Miss Fogg is not unknown to citizens in the Stoneham district, she having taught there as a substitute for a few weeks when she was a student at Plymouth.

I am unable to submit any detailed report by the school nurse at this time. Mrs. Weeks, who served us so faithfully for several years, was taken seriously ill last February, and from that time until October we had no nurse on duty. In October the work was taken up by Miss Pearl L. Barth, who made the usual inspections and recommendations. After two months Miss Barth left us and we were again without service until January. Miss Maude McBride is now on duty and I feel sure that the health work in the schools will receive due attention.
