REPORT OF THE HISTORY COMMITTEE.

The Committee chosen to carry into effect a vote of the Town, passed August 11, 1874, to superintend the publication of the "History of Rindge," have attended to their duties, and report that on the 12th day of August, 1874, they made a contract with Ezra S. Stearns, in conformity with said vote of the town, by which the Committee were given possession of the manuscript copy of said History, with the privilege of publishing an edition of 400 copies, with the exclusive sale of the book in the town of Rindge, until 250 copies were sold; while in other towns the Committee and Mr. Stearns were at liberty to sell copies of the book to any applicant.

In accordance with a provision of the contract, Mr. Stearns has published 400 copies, making 800 copies which have been printed. By a condition of the contract, the Committee and Mr. Stearns agreed that neither the agent of the town nor himself should at any time sell a copy of the History for a sum less than \$4.00. The Committee further report, that after careful inquiry, and after receiving proposals from many responsible printers, they made a contract with George H. Ellis of Boston, who has printed the book in manner highly acceptable to the Committee, and has fulfilled in all particulars the conditions of the contract made with him. As appears in the report of the Selectmen, the entire cost of publication of the town's edition of 400 copies, including the services of the Committee, has been \$1523.73. To offset this expense, the Committee have on hand a quantity of books, and a sum of money representing in the aggregate the sum of \$1600.00.

Your Committee recommend that the town give instructions to pay the money in their hands to the town treasurer, and deliver to the town treasurer the whole number of copies of the History which remain unsold, and that the town treasurer be instructed to sell the same at a price not less than \$4.00 per copy, and reserve 150 copies, of which no more than ten copies be sold in any one year.
