SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

February 1, 1927 to February 1, 1928

My connection with your schools has been as yet only a limited one—from September 1, 1927 to the present time.

As a consequence my report will of necessity be more or less limited to that period.

The first year of a new Superintendent is largely a period of becoming acquainted with the present situations and needs of the schools. During this, my present first term, I feel that I have been fortunate in having the utmost cooperation and help from teachers and School Board.

Basing judgment on present conditions it would seem evident that Pittsburg has a most excellent school system as a result, probably of a wise and generous policy toward schools on the part of the town and School officials. It remains for us who follow in the control of the schools to maintain the present high standing and make changes only where change would bring improvement.

Since the opening of school in September I have made 97 visits of supervision and inspections to the various schools of the town. Classes in all subjects have been heard by me and some standard tests given. As a result of these visits, I would have no hesitancy in stating that the pupils seem in the majority of instances to be well up to the standards for their various grades and the general order, discipline and attendance have been of a very high grade.

The Junior High School which was first put in operation last year seems to be working out well and offers the pupils of grades seven and eight a somewhat better situation. It is progress than they could obtain under the old system. It is hoped that this plan may be continued as successfully in the future and that the pupils of grades seven and eight in the outside districts may be able to join in the benefits of the Junior High Plan.

As will be noted from the above figures, the per cent of attendance for the last year has been excellent. The High School shows an especially fine record in this respect and ranks among the highest in attendance in the State.

Up to the present time the attendance this year has been equally as good as last year and it is hoped that we may not fall below our record in this particular. A habit of punctuality and regular attendance is not only beneficial in school work but is an especially valuable asset in later life.

In closing I wish to thank all those who have rendered me such invaluable assistance in becoming acquainted with your schools and pupils.
